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1 AN ACT relating to the sale of confiscated firearms.

## Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

- 3 → Section 1. KRS 16.220 is amended to read as follows:
- 4 (1) Subject to the duty to return confiscated firearms to innocent owners pursuant to
- 5 KRS 500.090, all firearms confiscated by the Department of Kentucky State Police
- 6 and not retained for official use pursuant to KRS 500.090 shall be sold at public
- 7 auction to federally licensed firearms dealers holding a license appropriate for the
- 8 type of firearm sold. Any provision of KRS Chapter 45 or 45A relating to
- 9 disposition of property to the contrary notwithstanding, the Department of Kentucky
- 10 State Police shall:

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- Conduct any auction specified by this section;
- 12 (b) Retain for departmental use twenty percent (20%) of the gross proceeds from
- 13 any auction specified by this section; and
- 14 (c) Transfer remaining proceeds of the sale to the account of the Kentucky Office
- 15 of Homeland Security for use as provided in subsection (4) of this section.
- 16 (2)Prior to the sale of any firearm, the Department of Kentucky State Police shall make
- 17 an attempt to determine if the firearm to be sold has been stolen or otherwise
- unlawfully obtained from an innocent owner and return the firearm to its lawful 18
- 19 innocent owner, unless that person is ineligible to purchase a firearm under federal
- 20 law.
- 21 The Department of Kentucky State Police shall receive firearms and ammunition
- 22 confiscated by or abandoned to every law enforcement agency in Kentucky. The
- 23 department shall dispose of the firearms received in the manner specified in
- 24 subsection (1) of this section. However, firearms which are not retained for official
- 25 use, returned to an innocent lawful owner, or transferred to another government
- 26 agency or public museum shall be sold as provided in subsections (1) and (3) of this
- 27 section.

2		<u>(b)</u>	The program shall be administered by the Kentucky Office of Homeland
3			Security and shall use the proceeds of firearms sales made available under

17			2. Body armor for sworn peace officers of those departments and service
18			animals, as defined in KRS 525.010, of those departments;

20			4.[(e)] Electronic control devices, electronic control weapons, or electro-
21			muscular disruption technology; and
22			$\underline{5.[(d)]}$ Body-worn cameras.
23		<u>(d)</u>	In awarding grants under this section, the Kentucky Office of Homeland
24			Security shall give [first] priority to the purchasing of items in the order in
25			which they are listed under paragraph (c) of this subsection[providing and
26			replacing body armor and second priority to providing firearms and
27			ammunition, with residual funds available for the purchase of body-worn

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1		cameras, electronic control devices, electronic control weapons, or electro-		
2		muscular disruption technology].		
3	<u>(e)</u>	Body armor purchased by the department receiving grant funds shall meet or		
4		exceed the standards issued by the National Institute of Justice for body		
5		armor.		
6	<u>(f)</u>	No police or sheriff's department shall apply for a grant to replace existing		
7		body armor unless that body armor has been in actual use for a period of five		
8		(5) years or longer.		
9	<u>(g)</u>	Any department applying for grant funds for body-worn cameras shall develop		
10		a policy for their use and shall submit that policy with its application for the		
11		grant funds to the Office of Homeland Security as part of the application		
12		process.		
13	(5) The	Kentucky Office of Homeland Security may use five percent (5%) of firearms		
14	sales	s proceeds received from the Department of Kentucky State Police under		
15	<u>subs</u>	ection (1) of this section to cover departmental costs of administering the		
16	<u>Law</u>	Enforcement Protection Program.		
17	<u>(6)</u> [(5)]	The Department of Kentucky State Police may transfer a machine gun, short-		
18	barre	eled shotgun, short-barreled rifle, silencer, pistol with a shoulder stock, any		
19	othe	r weapon, or destructive device as defined by the National Firearms Act which		
20	is subject to registration under the National Firearms Act and is not properly			
21	regis	registered in the national firearms transfer records for those types of weapons, to the		
22	Bure	eau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms of the United States Department of		
23	Justi	ce, after a reasonable attempt has been made to transfer the firearm to an		
24	eligi	ble state or local law enforcement agency or to an eligible museum and no		
25	eligi	ble recipient will take the firearm or weapon. National Firearms Act firearms		
26	and	weapons which are properly registered and not returned to an innocent lawful		
27	own	er or retained for official use as provided in this section shall be sold to properly		

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licensed dealers under subsection (3) of this section.
