5 (e) This compact and this section do not affect or 6 abridge the obligations and responsibilities of ALEA under 7 other provisions of this article and do not alter or amend the 8 manner, direct or otherwise, in which the public is afforded 9 access to criminal history records under state law.

(f) All revenue received by ALEA through the exchange of information enabled through this compact shall be deposited into the State Treasury to the credit of the Public Safety Fund and shall be used to cover expenses for improving criminal history records and the state repository at ALEA.

15 Section 3. Nothing in this act shall be interpreted 16 to impair, or grant the authority to impair, a citizen's 17 access to records currently considered open to public inspection under Section 36-12-40, Code of Alabama 1975, nor 18 19 any record which is open for public inspection under Section 36-12-40, Code of Alabama 1975, from sources other than an 20 21 information system developed, operated, or maintained under 22 Section 41-9-621, Code of Alabama 1975. All records from an 23 information system developed, operated, or maintained under 24 Section 41-9-621, Code of Alabama 1975, shall be deemed 25 privileged.

Section 4. Notwithstanding any provision in this act, except for providing copies of data required by law to carry out the duties of the commission and ALEA, nothing in this act shall be interpreted to impair or grant the authority to impair the ownership, dissemination, or control of data collected and maintained by the Administrative Office of Courts or the appellate courts of the state.

Section 5. Section 41-9-597, Code of Alabama 1975, 8 relating to employment; Section 41-9-599, Code of Alabama 9 10 1975, relating to request for funds; Section 41-9-622, Code of 11 Alabama 1975, relating to maintenance of historical criminal 12 data; Section 41-9-629, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to forwarding of data; and Section 41-9-648, Code of Alabama 13 14 1975, relating to compilation of information and statistics, 15 are repealed.

16 Section 6. Although this bill would have as its 17 purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased 18 expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further 19 requirements and application under Amendment 621, now 20 appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of 21 the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the 22 bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an 23 existing crime.

Section 7. This act shall become effective 90 days
 following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its
 otherwise becoming law.
