18	Relating to firearms, to prevent infringement on the
19	right to keep and bear arms by the federal government; and to
20	nullify all federal acts in violation of the Second Amendment
21	of the United States Constitution.
22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited
24	as the "Second Amendment Preservation Act."
25	Section 2. The Legislature finds all of the
26	following:

1 (1) The Second Amendment to the United States
2 Constitution reads as follows, "A well regulated militia being
3 necessary to the security of a free state, the right of the
4 people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed."

(2) All federal acts, laws, orders, rules, or regulations regarding firearms are a violation of the Second Amendment as determined by the Alabama state courts, the Legislature, and the Governor.

Section 3. (a) All federal acts, laws, orders, rules, or regulations in violation of the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution are contrary to the true meaning and intent of the Constitution as given by its authors and ratifiers and are invalid in this state, shall not be recognized by this state, are specifically rejected by this state, and shall be considered null and void and of no effect in this state.

(b) The Legislature shall adopt and enact any and all measures as may be necessary to prevent the enforcement of any federal acts, laws, orders, rules, or regulations in violation of the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution.

Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
