SEIZURES/SALES: Provides relative to the general exemptions of certain property from seizure

2	To amend and reenact R.S. $13:3881(A)(4)(c)$, to enact R.S. $13:3881(A)(4)(g)$, and to repeal
3	R.S. 13:3881(A)(2)(e), relative to exemptions from seizure; to provide a general
4	exemption from seizure for all firearms and firearm accessories not to exceed a
5	certain value; to repeal the exemption of one firearm of a certain value necessary for
6	the exercise of a trade, calling, or profession; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 13:3881(A)(4)(c) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S.
9	13:3881(A)(4)(g) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
10	§3881. General exemptions from seizure
11	A. The following income or property of a debtor is exempt from seizure
12	under any writ, mandate, or process whatsoever, except as otherwise herein
13	provided:

HB No. 145

Abstract: Exempts from seizure all firearms and firearm accessories, not exceeding a total value of \$2,500, owned by a debtor.

<u>Present law</u> provides general exemptions from seizure under any writ, mandate, or process for specified income or property of a debtor.

<u>Present law</u> includes the debtor's arms and military accoutrements in the list of properties exempt from seizure.

<u>Proposed law</u> specifies that all of the debtor's firearms, arms and ammunition, and accessories thereto, not exceeding a total maximum value of \$2,500, are exempt from seizure.

<u>Present law</u> provides an exemption from seizure of one firearm necessary for the exercise of a trade, calling, or profession with a maximum value of \$500.

Proposed law repeals present law.

1. Added provision exempting from seizure a total value of \$2,500 of all firearms, arms and ammunition, and accessories.
