Relating to school safety in Etowah County; to allow
retired law enforcement officers to serve on a part-time basis
as school resource officers in schools in Etowah County.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

7 Section 1. This act shall apply only in Etowah8 County.

9 Section 2. (a) A person who retired from the 10 position of municipal police officer, deputy sheriff, or other 11 position that required certification by the Alabama Peace 12 Officers' Standards and Training Commission (the commission) 13 and who retired in good standing may be employed as a 14 part-time school resource officer by Etowah County or by a 15 municipality or local school district in Etowah County in 16 accordance with this section.

17 (b) As a part-time employee, a school resource 18 officer shall not be eligible for health insurance or 19 retirement benefits beyond those benefits the person is 20 already receiving through his or her former full-time 21 employment. Even though part-time, a part-time school resource 22 officer may be required to work a schedule that coincides with a full school day schedule for the period when school is in 23 24 regular operation and as otherwise needed.

1 (c) Part-time school resource officers shall have 2 all rights, privileges, and powers of a law enforcement 3 officer certified by the commission under the laws of the 4 state.

5 (d) A chief of police or sheriff and members of his 6 or her force, as applicable, shall have immunity from civil 7 liability for actions arising from his or her position as a 8 part-time school resource officer.

9 (e) In a municipality that has its own police force, 10 preference in hiring a part-time school resource officer shall 11 be given to a retired municipal police officer. In all other 12 unincorporated areas of Etowah County, preference in hiring 13 shall be given to a retired deputy sheriff.

(f) Funding for part-time school resource officers may come from local, state, or federal budgets or from any board of education, or a combination thereof. The rate of pay for a part-time school resource officer shall not be tied to any existing pay scale used by the hiring authority but shall instead be at the discretion of the hiring authority.

(g) This section shall not apply to a full-time law
enforcement officer serving in the capacity as a school
resource officer on a regular basis as of the effective date
of this act and employed by a law enforcement agency. A
full-time law enforcement officer working in this capacity may

continue his or her full-time status at the discretion of the
 chief of police or sheriff, as appropriate.

3 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 4 first day of the third month following its passage and 5 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
