AN ACT

To amend chapter 41, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the minutemen of the state, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 41, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 41.1025, to read as follows:

41.1025. 1. There shall be established for use in defense during a state of emergency pursuant to chapter 44 the minutemen of the state which shall be called into service by the governor with consent of two-thirds of the general assembly by the adoption of a concurrent resolution.

6 2. Any legal Missouri resident who is eligible to be a 7 lawful firearm owner pursuant to section 571.070 may 8 voluntarily join the minutemen by enrolling with the 9 department of public safety. Only the volunteer's name and 10 address shall be collected by the department. Such volunteer shall keep his or her address current with the 11 12 department of public safety. The list of enrolled minutemen with the department is not subject to disclosure under 13 chapter 610 and such list shall not be shared or 14 15 disseminated. Any person responsible for any unauthorized 16 disclosure of this list, in part or in whole, shall be 17 subject to a one thousand dollar fine per each name that is 18 disclosed and a class E felony. A volunteer may resign at

19 any time prior to being called into service under this 20 section. All volunteers of the minutemen of the state shall 21 be required to secure themselves with firearms, firearm accessories, ammunition, uniforms, equipment, and supplies 22 23 necessary to perform any duties as assigned by the 24 governor. Any such firearms, firearm accessories, ammunition, uniforms, equipment, and supplies shall be 25 26 property of the state for purposes of sovereignty and 27 jurisdiction in matters of judicial, taxation, and police 28 powers exercised by the state while a member of the 29 minutemen. Any such firearms, firearm accessories, ammunition, uniforms, equipment, and supplies owned by the 30 state pursuant to this section shall not be subject to any 31 32 tax, levy, fee, or stamp imposed on firearms, firearm 33 accessories, or ammunition and shall not be subject to any registration or tracking of firearms, firearm accessories, 34 35 or ammunition.

36 3. The governor shall make and publish such 37 regulations governing the organization, discipline, and 38 training of the minutemen of the state as may be necessary 39 to the efficiency therefor, and such regulations shall have 40 the authority of law.

4. The governor of the state, by virtue of his or her 42 office, is the commander in chief of the minutemen of the 43 state. The governor shall be charged with the supervision 44 of all matters pertaining to the administration, discipline, 45 mobilization, organization, and training of the minutemen of 46 the state.

5. This section does not include members of the
organized or unorganized militia pursuant to sections 41.050
and 41.070.

The state shall have immunity from liability and 50 6. 51 suit for compensatory damages for negligent acts or 52 omissions, and for any criminal acts by any volunteer of the minutemen of the state while enrolled in the minutemen. 53 The state shall have immunity from liability and suit for 54 55 compensatory damages for negligent acts or omissions, for any criminal acts committed by any member of the minutemen 56 57 of the state while acting within the course of his or her 58 duties.
