## "AN ACT ADDRESSING GUN VIOLENCE."

- 1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and 2 internal references accordingly:
- "Sec. 501. Section 53a-19 of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2023*):
- 5 (a) [Except as provided in subsections (b) and (c) of this section, a] A person is justified in using reasonable physical force upon another 6 7 person to defend [himself] such person's self or a third person from 8 what [he] such person reasonably believes to be the use or imminent use 9 of physical force, and [he] such person may use such degree of force which [he] such person reasonably believes to be necessary for such 10 11 purpose. [; except that deadly] Deadly physical force may [not] be used 12 [unless] if the actor reasonably believes that such other person is (1) 13 using or about to use deadly physical force, or (2) inflicting or about to

a person is not justified in using deadly physical force upon another 16 17 person if he or she knows that he or she can avoid the necessity of using 18 such force with complete safety (1) by retreating, except that the actor] 19 No person shall [not] be required to retreat if he or she is in his or her 20 dwelling, as defined in section 53a-100, or place of work and was not the 21 initial aggressor, or if he or she is a peace officer or a private person 22 assisting such peace officer at his or her direction [,] and acting pursuant 23 to section 53a-22. [, or (2) by surrendering possession of property to a 24 person asserting a claim of right thereto, or (3) by complying with a 25 demand that he or she abstain from performing an act which he or she 26 is not obliged to perform.]

(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this section, a person is not justified in using physical force when (1) with intent to cause physical injury or death to another person, [he] <u>such person</u> provokes the use of physical force by such other person, or (2) [he] <u>such person</u> is the initial aggressor, except that [his] <u>such person's</u> use of physical force upon another person under such circumstances is justifiable if [he] <u>such person</u> withdraws from the encounter and effectively communicates to such other person [his] <u>such person's</u> intent to do so, but such other person notwithstanding continues or threatens the use of physical force, or (3) the physical force involved was the product of a combat by agreement not specifically authorized by law."
