A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to offenses against public order and safety, so as to create the offense of religious intimidation; to provide for penalties; to provide for a cross-reference to the offense of religious intimidation in the crime of using machine guns, sawed-off rifles, sawed-off shotguns, or firearms during the commission of certain offenses; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

9 Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to offenses against

10 public order and safety, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

12 (a) An individual commits the offense of religious intimidation when he or she maliciously

13 and with specific intent to intimidate or harass another individual because of such

14 <u>individual's religion:</u>

- 15 (1) Intentionally makes physical contact with such individual;
- 16 (2) Intentionally damages, destroys, or defaces real or personal property of another
 17 person; or
- 18 (3) Threatens by word or act to cause physical contact with such individual or to damage,
- 19 <u>destroy</u>, or deface real or personal property of another person.
- 20 (b) No individual shall be convicted under paragraph (3) of subsection (a) of this Code
- 21 section on the uncorroborated testimony of the party to whom the threat is communicated.
- 22 (c) An individual convicted of the offense of religious intimidation shall be guilty of a
- 23 felony and shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00, imprisonment for not
- 24 <u>less than one nor more than five years, or both.</u>
- 25 (d) Any violation of this Code section shall constitute a separate offense and shall not
- 26 <u>merge with any other crime set forth in this title.</u>"

27	SECTION 2.
28	Said chapter is further amended by revising paragraph (1) of subsection (a) of Code Section
29	16-11-160, relating to use of machine guns, sawed-off rifles, sawed-off shotguns, or firearms
30	during the commission of certain offenses, as follows:
31	''(a)(1) It shall be unlawful for any person to possess or to use a machine gun, sawed-off
32	rifle, sawed-off shotgun, or firearm equipped with a silencer, as those terms are defined
33	in Code Section 16-11-121, during the commission or the attempted commission of any
34	of the following offenses:
35	(A) Aggravated assault as defined in violation of Code Section 16-5-21;
36	(B) Aggravated battery as defined in violation of Code Section 16-5-24;
37	(C) Robbery as defined in violation of Code Section 16-8-40;
38	(D) Armed robbery as defined in violation of Code Section 16-8-41;
39	(D.1)(E) Home invasion in any degree as defined in violation of Code Section 16-7-5;
40	(E)(F) Murder or felony murder as defined in violation of Code Section 16-5-1;
41	(F)(G) Voluntary manslaughter as defined in violation of Code Section 16-5-2;
42	(G)(H) Involuntary manslaughter as defined in violation of Code Section 16-5-3;
43	(H)(I) Sale, possession for sale, transportation, manufacture, offer for sale, or offer to
44	manufacture controlled substances in violation of any provision of Article 2 of Chapter
45	13 of this title, the 'Georgia Controlled Substances Act';
46	(I)(J) Terroristic threats or acts as defined in violation of Code Section 16-11-37;
47	(K) Religious intimidation in violation of Code Section 16-11-37.2;
48	(J)(L) Arson as defined in violation of Code Section 16-7-60, 16-7-61, or 16-7-62, or
49	arson of lands as defined in violation of Code Section 16-7-63;
50	(K)(M) Influencing witnesses as defined in violation of Code Section 16-10-93; and
51	(L)(N) Participation in criminal gang activity as defined in violation of Code Section
52	16-15-4."
