A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 4 of Chapter 5 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to reckless conduct, so as to provide for the offense of reckless conduct by
- 3 discharging a firearm; to provide for penalties; to prohibit merger of offenses; to prohibit
- 4 probation and other alternatives to incarceration; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 5 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Article 4 of Chapter 5 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 9 reckless conduct, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

- 11 (a) A person who by intentionally discharging a firearm in the direction of another person
- causes bodily harm to or endangers the bodily safety of another person by consciously
- disregarding a substantial and unjustifiable risk that his or her act will cause harm to or
- endanger the safety of any other person, and whose disregard constitutes a gross deviation
- 15 from the standard of care which a reasonable person would exercise in the situation, shall
- 16 be guilty of a felony.

17 (b)(1) A person convicted of violating subsection (a) of this Code section when no injury

- results shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than two nor more than ten years.
- 19 (2) A person convicted of violating subsection (a) of this Code section when injury
- 20 <u>results shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than five nor more than ten years.</u>
- 21 (c) The offense of violating subsection (a) of this Code section shall not merge with any
- 22 other offense.
- 23 (d) A person convicted of violating subsection (a) of this Code section shall not be eligible
- 24 for probation, parole, furlough, or work release."

25 SECTION 2.

26 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
