- Section 2. (1) The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity that personal identifying information of a person issued a certificate of possession with respect to an assault weapon or large capacity ammunition magazine under s. 790.30, Florida Statutes, be made confidential and exempt from public records requirements. The possession of an assault weapon or large capacity ammunition magazine in this state by a member of the general public requires an individual to file an application containing personal identifying information. The Legislature has made the Department of Law Enforcement the responsible agency for collecting this information and issuing a certificate of possession with respect to an assault weapon or large capacity ammunition magazine.
- (2) The knowledge that an individual has obtained a certificate of possession for an assault weapon or large capacity ammunition magazine may logically lead to the conclusion that he or she owns such a weapon or large capacity

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ammunition magazine and may lead to the theft or attempted theft of such a weapon or magazine. Additionally, the Legislature has expressed in s. 790.335(1)(a)3., Florida Statutes, that a record of legally owned firearms or law-abiding firearm owners is "an instrument that can be used as a means to profile innocent citizens and to harass and abuse American citizens based solely on their choice to own firearms and exercise their Second Amendment right to keep and bear arms as quaranteed under the United States Constitution." Release of personal identifying information of an individual who has obtained a certificate of possession for an assault weapon or large capacity ammunition magazine could be used to harass an innocent individual based solely on his or her exercised right to possess such a weapon or magazine. Therefore, the Legislature finds that the personal identifying information of an individual who has obtained a certificate of possession for an assault weapon or large capacity ammunition magazine pursuant to s. 790.30, Florida Statutes, must be held confidential and exempt from public records requirements.

Section 3. This act shall take effect on the same date that HB 167 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law.
