"AN ACT ADDRESSING GUN VIOLENCE."

- Strike lines 405 to 426, inclusive, in their entirety and substitute the following in lieu thereof:
- 3 "(a) [The] (1) Until September 30, 2023, the fee for each permit
- 4 originally issued under the provisions of subsection (a) of section 29-28,
- 5 <u>as amended by this act,</u> for the sale at retail of [pistols and revolvers]
- 6 <u>firearms</u> shall be two hundred dollars and for each renewal of such
- 7 permit two hundred dollars. [The] <u>Until September 30, 2023, the</u> fee for
- 8 each state permit originally issued under the provisions of subsection
- 9 (b) of section 29-28, as amended by this act, for the carrying of pistols
- and revolvers shall be one hundred forty dollars plus sufficient funds as
- 11 required to be transmitted to the Federal Bureau of Investigation to
- 12 cover the cost of a national criminal history records check. <u>Until</u>
- 13 September 30, 2023, the fee to renew each state permit originally issued
- 14 under the provisions of subsection (b) of section 29-28, as amended by
- 15 <u>this act, shall be seventy dollars.</u>

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(2) On and after October 1, 2023, there shall be no fee for (A) any permit originally issued under the provisions of subsection (a) of section 29-28, as amended by this act, for the sale at retail of firearms, or the renewal of such permit, or (B) any state permit originally issued under the provisions of subsection (b) of section 29-28, as amended by this act, for the carrying of pistols and revolvers or the renewal of such permit, except for sufficient funds as required to be transmitted to the Federal Bureau of Investigation to cover the cost of a national criminal history records check. The local authority shall forward sufficient funds for the national criminal history records check to the commissioner no later than five business days after receipt by the local authority of the application for the temporary state permit. [Seventy dollars shall be retained by the local authority. Upon approval by the local authority of the application for a temporary state permit, seventy dollars shall be sent to the commissioner. The fee to renew each state permit originally issued under the provisions of subsection (b) of section 29-28 shall be seventy dollars. Upon deposit of such fees in the General Fund, ten dollars of each fee shall be credited within thirty days to the appropriation for the Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection to a separate nonlapsing account for the purposes of the issuance of permits under subsections (a) and (b) of section 29-28.]"

After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and internal references accordingly:

"Sec. 501. Section 29-380 of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2023*):

(a) [The] (1) Until September 30, 2023, the fee for each ammunition certificate originally issued under the provisions of this section shall be thirty-five dollars and for each renewal thereof thirty-five dollars, which fees shall be paid to the Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection and shall be in addition to the fee paid pursuant to subsection (b) of section 29-17a for conducting the national criminal history records check. [Upon deposit of such fees in the General Fund, the fees shall be credited to the appropriation to the Department of

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Emergency Services and Public Protection to a separate nonlapsing account for the purposes of the issuance of ammunition certificates

51 under section 29-38n.]

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- (2) On and after October 1, 2023, no fee shall be charged for each ammunition certificate originally issued under the provisions of this section or any renewal thereof, other than the fee paid pursuant to subsection (b) of section 29-17a for conducting the national criminal history records check.
 - (b) An ammunition certificate originally issued under the provisions of section 29-38n shall expire five years after the date it becomes effective and each renewal thereof shall expire five years after the expiration date of the certificate being renewed.
 - [(c) The renewal fee shall apply for each renewal that is requested not earlier than thirty-one days before, and not later than thirty-one days after, the expiration date of the certificate being renewed.]
 - [(d)] (c) No fee or portion thereof paid under the provisions of subsection (a) of this section for issuance or renewal of an ammunition certificate shall be refundable except if the certificate for which the fee or portion thereof was paid was not issued or renewed.
 - [(e)] (d) An ammunition certificate issued pursuant to section 29-38n shall be valid for a period of ninety days from the expiration date, except this provision shall not apply to any certificate which has been revoked or for which revocation is pending, pursuant to section 29-38p."
