WEAPONS. Provides relative to the right of law-abiding citizens to carry concealed handguns lawfully without a permit. (8/1/24)

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 14:95(M) and R.S. 40:1379.3(I), relative to the illegal carrying
3	of weapons; to provide relative to exceptions; to make technical changes; and to
4	provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 14:95(M) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
7	§95. Illegal carrying of weapons

9	M. The provisions of Paragraph (A)(1)(a) of this Section shall not apply to
10	a resident of Louisiana if all of the following conditions are met:

12	Section 2. R.S. 40:1379.3(I) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
13	§1379.3. Statewide permits for concealed handguns; application procedures;
14	definitions
15	* * *
16	I.(1) No individual to whom a concealed handgun permit is issued or a person
17	carrying a weapon handgun pursuant to R.S. 14:95(M) may carry and conceal such

handgun while under the influence of alcohol or a controlled dangerous substance. While a permittee is under the influence of alcohol or a controlled dangerous substance, an otherwise lawful permit is considered automatically suspended and is not valid. A permittee shall be considered under the influence as evidenced by a blood alcohol reading of .05 percent or greater by weight of alcohol in the blood, or when a blood test or urine test shows any confirmed presence of a controlled dangerous substance as defined in R.S. 40:961 and 964.

<u>Proposed law</u> makes technical changes and otherwise retains <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> provides relative to statewide permits for concealed handguns and restricts permit holders from being under the influence of alcohol or a controlled dangerous substance

<u>Proposed law</u> changes a <u>present law</u> reference <u>from</u> "weapon" <u>to</u> "handgun" and otherwise retains <u>present law</u>.

Effective August 1, 2024.
