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4 SYNOPSIS:

5 Under existing law, each county and municipality 6 must establish a local emergency management 7 organization to maintain public safety within its territorial limits in the event of a natural or manmade 8 9 disaster or public health emergency pursuant to the state emergency management plan. The local emergency 10 11 management organization is administered by a director 12 who operates under the control of the governing body of the county or municipality. The director receives an 13 14 annual salary supplement from the Alabama Emergency 15 Management Agency in an amount necessary to provide the director an annual salary of \$40,000, provided the 16 17 supplement is capped at \$12,000.

18 This bill would revise the authority of local 19 emergency management organizations relating to entering 20 into contracts for supplies and services for disaster 21 relief to authorize the letting of contracts outside of 22 the parameters of the competitive bid law if certain 23 conditions are met.

This bill would increase the annual supplemental allocation to local organizations from the state Local Emergency Management Assistance Fund from \$12,000 to \$17,000, to be subsequently adjusted every five years by the Consumer Price Index.



29 This bill would provide that course work 30 required for certification as a local emergency 31 management director must be recommended by the Alabama 32 Association of Emergency Managers and approved by the 33 Director of the Alabama Emergency Management Agency. 34 This bill would revise the supplement to fund 35 the director's salary from the Alabama Emergency 36 Management Fund by removing any reference to the 37 \$40,000 target and instead provide a supplement in an amount necessary to constitute 35% of the director's 38 39 salary, provided the supplement is capped at \$17,000. 40 This bill would tie any dollar values referenced 41 in these provisions to be adjusted to reflect the Consumer Price Index. 42 43 This bill would make nonsubstantive, technical 44 revisions to update the existing code language to 45 current style. 46 A BILL 47 TO BE ENTITLED 48 AN ACT 49 50 Relating to Emergency Management; to amend Section 51 31-9-10, Code of Alabama 1975, to provide contract letting 52 requirements for local emergency management organizations; to 53 amend Section 31-9-60, Code of Alabama 1975, to increase 54 supplemental funding for assistance to local emergency management organizations; to amend 31-9-61, Code of Alabama 55 56 1975, to establish standards for course work for local



57 emergency management director certification; to amend Section 58 31-9-62, Code of Alabama 1975, to change salary supplements 59 for local emergency management directors and revise local 60 emergency management organization eligibility for federal funds; and to make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to 61 62 update the existing code language to current style. 63 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 64 Section 1. Sections 31-9-10, 31-9-60, 31-9-61, and 65 31-9-62, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows: "§31-9-10 66 67 (a) Each political subdivision of this state is hereby authorized and directed to shall establish a local 68 69 organization for emergency management in accordance with the 70 state emergency management plan and program and may confer or 71 authorize the conferring, upon members of the auxiliary police, the powers of peace officers, subject to such 72 73 restrictions as shall be imposed. The governing body of the 74 political subdivision is authorized to appoint a director, who 75 shall have direct responsibility for the organization, 76 administration, and operation of such the local organization 77 for emergency management, subject to the direction and control 78 of such the governing body. Each local organization for 79 emergency management shall perform emergency management 80 functions within the territorial limits of the political 81 subdivision within which it is organized, and, in addition, shall conduct such functions outside of such-its territorial 82 limits as may be required pursuant to the provisions of 83 84 authorized by this article.



(b) The governing body of each political subdivision shall have the power and authority may do all of the following:

88 (1) To appropriate Appropriate and expend funds, make 89 contracts, obtain and distribute equipment, materials, and supplies for emergency management purposes; to provide for the 90 91 health and safety of persons and property, including emergency 92 assistance to the victims of any disaster; and to direct and 93 coordinate the development of emergency management plans and programs in accordance with the policies and plans set by the 94 95 federal and state emergency management agencies.

96 (2) To appoint, employ, remove, or provide, with or
97 without compensation, air raid wardens, rescue teams,
98 auxiliary fire and police personnel, and other emergency
99 management workers; provided, that compensated employees shall
100 be subject to any existing civil service or Merit System laws
101 Appoint or employ the personnel necessary to accomplish the
102 goals of this chapter.

103 (3) To establish Establish a primary and one or more 104 secondary control centers to serve as command posts during an 105 emergency, and to coordinate with other political subdivisions 106 to establish the same.

(4) To assign Assign and make available for duty the employees, property, or equipment of the subdivision relating to fire fighting, engineering, rescue, health, medical and related service, police, transportation, construction, and similar items or services for emergency management purposes, within or outside of the physical limits of the subdivision.



113 (5) In the event the governing body of the political subdivision determines that any of the conditions described in 114 115 Section 31-9-2(a) has occurred or is imminently likely to 116 occur, the governing body shall have the power may do any of 117 the following: 118 a. To waive procedure and formalities otherwise 119 required by law pertaining to the performance of public work, 120 entering into contracts, the incurring of obligations, the employment of temporary workers, the utilization of volunteer 121 workers, the rental of equipment, the purchase and 122 123 distribution with or without compensation of supplies, materials, and facilities, and the appropriation and 124 125 expenditure of public funds. Notwithstanding Article 3 of 126 Chapter 16 of Title 41, let contracts to the extent necessary 127 to address the conditions described in Section 31-9-2(a), provided that the governing body does the following: 128 129 1. Documents at least two price quotes or estimates 130 before letting the contract. 131 2. Adopts a resolution or ordinance declaring the 132 conditions, the action taken, and the reasons for taking the 133 action. 134 b. To impose Impose a public safety curfew for its 135 inhabitants. If a public safety curfew is imposed-as 136 authorized herein, it shall be enforced by the appropriate law 137 enforcement agency within the political subdivision. A public safety curfew imposed under this subsection subdivision shall 138 not apply to employees of utilities, cable, and 139 140 telecommunications companies and their contractors engaged in



141 activities necessary to maintain or restore utility, cable, 142 and or telecommunications services or to official emergency 143 management personnel engaged in emergency management 144 activities.

145 (6) To close Close, notwithstanding Section 11-1-8, any 146 and all public buildings owned or leased by and under the 147 control of the political subdivision where emergency 148 conditions warrant, whether or not a local state of emergency 149 has been declared by the governing body of the political subdivision. In the event that any documents required to be 150 151 filed by a time certain deadline cannot be filed in a timely manner-due to the closing of an office under this subdivision, 152 153 the deadline for filing shall be extended to the date that the 154 office is reopened as provided in Section 1-1-4.

(c) (1) In the event the Governor or the Legislature proclaims a state of emergency affecting a political subdivision as set forth in Section 31-9-8, the chair or president of the governing body of the political subdivision may execute a resolution on behalf of the governing body declaring that any of the conditions described in Section 31-9-2(a) has occurred or is imminently likely to occur.

162 (2) Execution of the resolution by the chair or
163 president of the governing body shall authorize the governing
164 body to exercise the powers enumerated in subdivision (b) (5).

(d) No local governing body of a political subdivision shall have the authority to provide for and compel evacuation of the area except by the direction and under the supervision of the Governor or the State Emergency Management Agency, or



both. Any action taken by the governing body of the political subdivision shall remain in full force and effect unless revoked by proclamation of the Governor, issued as provided in Section 31-9-8.

(e) (1) Nothing in this section shall authorize the seizure or confiscation of any firearm or ammunition from any individual who is lawfully carrying or possessing the firearm or ammunition except as provided in subdivision (2).

177 (2) A law enforcement officer who is acting in the lawful discharge of pursuant to the officer's official duties 178 179 may disarm an individual if the officer reasonably believes 180 that it is immediately necessary for the protection of the officer or another individual. The officer shall return the 181 182 firearm to the individual before discharging releasing that 183 individual unless the officer arrests that individual for engaging in criminal activity or seizes the firearm as 184 185 evidence pursuant to an investigation for the commission of a 186 crime or, at the discretion of the officer, the individual 187 poses a threat to himself or herself or to others."

189 (a) There is established a Local Emergency Management 190 Agency Assistance Fund to provide supplemental funding for 191 local emergency management agencies organizations created and 192 operating under Section 31-9-10, for the purposes and under 193 the conditions set out in this article. The local emergency 194 management agency organization supplement shall be funded by an annual allocation from the budget of the State of Alabama 195 196 Emergency Management Agency sufficient to make annual



197	disbursements up to <del>twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000)</del>
198	seventeen thousand dollars (\$17,000), or up to the amount as
199	adjusted by the Consumer Price Index pursuant to Section
200	<u>31-9-62(e)</u> , for each local emergency management agency
201	organization in the state certified as meeting the criteria
202	and procedures for payment as set out in this article.
203	(b) All necessary and appropriate disbursements shall
204	be made by the Comptroller as provided in this article."

206	(a) (1) The following requirements are hereby
207	established for the position of certified local emergency
208	management director created herein:
209	(1) <u>a.</u> Satisfactory completion of two years of college
210	level education.
211	(2) <u>b.</u> At least three years of work experience in the
212	area of emergency response, emergency management, or qualified
213	military service.
214	(3) <u>c.</u> Two hundred hours of course work in emergency
215	management as recommended by the Alabama Association of
216	Emergency Managers and approved established by the Director of
217	the Alabama Emergency Management Agency.
218	(2) Any person who is serving as a local emergency
219	management director on June 14, 2007, shall be deemed to
220	satisfy the requirement for two years of college level
221	education if he or she has a minimum five years' work
222	experience as a local emergency management director provided
223	and he or she meets all other the requirements for
224	<pre>certificationrequirement of paragraph(a)(1)c.</pre>



225	(b) Any local emergency management director meeting the
226	standards set out in subsection (a) shall be granted the
227	designation of local emergency management director without the
228	completion of any further requirements unless the requirements
229	are approved by the governing board of the Alabama Local
230	Government Training Institute established in Section 11-3-44."

232	(a) For the purposes of this section, a certified local
233	emergency management director is a local emergency management
234	director who completes the requirements to be a certified
235	local emergency management director and is so designated by
236	the Director of the Alabama Emergency Management Agency.
237	(a) (b) (1) Each state-recognized local emergency
238	management agency organization that employs and retains a
239	local emergency management director who completes the
240	requirements to be a certified local emergency management
241	director and is so designated by the Director of the Alabama
242	Emergency Management Agency certified local emergency
243	management director shall receive an annual salary supplement
244	from the Alabama Emergency Management Agency <mark>in an amount</mark>
245	necessary to provide the local director with a total salary of
246	forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) per year. to constitute 35
247	percent of the certified local emergency management director's
248	total salary. The amount of the salary supplement shall be the
249	difference between the salary paid to the local director on
250	the date of his or her certification and forty thousand
251	dollars (\$40,000) per year. In no case shall the salary
252	supplement paid as provided herein be more than <del>twelve</del>



253 thousand dollars (\$12,000) seventeen thousand dollars 254 (\$17,000) per county and such supplement shall not be paid 255 any local agency that does not increase the salary of such 256 certified local emergency management director to at least forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) per year. 257 258 (2) The subsidy salary supplement shall be paid 259 quarterly as a reimbursement for the salary paid to the local 260 director in the prior three months, under rules and procedures 261 established by the Director of the Alabama Emergency 262 Management Agency. There is annually appropriated from the State General Fund to the Alabama Emergency Management Agency 263 such funds as are necessary to meet the requirements of this 264 265 subsection. (b) If the amount of the supplement provided in 266 267 subsection (a) is less than twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000), the local agency shall be eligible for the additional 268 269 allocation of federal funds as provided in subsection (c). 270 However, the total supplement received by any local agency from the provisions of subsection (a) and the additional 271 272 allocation of federal funds provided in subsection (c) shall 273 not exceed a total of twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000) per 274 vear. 275 (c) Each state-recognized local emergency management 276 agency that employs and retains a local emergency management 277 director who completes the requirements to be a certified 278 local emergency management director, is so designated by the 279 Director of the Alabama Emergency Management Agency and is

280 receiving total salary of forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) or



the date of his or her certification shall not be 281 <u>on</u> eligible for the supplement provided in subsection (a). 282 283 However, such local emergency management agencies employing 284 such certified directors shall be entitled to an additional 285 allocation of federal funds made available to the department 286 for local mitigation, planning, and program purposes as 287 provided herein. Beginning on October 1, 2007, and each year 288 thereafter, the department shall set aside additional federal 289 funds in an amount equal to 25 percent of the total increase 290 in such funds above those amounts received in the fiscal year 291 ending September 30, 2007. These funds shall be divided equally among those the state-recognized local emergency 292 management agencies organizations qualifying as provided 293 herein that employ and retain a certified local emergency 294 295 management director. However, the total supplement received by any local agency from the provisions of subsection (a) and the 296 297 additional allocation of federal funds provided in this 298 subsection shall not exceed a total of twelve thousand dollars 299 (\$12,000) per year. 300 (d) There is annually appropriated from the state 301 General Fund to the Alabama Emergency Management agency such 302 funds as are necessary to meet the requirements of this 303 section. 304 (d) (e) No monies provided for in this article may be

expended for any purpose unless they have been appropriated by the Legislature and allocated pursuant to this article. Any funds appropriated shall be budgeted and allotted pursuant to the Budget Management Act in accordance with Article 4



309	(commencing with Section 41-4-80) of Chapter 4 of Title 41,
310	and only in the amounts provided by the Legislature in the
311	general appropriations act or other appropriations act.
312	(f) The dollar values in this section shall be adjusted
313	every five years based on the Consumer Price Index for all
314	urban consumers as published by the U.S. Department of Labor,
315	Bureau of Labor Statistics."
316	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first
317	day of the third month following its passage and approval by
318	the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
