AN ACT DECLARING GUN VIOLENCE A PUBLIC HEALTH CRISIS AND ESTABLISHING THE OFFICE OF GUN VIOLENCE PREVENTION AND ADVISORY COUNCIL ON GUN VIOLENCE PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (NEW) (Effective July 1, 2022) It is hereby declared that gun
- 2 violence constitutes a public health crisis in this state and will continue
- 3 to constitute a public health crisis until the goal set forth in subsection
- 4 (b) of section 2 of this act is attained.
- 5 Sec. 2. (NEW) (Effective July 1, 2022) (a) There is established an Office
- 6 of Gun Violence Prevention, which shall be within the Department of
- 7 Public Health.
- 8 (b) The Office of Gun Violence Prevention shall work toward the goal
- 9 of substantially decreasing the level of gun violence in the state,
- 10 including, but not limited to, by (1) collecting data on gun violence in
- 11 the state, (2) making such gun violence data publicly available, (3)
- making recommendations to decrease the effects of gun violence on
- public health, (4) implementing evidence-informed, community-based

programs and strategies to reduce gun violence in the state, and (5) coordinating funding for such collection and dissemination of data and implementation of such programs.

- (c) Not later than January 1, 2023, the Commissioner of Public Health shall appoint a director of the Office of Gun Violence Prevention and designate the staff necessary to carry out the responsibilities of the office set forth in this section.
- (d) (1) The Office of Gun Violence Prevention shall establish and administer a grant award program to provide grants to organizations to conduct evidence-informed, community-based initiatives for gun violence prevention and intervention and mental health aftercare for gun violence survivors. To be eligible for a grant award, an organization shall demonstrate the ability to conduct such initiatives in an effective manner, as determined by the director. The office shall prioritize awarding grants to organizations that conduct such initiatives with individuals and in communities identified as having the highest occurrence of gun violence and victimization as the result of gun violence.
- (2) An organization that receives a grant awarded pursuant to subdivision (1) of this subsection shall incorporate strategies into its initiatives that are evidence-informed and have demonstrated effectiveness at reducing gun violence without contributing to mass incarceration. Such initiatives may include, but need not be limited to, a hospital-based violence intervention program, a group violence intervention program, an evidence-based street outreach program, a violence interruption and crisis management program, gun violence survivor outreach, mental health aftercare for gun violence survivors and any individualized wraparound services to prevent or deal with the aftermath of gun violence. A grant award recipient shall conduct regular evaluations of each initiative it conducts, including, but not limited to, facilitating community input on and engagement in such initiative. As used in this subdivision, "group violence" means the use of violence by people who identify themselves as members of a group, whether such

group is transitory or has a more permanent identity, against another group or set of individuals to achieve political, economic or social objectives.

- (3) The Department of Public Health may promulgate rules necessary for the administration of the grant program, including grant application procedures, criteria for determining the amount and duration of the grant awards and reporting requirements for organizations that receive grant awards.
- (4) In administering the grant program, the Office of Gun Violence Prevention shall collaborate with stakeholders as the director deems necessary to ensure equity in the distribution of grant awards. The office shall consult with the Advisory Council on Gun Violence Prevention and Intervention established under section 3 of this act to develop grant priorities, set criteria for determining the amount and duration of grant awards, select grant award recipients and determine reporting requirements for grant award recipients.
- (e) The Office of Gun Violence Prevention shall establish and maintain a research repository for data, research and statistical information regarding gun violence in the state. As part of maintaining such repository, the office shall perform the following functions, in consultation with an organization in the state that conducts gun violence prevention research:
- (1) Assist researchers seeking information about gun violence prevention in the state;
- (2) Collaborate with researchers to (A) identify gaps in available data needed for gun violence prevention research and develop strategies to improve relevant data collection in the state, (B) use any available research to enhance evidence-based gun violence prevention tools and resources available to communities in the state, and (C) improve the understanding of the disproportionate barriers to safety from gun violence by encouraging disaggregation of data by race and ethnicity when such research is conducted;

(3) Promote relevant research regarding gun violence prevention and, where possible, make such research accessible to the state's research community and members of the public; and

- (4) Provide technical assistance to all recipients of a grant award pursuant to subsection (d) of this section.
- (f) The Department of Public Health shall establish a violence data dashboard, in collaboration with the Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, local law enforcement agencies and hospitals in the state, to collect and disclose data on the scope of, frequency of and locations and populations affected by violence, including, but not limited to, data on the number of victims of gun violence, rates at which and locations where gun violence occurs in the state and any contributory factors to such violence. The dashboard shall also include data on suicides with a gun.
- Sec. 3. (NEW) (Effective July 1, 2022) (a) There is established an Advisory Council on Gun Violence Prevention and Intervention. The advisory council shall make recommendations to and advise the Office of Gun Violence Prevention, established under section 2 of this act, on the development of a public health and community-based strategy to reduce gun violence. The advisory council may (1) consult with community outreach organizations, victim services providers, victims of community violence, as defined in section 17b-28j of the general statutes, and gun violence, community violence and gun violence researchers and public safety and law enforcement representatives regarding strategies to reduce community violence and gun violence, (2) identify effective, evidence-based community violence and gun violence reduction strategies, (3) identify strategies to align the resources of state agencies to reduce community violence and gun violence, (4) identify state, federal and private funding sources for community violence and gun violence reduction initiatives, and (5) assist in the development of a public health and community engagement strategy for the Office of Gun Violence Prevention.

(b) The advisory council shall be comprised of at least one member from each of the following categories, who shall be appointed by the director of the Office of Gun Violence Prevention: (1) Individuals impacted by gun violence; (2) organizations with expertise in gun violence prevention; (3) law enforcement; (4) communities of color, as described in section 17b-857 of the general statutes, impacted by gun violence; (5) researchers of gun violence; and (6) public health experts.

- (c) The director of the Office of Gun Violence Prevention shall make all initial appointments to the advisory council not later than thirty days after the effective date of this section. Any vacancy shall be filled by the director.
- (d) A chairperson shall be elected by the advisory council members from among the members of the advisory council for a one-year term. The advisory council shall meet not less than bimonthly.
- (e) The administrative staff of the Commission on Women, Children,
 Seniors, Equity and Opportunity shall serve as administrative staff of
 the advisory council.
- Sec. 4. (*Effective July 1, 2022*) The sum of five million dollars is appropriated to the Department of Public Health from the General Fund, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, for administering the Office of Gun Violence Prevention established under section 2 of this act.
