DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 35-47-4-10.

Synopsis: Reporting of lost or stolen firearms. Makes it a Class C infraction for a person to fail to report a lost or stolen firearm to a specified law enforcement agency within 30 days after the firearm is lost or stolen.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 35-47-4-10 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2023]: Sec. 10. (a) A person:
4	(1) who has lost a firearm; or
5	(2) whose firearm has been stolen;
6	shall report the theft or loss to a law enforcement agency described
7	in subsection (b) not later than thirty (30) days after the firearm is
8	lost or stolen.
9	(b) A report under subsection (a) must be made to:
10	(1) the state police; or
11	(2) a law enforcement agency that has jurisdiction in the
12	location where the person believes the firearm was lost or
13	stolen.
14	(c) A person who violates subsection (a) commits a Class C
15	infraction.
