Synopsis: Possession of firearms by retired law enforcement officers. Provides that a retired law enforcement officer may possess a firearm on school property under certain conditions.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

34	(2) a former student of the school if the person is no longer

36	enrolled in the school due to a disciplinary action within the
37	previous twenty-four (24) months.
	(c) For purposes of subsection (a)(3) (a)(4) and (a)(5), (a)(6), a
38	motor vehicle does not include a motor vehicle owned, leased, or
39	controlled by a school or school district unless the person who
40	possesses the firearm is authorized by the school or school district to
41	possess a firearm.
