1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. $13:5713(A)$ and $5715(A)$, R.S. $14:30(B)(1)$, and $95(H)$, and R.S.
3	17:2355.1, relative to coroners; to provide relative to duties; to provide relative to
4	duties regarding paupers; to include coroners as peace officers for certain purposes;
5	to provide for the carrying of concealed weapons by coroners; to provide relative to
6	the search and disclosure of records by coroners; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 13:5713(A) and 5715(A) are hereby amended and reenacted to read
9	as follows:
10	§5713. Duty to hold autopsies, investigations, etc.
11	A. The coroner shall either view the body or make an investigation into the
12	cause and manner of death in all cases involving the following:
13	(1) Suspicious, unexpected, or unusual deaths.
14	(2) Sudden or violent deaths.
15	(3) Deaths due to unknown or obscure causes or in any unusual manner.
16	(4) Bodies found dead.
17	(5) Deaths without an attending physician within thirty-six hours prior to the
18	hour of death.
19	(6) Deaths due to suspected suicide or homicide.
20	(7) (6) Deaths in which poison is suspected.
21	(8) (7) Any death from natural causes occurring in a hospital under twenty-
22	four hours of admission unless seen by a physician in the last thirty-six hours.
23	(9)(8) Deaths following an injury or accident either old or recent.
24	(10)(9) Deaths due to drowning, hanging, burns, electrocution, gunshot
25	wounds, stabs or cutting, lightning, starvation, radiation, exposure, alcoholism,
26	addiction, tetanus, strangulation, suffocation, or smothering.

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1	$\frac{(11)(10)}{(11)}$ Deaths due to trauma from whatever cause.
2	(12)(11) Deaths due to criminal means or by casualty.
3	(13)(12) Deaths in prison or while serving a sentence.
4	(14)(13) Deaths due to virulent contagious disease that might be caused by
5	or cause a public hazard, including acquired immune deficiency syndrome.

7	§5715. Delivery of body; burial disposition of paupers; anatomical gifts; kidney or
8	eye removal; limitation of liability
9	A.(1) Upon completion of an autopsy or completion of the coroner's
10	investigation, if the investigation reveals that an autopsy is not required, the coroner
11	shall release the body to the family or friends for burial.
12	(2) The coroner shall arrange for the burial disposition of paupers, preferably
13	by a Louisiana licensed funeral home. The burial disposition expenses shall not
14	exceed the actual cost of the service, and shall be paid by the parish or municipality
15	in which the death occurred. However, such expenses for patients or residents of any
16	state-operated health care or treatment facility shall not be paid by the parish or
17	municipality in which the death occurred, but shall be paid by the state. The state or
18	any municipality or parish may establish a maximum amount which it shall pay for
19	individual burial disposition expenses.

21	Section 2. R.S. 14:30(B)(1) and 95(H) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as
22	follows:
23	§30. First degree murder

25	B.(1) For the purposes of Paragraph (A)(2) of this Section, the term "peace
26	officer" means any peace officer, as defined in R.S. 40:2402, and includes any
27	constable, marshal, deputy marshal, sheriff, deputy sheriff, local or state policeman,
28	commissioned wildlife enforcement agent, federal law enforcement officer, jail or
29	prison guard, parole officer, probation officer, judge, attorney general, assistant
30	attorney general, attorney general's investigator, district attorney, assistant district

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1	attorney, or district attorney's investigator, coroner, deputy coroner, or coroner	
2	investigator.

6	H. The provisions of this Section shall not prohibit active justices or judges	
7	of the supreme court, courts of appeal, district courts, parish courts, juvenile courts,	
8	family courts, city courts, federal courts domiciled in the state of Louisiana, and	
9	traffic courts, constables, coroners, designated coroner investigators, district	
10	attorneys and designated assistant district attorneys, United States attorneys and	
11	assistant United States attorneys and investigators, and justices of the peace from	
12	possessing and concealing a handgun on their person when the justice or judge,	
13	constable, coroner, designated coroner investigators, district attorneys and	
14	designated assistant district attorneys, United States attorneys and assistant United	
15	States attorneys and investigators, or justices of the peace are certified by the	
16	Council on Peace Officer Standards and Training.

18	Section 3. R.S. 17:2355.1 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:	
19	§2355.1. Search for document of anatomical gift; notification	
20	A. The following persons shall make a reasonable search of a person	
21	reasonably believed to be near death for a document of gift or other information	
22	identifying the person as a donor or a person who has refused to make such a	
23	donation:	
24	(1) Any law enforcement officer, fireman, paramedic, or any other	
25	emergency rescuer assisting the person.	
26	(2) A coroner or his designee.	
27	(3) Any hospital, as soon as practical after the arrival of the person.	
28	B. Upon death of a person, a coroner or his designee shall make a	
29	reasonable search of that person for a document of gift or other information as	
30	a donor or a person who has refused to make such a donation.	

1 C. If a document of gift or refusal to make an anatomical gift is located in 2 accordance with this Section, and the person or decedent to whom the document is 3 related is taken to a hospital, the document of gift or refusal shall be sent to the 4 hospital. 5 C. D. A person shall not be subject to criminal or civil liability for failing to discharge the duties imposed by this Section but may be subject to administrative 6 7 sanctions.
