## HOUSE MOTION

## MR. SPEAKER:

I move that House Bill 1485 be amended to read as follows:

1	Page 5, between lines 34 and 35, begin a new paragraph and insert:
2	"SECTION 10. IC 3-11-10-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.157-2019,
3	SECTION 21, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
4	JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 1. (a) A voter voting by absentee ballot shall make
5	and subscribe to the affidavit prescribed by IC 3-11-4-21. The voter
6	then shall, except as provided in subsection (b), do the following:
7	(1) Mark the ballot in the presence of no other person.
8	(2) Fold each ballot separately.
9	(3) Fold each ballot so as to conceal the marking.
10	(4) Enclose each ballot, with the seal and signature of the circuit
11	court clerk on the outside, together with any unused ballot, in the
12	envelope provided.
13	(5) Securely seal the envelope.
14	(6) Do one (1) of the following:
15	(A) Deliver the envelope to the county election board, with not
16	more than one (1) ballot per envelope, by United States mail
17	or by a bonded courier company.
18	(B) Deliver the envelope to the county election board in
19	person.
20	(C) <del>Deliver</del> Give the envelope to a member of the voter's
21	family or household, a caretaker, or a person designated as

1	the attorney in fact for the voter under IC 30-5. <del>for delivery</del>
2	The person to whom the voter gives the envelope shall
3	<b>deliver the envelope</b> to the county election board:
4	(i) in person;
5	(ii) by United States mail; <del>or</del>
6	(iii) at a designated absentee ballot drop box under
7	IC 3-11.5-9; or
8	(iv) by a bonded courier company.
9	(b) A voter permitted to transmit the voter's absentee ballots by fax
10	or electronic mail under IC 3-11-4-6 is not required to comply with
11	subsection (a). The individual designated by the circuit court clerk to
12	receive absentee ballots transmitted by fax or electronic mail shall do
13	the following upon receipt of an absentee ballot transmitted by fax:
14	(1) Note the receipt of the absentee ballot in the records of the
15	circuit court clerk as other absentee ballots received by the circuit
16	court clerk are noted.
17	(2) Fold each ballot received from the voter separately so as to
18	conceal the marking.
19	(3) Enclose each ballot in a blank absentee ballot envelope.
20	(4) Securely seal the envelope.
20	(5) Mark on the envelope: "Absentee Ballot Received by Fax or
22	Electronic Mail".
23	(6) Securely attach to the envelope the faxed affidavit received
23	with the voter's absentee ballots.

23 26	(c) Except as otherwise provided in this title, absentee ballots
20 27	received by fax or electronic mail shall be handled and processed as
	other absentee ballots received by the circuit court clerk are handled
28	and processed.
29	SECTION 11. IC 3-11.5-2-1.3 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
30	CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
31	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 1.3. As used in this article,
32	"absentee ballot drop box" refers to a box that meets the following
33	criteria:
34	(1) Is made of durable metal or of other sturdy material.
35	(2) Is tamper-proof or comes with tamper detecting features,
36	including a fire suppression feature.
37	(3) Has the capacity to hold at least five hundred (500) ballot
38	return envelopes.
39	SECTION 12. IC 3-11.5-2-5.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
40	CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
41	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 5.5. As used in this article, "third
42	party designee" means an individual authorized by a voter to
43	return the voter's completed absentee ballot sealed in an absentee
44	ballot envelope to the county election board as described in
45	IC 3-11-10-1(a)(6)(C).
46	SECTION 13. IC 3-11.5-2-6 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE

1 AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 2 1, 2021]: Sec. 6. As used in this article, "travel box" means a 3 container with a lid that can be securely fastened so the contents of 4 the container will not fall out if the container is turned over. 5 SECTION 14. IC 3-11.5-9 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE 6 AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE 7 JULY 1, 2021]: 8 **Chapter 9. Absentee Ballot Drop Box** 9 Sec. 1. This chapter applies only if the county election board adopts this chapter by the unanimous vote of the entire 10 membership of the board. 11 12 Sec. 2. A voter may return a completed absentee ballot sealed in 13 an absentee ballot envelope to the county election board by 14 depositing the absentee ballot envelope in an absentee ballot drop 15 box. 16 Sec. 3. (a) A voter may authorize a third party designee to 17 return the voter's completed absentee ballot by depositing the 18 voter's absentee ballot envelope in an absentee ballot drop box as 19 described in section 2 of this chapter if the voter additionally 20 completes and returns a third party designee affidavit prescribed 21 by the commission that includes the following: 22 (1) The voter identifies the third party designee delivering the 23 voter's absentee ballot envelope to the absentee ballot drop 24 box. 25 (2) The voter affirms that the voter has authorized the third party designee to return the voter's absentee ballot envelope 26 27 to an absentee ballot drop box. 28 (3) The voter describes the relationship of the third party 29 designee to the voter to confirm that the third party designee 30 is permitted by law to return the voter's absentee ballot 31 envelope in an absentee ballot drop box. 32 (b) If the affidavit described in subsection (a) is not completed 33 or signed by the voter, the absentee ballot shall be treated as a 34 provisional ballot under IC 3-11.7. The county election board shall 35 immediately inform the voter of the error. 36 (c) The voter will have until noon ten (10) days after election 37 day to go to the county election board and complete an affidavit 38 affirming that the third party designee was authorized by the voter 39 to return the voter's absentee ballot envelope and was permitted by 40 law to return the voter's absentee ballot envelope. 41 Sec. 4. Not later than forty-five (45) days before the election, the 42 county election board shall make arrangements to place absentee 43 ballot drop boxes in various locations in the county. The locations 44 must satisfy the following: 45 (1) The absentee ballot drop boxes must be located on any property that is a county owned building where the circuit 46 47 court clerk's office or county election board office is located.

1	(2) The location must have site security and a security camera
2	continuously monitoring the absentee ballot drop box.
3	Sec. 5. (a) The county election board shall assign as many
4	courier teams as necessary to collect all absentee ballot return
5	envelopes deposited in an absentee ballot drop box each day.
6	(b) Beginning twenty-eight (28) days before the election, the
7	county election board shall make arrangements for courier teams
8	to open each absentee ballot drop box between 6 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.
9	each day before election day. A courier team shall visit each
10	absentee ballot drop box at 6 p.m. on election day and make the
11	final collection from the absentee ballot drop box for that election.
12	(c) Each of the appointed members of the county election board
13	shall keep one (1) of the keys for each absentee ballot drop box.
14	Each appointed member shall keep the key securely in the manner
15	determined by that appointed member. If an appointed member
16	cannot be present each day, then that member shall designate
17	someone from the member's political party to be present with the
18	key to the lock at the time the courier team arrives to pick up the
19	supplies described in subsection (e).
20	(d) A courier team shall arrive at the circuit court clerk's office
21	not later than 5 p.m. before visiting an absentee ballot drop box.
22	(e) The appointed members of the county election board shall
23	give the following to members of the courier team:
24 25	(1) A new seal to replace the seal that will be broken when the
23 26	courier team opens the absentee ballot drop box. (2) One (1) of the keys necessary to open the absentee ballot
20 27	drop box to one (1) of the members of the courier team.
28	(3) The other key necessary to open the absentee ballot drop
29	box to the other courier.
30	(4) A log for the courier team to note all of the following:
31	(A) The date and time the courier team arrived at the
32	absentee ballot drop box.
33	(B) The date and time the courier team broke the seal and
34	opened the absentee ballot drop box.
35	(C) The number on the seal that was broken.
36	(D) A place to mark "yes" or "no" to the statement "Was
37	the seal on the absentee ballot drop box broken when you
38	arrived to collect the absentee ballots?".
39	(E) The time the absentee ballot drop box was relocked and
40	sealed by the courier team.
41	(F) The number of the seal applied to the absentee ballot
42	drop box after it is relocked.
43	(G) A place for each member of the courier team to sign
44	the log.
45	(5) A travel box.
46	(f) After receiving the materials from the appointed board
47	members of the county election board under subsection (e), the

1 courier team shall visit the absentee ballot drop box assigned to the 2 courier team. 3 (g) After unlocking the absentee ballot drop box, the courier 4 team shall transfer all absentee ballot return envelopes in the 5 absentee ballot drop box to the travel box. 6 (h) The courier team shall do all of the following: 7 (1) Close the opening of the absentee ballot drop box. 8 (2) Lock the absentee ballot drop box. 9 (3) Apply a new seal to the absentee ballot drop box. 10 (4) Complete the log provided under subsection (e)(4). 11 (5) On election day, securely seal the opening where voters 12 deposit ballots including a notice that reads: "The election has 13 concluded. No more absentee ballots are accepted.". 14 (i) Immediately after the requirements in subsection (h) are 15 completed, the courier team shall return the travel box to the 16 circuit court clerk's office. 17 Sec. 6. (a) This section applies when a courier team finds and 18 reports on the log provided under section 5(e)(4) of this chapter 19 that a seal to the absentee ballot drop box was broken before the 20 absentee ballot drop box was unlocked. 21 (b) Absentee ballots found in the drop box shall be treated as 22 provisional ballots under IC 3-11.7. 23 Sec. 7. (a) The circuit court clerk shall arrange for each 24 absentee ballot drop box to be collected and returned to the clerk's 25 office: 26 (1) after noon; and 27 (2) not later than 5 p.m.; 28 not later than a week after election day. 29 (b) Upon return of an absentee ballot drop box under subsection 30 (a), the circuit court clerk (or the clerk's designee) shall unlock 31 each absentee ballot drop box. 32 (c) If an absentee ballot return envelope is found in an absentee 33 ballot drop box when opened under subsection (b), the absentee 34 ballot return envelope shall be delivered to the county election 35 board. 36 (d) The county election board shall: 37 (1) reject the absentee ballot; 38 (2) have the statement "Rejected by the county election 39 board" printed on the absentee ballot return envelope; and 40 (3) have the circuit court clerk seal the absentee ballot 41 envelope with any other ballots rejected under this title. 42 Sec. 8. Each circuit court clerk shall certify the names of the 43 voters whose absentee ballots have been received at an absentee 44 ballot drop box when making the certification under 45 IC 3-11.5-4-8(b). 46 Sec. 9. Each circuit court clerk shall keep all accepted absentee 47 ballot envelopes securely in the clerk's office until the absentee

- ballot envelopes are opened by absentee ballot counters in
  accordance with this article.".
