## **HOUSE BILL No. 1619**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 2-3-10; IC 4-2-9.

**Synopsis:** Lawful carry by state elected officials and staff. Permits a member of the general assembly, professional staff of the general assembly, and a state officer to carry a handgun within the state capitol building and on the property of the Indiana government center campus if the person is not prohibited from carrying a handgun by state or federal law.

Effective: July 1, 2023.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning firearms.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

25	handgun within the state capitol building and on the property of
26	the Indiana government center campus.
