MADAM PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

A SENATE RESOLUTION urging the Legislative Council
 to assign to a study committee the topic of nullification of
 federal firearms legislation.

Whereas, The right of the people to bear arms in defense of
themselves and the State is an inherent and inalienable right
under the United States and Indiana Constitutions;

7 Whereas, The Supreme Court of the United States has held 8 that "the inherent right of self-defense has been central to the 9 Second Amendment right," and "the Second Amendment 10 extends, prima facie, to all instruments that constitute bearable 11 arms;"

Whereas, Many local, state, and federal lawmakers
continue to propose measures aimed at restricting firearms,
including bans, taxation, waiting periods, registration,
licensing, and confiscation; and

Whereas, A summer study committee could analyze possible
unconstitutional federal threats to Hoosiers' fundamental right
to keep and bear arms and determine if protective legislation is
necessary: Therefore,
