35 (2) A person who stores or leaves, on a premise under his  
36 or her control, a loaded firearm, as defined in s. 790.001, and  
37 who knows or reasonably should know that a minor is likely to

68 **Section 4. Section 790.175, Florida Statutes, is amended**  
69 **to read:**

70 790.175 Transfer or sale of firearms; required warnings  
71 and information; penalties.—

72 (1) Upon the retail commercial sale or retail transfer of  
73 any firearm, the seller or transferor shall deliver a written  
74 warning to the purchaser or transferee, which warning states, in  
75 block letters not less than 1/4 inch in height:

103 comprehensive voluntary safety program, including the training  
104 of individuals on the safe handling and use of firearms, or by a  
105 comparable nonprofit organization, and must contain all of the  
106 following information relating to firearms:

107 a. Rules for the safe handling, storage, and use of  
108 firearms.

109 b. Nomenclature and descriptions of various types of  
110 firearms.

111 c. Responsibilities of firearm ownership.

112        d. The following information developed by the Department  
113        of Law Enforcement:

114        (I) A list of locations where handguns are prohibited; and  
115        (II) Information concerning the use of handguns for self-  
116        defense.

117        2. Offer the purchaser a demonstration of how to use a  
118        firearm locking mechanism.

119        3. Post in a conspicuous place information relating to the  
120        availability of known local voluntary firearm safety programs.

121        (b) The brochure required under paragraph (a) does not  
122        need to be provided by the firearm dealer if the firearm  
123        manufacturer provides with the firearm a brochure on basic  
124        firearm safety.

125        (c) The firearm dealer may charge a fee for the brochure  
126        which may not exceed the dealer's cost in obtaining the  
127        brochure.

128        (d) Organizations that produce brochures on basic firearm  
129        safety for distribution to firearm dealers for subsequent  
130        distribution to purchasers of firearms under this section and  
131        firearm dealers are not liable for injuries resulting from the  
132        accidental discharge of nondefective firearms purchased from any  
133        firearm dealer.

139 **Section 5. For the purpose of incorporating the amendment**  
140 **made by this act to section 790.174, Florida Statutes, in a**  
141 **reference thereto, paragraph (g) of subsection (5) of section**  
142 **409.175, Florida Statutes, is reenacted to read:**

143 409.175 Licensure of family foster homes, residential  
144 child-caring agencies, and child-placing agencies; public  
145 records exemption.—

146 (5) The department shall adopt and amend rules for the  
147 levels of licensed care associated with the licensure of family  
148 foster homes, residential child-caring agencies, and child-  
149 placing agencies. The rules may include criteria to approve  
150 waivers to licensing requirements when applying for a child-  
151 specific license.

152 (g) The department's rules shall include adoption of a  
153 form to be used by child-placing agencies during an adoption  
154 home study that requires all prospective adoptive applicants to
