## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Article 4 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,

- 2 relating to dangerous instrumentalities and practices, so as to prohibit the sale, distribution,
- 3 or use of certain assault weapons; to provide for the registration of assault weapons; to
- 4 provide for crimes involving the possession, sale, distribution, or use of certain assault
- 5 weapons; to provide for criminal penalties; to provide for definitions; to provide for
- 6 exemptions; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Article 4 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 10 dangerous instrumentalities and practices, is amended by adding a new part to read as
- 11 follows:
- 12 "<u>Part 3A</u>
- 13 <u>16-11-139.</u>
- 14 As used in this part, the term:

(1) 'Action of the weapon' means the part of the firearm that loads, fires, or ejects a

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16 cartridge and that includes, but is not limited to, the upper and lower receiver, charging 17 handle, forward assist, magazine release, and shell deflector. 18 (2) 'Assault weapon' means: 19 (A) Any selective fire firearm capable of fully automatic, semiautomatic, or burst fire 20 at the option of the user and any part designed or intended for use with such firearm; 21 (B) Any of the following semiautomatic firearms: the Algimec Agmi; Armalite 22 AR-180; Australian Automatic Arms SAP Pistol; Auto-Ordnance Thompson type; 23 Avtomat Kalashnikov AK-47 type; Barrett Light-Fifty model 82A1; Beretta AR-70; 24 Bushmaster Auto Rifle and Auto Pistol; Calico models M-900, M-950, and 100-P; 25 Chartered Industries of Singapore SR-88; Colt AR-15 and Sporter; Daewoo K-1, K-2, Max-1, and Max-2; Encom MK-IV, MP-9, and MP-45; Fabrique Nationale FN/FAL, 26 27 FN/LAR, or FN/FNC; FAMAS MAS 223; Feather AT-9 and Mini-AT; Federal XC 900 28 and XC-450; Franchi SPAS-12 and LAW-12; Galil AR and ARM; Goncz High-Tech 29 Carbine and High-Tech Long Pistol; Heckler & Koch HK-91, HK-93, HK-94, and 30 SP-89; Holmes MP-83; MAC-10, MAC-11, and MAC-11 Carbine type; Intratec TEC-9 31 and Scorpion; Iver Johnson Enforcer model 3000; Ruger Mini-14/5F folding stock 32 model; Scarab Skorpion; SIG 57 AMT and 500 series; Spectre Auto Carbine and Auto 33 Pistol; Springfield Armory BM59, SAR-48, and G-3; Sterling MK-6 and MK-7; Steyr 34 AUG; Street Sweeper and Striker 12 revolving cylinder shotguns; USAS-12; UZI 35 Carbine, Mini-Carbine, and Pistol; Weaver Arms Nighthawk; and Wilkinson Linda 36 Pistol, and any part designed or intended for use with such firearms; 37 (C) Any of the following semiautomatic center-fire rifles: the AK-47; AK-74; AKM; 38 AKS-74U; ARM; MAADI AK47; MAK90; MISR; NHM90; NHM91; Norinco 56, 39 56S, 84S, and 86S; Poly Technologies AKS and AK47; SA 85; SA 93; VEPR; 40 WASR-10; WUM; Rock River Arms LAR-47; Vector Arms AK-47; AR-10; AR-15; 41 Bushmaster Carbon 15; Bushmaster XM15; Bushmaster ACR Rifles; Bushmaster MOE

63	(i) A semiautomatic center-fire rifle that has an ability to accept a detachable
64	magazine and has at least one of the following:
65	(I) A folding or telescoping stock;
66	(II) Any grip of the weapon, including, but not limited to, a pistol grip, a forward
67	pistol grip, a thumbhole stock, or any other stock, the use of which would allow a
68	person to grip the weapon, resulting in any finger on the trigger hand in addition to

69 the trigger finger being directly below any portion of the action of the weapon when 70 firing; 71 (III) A flash suppressor; or 72 (IV) A grenade launcher or flare launcher; (ii) A semiautomatic center-fire rifle that has a fixed magazine with the ability to 73 74 accept more than ten rounds; 75 (iii) A semiautomatic center-fire rifle that has an overall length of less than 30 inches; 76 (iv) A semiautomatic pistol that has an ability to accept a detachable magazine and 77 has at least one of the following: 78 (I) An ability to accept a detachable ammunition magazine that attaches at some 79 location outside of the pistol grip; 80 (II) A threaded barrel capable of accepting a flash suppressor, forward pistol grip, 81 or silencer; 82 (III) A shroud that is attached to, or partially or completely encircles, the barrel and 83 that permits the shooter to fire the firearm without being burned, not including a 84 slide that encloses the barrel; or 85 (IV) A second hand grip; 86 (v) A semiautomatic pistol with a fixed magazine that has the ability to accept more 87 than ten rounds; 88 (vi) A semiautomatic shotgun that has both of the following: 89 (I) A folding or telescoping stock; and 90 (II) Any grip of the weapon, including, but not limited to, a pistol grip, a forward 91 pistol grip, a thumbhole stock, or any other stock, the use of which would allow a person to grip the weapon, resulting in any finger on the trigger hand in addition to 92 the trigger finger being directly below any portion of the action of the weapon when 93 94 firing;

95 (vii) A semiautomatic shotgun that has the ability to accept a detachable magazine;

- 97 (viii) A shotgun with a revolving cylinder; or
- 98 (G) A part or combination of parts designed or intended to convert such weapons into
- 99 <u>such firearms.</u>
- The term 'assault weapon' shall not include any firearm modified to render it permanently
- inoperable or any firearm, or part or combination of parts of such firearm, that is in the
- possession of a person for the purpose of serving or repairing such firearm lawfully
- possessed by its owner under this part.
- 104 (3) 'Detachable magazine' means an ammunition feeding device that can be removed
- without disassembling the firearm action.
- (4) 'Forward pistol grip' means any feature capable of functioning as a grip that can be
- held by the nontrigger hand.
- (5) 'Pistol grip' means a grip or similar feature that can function as a grip for the trigger
- 109 hand.
- 110 (6) 'Second hand grip' means a grip or similar feature that can function as a grip that is
- additional to the trigger hand grip.

- (a) No person shall distribute, transfer, or sell any assault weapon.
- (b) Any person who distributes or imports an assault weapon into this state shall be guilty
- of a misdemeanor.
- (c) Any person who transfers, sells, or gives any assault weapon to a person under the age
- of 18 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 118 (d) This Code section shall not apply to any person servicing or repairing an assault
- weapon that is lawfully possessed by its owner under this part.

- (a) Any person who possesses any assault weapon on July 1, 2024, shall have until
- October 31, 2024, to register it with the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, modify such
- assault weapon to render it permanently inoperable, or modify such assault weapon so as
- to permanently render it no longer an assault weapon.
- (b) Any person who relocates his or her residence to this state and who possesses an
- assault weapon or who comes to possess such assault weapon through probate shall, within
- 127 90 days of establishing such residency or the closing of such probate, register it with the
- Georgia Bureau of Investigation, modify such assault weapon to render it permanently
- inoperable, or modify such assault weapon so as to permanently render it no longer an
- assault weapon.
- (c)(1) Except as provided in this Code section, no person shall possess an assault weapon
- that is not registered with the Georgia Bureau of Investigation.
- (2) Any person convicted of violating the provisions of paragraph (1) of this subsection
- shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

- Any person who lawfully possesses an assault weapon under this part that is lost or stolen
- from such person shall report such loss or theft to the Georgia Bureau of Investigation
- within 72 hours of the time when such person discovered such loss or theft. Any person
- who fails to make such report within the time prescribed by this Code section shall be fined
- not more than \$90.00 for a first offense and shall be guilty of a misdemeanor for any
- subsequent offense under this Code section.

- 143 This part shall not apply to:

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(1) Any duly authorized police agency of this state or a peace officer of any duly authorized police agency of this state or of any political subdivision thereof, a law enforcement officer of any department or agency of the United States who is regularly employed and paid by the United States, this state, or any political subdivision thereof, or an employee of the Department of Corrections of this state who is authorized in writing by the commissioner of corrections to transfer or possess firearms while in the official performance of his or her duties; (2) A member of the National Guard or of the armed forces of the United States to wit: the army, navy, marine corps, air force, or coast guard who, while serving therein, possesses assault weapons in the line of duty; (3) The possession of an assault weapon by a person who is authorized to possess the same because he or she is in compliance with the dictates of the National Firearms Act, 68A Stat. 725 (26 U.S.C. Sections 5841-5862); (4) A security officer employed by a federally licensed nuclear power facility or a licensee of such facility, including a contract security officer, who is trained and qualified under a security plan approved by the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission or other federal agency authorized to regulate nuclear facility security; provided, however, that this exemption shall apply only while such security officer or licensee is acting in connection with his or her official duties on the premises of such nuclear power facility or on properties outside such facility pursuant to a written agreement entered into with the local law enforcement agency having jurisdiction over such facility; (5) Notwithstanding Code Section 16-11-117, persons and their agents who are engaged in the manufacture of assault weapons in this state pursuant to federal law; (6) Notwithstanding Code Section 16-11-117, persons and their agents who stock assault weapons for the purpose of selling to police agencies, the National Guard, or the armed forces of the United States; and

(7) Notwithstanding Code Section 16-11-117, persons engaged in sport competition
 pursuant to rules and regulations of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation."

173 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
