A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 4 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to dangerous instrumentalities and practices, so as to prohibit public officers from
- 3 ordering the enforcement of certain federal acts regarding the right to keep and bear arms;
- 4 to provide for exceptions; to provide for definitions; to provide for civil and criminal
- 5 penalties; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Article 4 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 9 dangerous instrumentalities and practices, is amended by adding a new part to read as
- 10 follows:

- 12 <u>16-11-180.</u>
- 13 (a) As used in this part, the term:

14 (1) 'Agency or political subdivision' means any department, agency, authority,

- commission, or government entity of this state or of any county, municipality, or other
- subdivision of this state.
- 17 (2) 'Public official' means an elected or appointed official or an employee or an agent of
- an agency or political subdivision.
- 19 (b) Except when required to do so by court order or otherwise by law, no federal executive
- order, agency order, law, statute, rule, or regulation issued, enacted, or promulgated on or
- 21 after July 1, 2021, shall be knowingly or willfully ordered to be enforced by any public
- 22 official if contrary to Article I, Section I, Paragraph VIII of the Constitution of this state.
- 23 (c) Any public official who knowingly and willfully orders another public official to
- 24 enforce any federal executive order, agency order, law, statute, rule, or regulation as
- 25 prohibited in subsection (b) of this Code section shall, upon a first violation, be liable for
- 26 <u>a civil penalty not to exceed \$1,000.00</u>, which shall be paid into the treasury of this state
- 27 and shall, upon a second or subsequent violation, be guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 28 (d) Nothing in this Code section shall be construed to affect the law of search and seizure
- or the performance of any act solely for the purpose of facilitating the transfer of firearms
- 30 under federal law."

31 SECTION 2.

32 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
