Code Section 16-11-126 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to having or carrying handguns, long guns, or other weapons, license requirement, and exceptions for homes, motor vehicles, private property, and other locations and conditions, is amended by revising subsection (e) as follows:

"(e)(1)(A) Any person licensed to carry a weapon in any other state whose laws recognize and give effect to a license issued pursuant to this part shall be authorized to carry a weapon in this state, but only while the licensee is not a resident of this state; provided, however, that:

22 (i) Such licensee licensed to carry a weapon in any other state shall carry the weapon 23 in compliance with the laws of this state; and 24 (ii) No other state shall be required to recognize and give effect to a license issued 25 pursuant to this part that is held by a person who is younger than 21 years of age. 26 (B)(i) The Attorney General shall create and maintain on the Department of Law's 27 website a list of states whose laws recognize and give effect to a license issued 28 pursuant to this part. 29 (ii) The Attorney General shall enter into an agreement with any state that requires an agreement to recognize and give effect to a license issued pursuant to this part. 30 31 (2) Any person who is not a weapons carry license holder in this state and who is 32 licensed to carry a weapon in any other state whose laws recognize and give effect to a 33 license issued pursuant to this part shall be authorized to carry a weapon in this state for 34 90 days after he or she becomes a resident of this state; provided, however, that such 35 person shall carry the weapon in compliance with the laws of this state, shall as soon as 36 practicable submit a weapons carry license application as provided for under Code Section 16-11-129, and shall remain licensed in such other state for the duration of time 37 38 that he or she is a resident of this state but not a weapons carry license holder in this 39 state."
