A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Article 27 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 1 2 relating to loitering at or disrupting schools, so as to enact the "Elementary School Protection 3 Act"; to authorize local boards of education to employ elementary para-protection officers 4 to provide security in public elementary schools; to provide for requirements; to provide for stipends; to amend Code Section 16-11-127.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 5 relating to carrying weapons within school safety zones, at school functions, or on school 6 7 property, so as to authorize elementary para-protection officers to carry concealed weapons 8 in school safety zones; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other 9 purposes. 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA: 11 **SECTION 1.** 12 Article 27 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 13 loitering at or disrupting schools, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as 14 follows: 15 "20-2-1186. 16 (a) This Code section shall be known and may be cited as the 'Elementary School 17 Protection Act.' (b) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the local board of education for 18 19 each school system in this state may designate one or more paraprofessionals or other 20 school personnel to serve as elementary para-protection officers to assist in protecting students and staff in public elementary schools. Such officers shall be authorized to 21 22 possess and carry concealed, law enforcement approved, 9mm firearms, taser devices, and

- 23 arrest restraints within a school safety zone or school building, at a school function, or on
- 24 <u>school property or on a bus or other transportation furnished by the school.</u>
- 25 (c) To qualify as an elementary para-protection officer, he or she shall:

| 26 | (1) Have at least five years of employment experience as a nonadministrative law |

| 29 | (2) Upon employment, be authorized with law enforcement and arrest powers by a local |

| 33 | enforcement aspects of his or her employment. The local board shall be responsible for the |
| 34 | costs of any and all required training and certification for such elementary para-protection |

| 37 | Code Section 16-11-127.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to carrying |
| 38 | weapons within school safety zones, at school functions, or on school property, is amended |
| 39 | by revising subsection (c) by striking"or" at the end of paragraph (17), striking the period at |
| 40 | the end of paragraph (18) and inserting in its place "; or", and adding a new paragraph to read |
| 41 | as follows: |
