## A BILL

# FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

- "An Act raising certain fees related to sport fishing, hunting, and trapping; relating to fish and game conservation decals; raising the age of eligibility for a sport fishing, hunting, or trapping license exemption for state residents; raising the age at which a state resident is required to obtain a license for sport fishing, hunting, or trapping; and providing for an effective date."
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

\* **Section 1.** AS 16.05.251(a) is amended to read:

- 8 (a) The Board of Fisheries may adopt regulations it considers advisable in accordance with AS 44.62 (Administrative Procedure Act) for
- 10 (1) setting apart fish reserve areas, refuges, and sanctuaries in the 11 waters of the state over which it has jurisdiction, subject to the approval of the 12 legislature;
- 13 (2) establishing open and closed seasons and areas for the taking of
