AMENDMENT NO. 1

In the House Judiciary Committee Amendment (HB1302/822614/1), on page 1, in line 19, after the semicolon insert "<u>requiring a law enforcement officer to transport a</u> <u>respondent to an emergency facility; requiring a physician to evaluate a respondent and</u> <u>to make a certain determination; requiring the court within a certain time frame to</u> <u>consider certain information and to make a certain determination before confirming and</u> <u>issuing a certain order;</u>".

AMENDMENT NO. 2

In the House Judiciary Committee Amendment, on page 11, in line 14, strike "<u>A</u> <u>PREPONDERANCE OF THE</u>" and substitute "<u>CLEAR AND CONVINCING</u>".

AMENDMENT NO. 3

In the House Judiciary Committee Amendment, on page 12, in line 6, strike "EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A" and substitute "<u>A</u>"; and strike beginning with "<u>A</u>" in line 15 down through "(3)" in line 21.

In the House Judiciary Committee Amendment, on page 13, in line 1, after "(1)" insert "WHEN A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER SERVES THE TEMPORARY EXTREME RISK PREVENTION ORDER ON THE RESPONDENT, THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER SHALL TAKE THE RESPONDENT TO THE NEAREST EMERGENCY FACILITY.

(2) IF THE TEMPORARY EXTREME RISK PREVENTION ORDER IS EXECUTED PROPERLY, THE EMERGENCY FACILITY SHALL ACCEPT THE RESPONDENT.

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(3) <u>A PHYSICIAN SHALL EVALUATE THE RESPONDENT AFTER THE</u> <u>RESPONDENT'S ADMISSION TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE RESPONDENT POSES</u> <u>AN IMMEDIATE AND PRESENT DANGER OF CAUSING PERSONAL INJURY TO THE</u> RESPONDENT, THE PETITIONER, OR ANOTHER BY POSSESSING A FIREARM.

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(4) WITHIN 48 HOURS AFTER THE RESPONDENT'S ADMISSION TO THE EMERGENCY FACILITY OR, IF THE COURT IS CLOSED, ON THE DAY ON WHICH THE COURT REOPENS, THE RESPONDENT AND, IF THE RESPONDENT REQUESTS, THE RESPONDENT'S ATTORNEY SHALL BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE JUDGE WHO ISSUED THE TEMPORARY ORDER.

(5) THE JUDGE SHALL:

(I) <u>CONSIDER THE PHYSICIAN'S EVALUATION OF THE</u> <u>RESPONDENT OF WHETHER THE RESPONDENT POSES AN IMMEDIATE AND</u> <u>PRESENT DANGER OF CAUSING PERSONAL INJURY TO THE RESPONDENT, THE</u> <u>PETITIONER, OR ANOTHER BY POSSESSING A FIREARM; AND</u>

(II) RECONFIRM THE TEMPORARY ORDER AND ISSUE AN ORDER FOR THE REMOVAL OF ANY FIREARMS THAT ARE ACCESSIBLE TO THE RESPONDENT IF AFTER REVIEWING THE PHYSICIAN'S EVALUATION THE JUDGE FINDS BY CLEAR AND CONVINCING EVIDENCE THAT:

1. THERE ARE REASONABLE GROUNDS TO BELIEVE THAT THE RESPONDENT POSES AN IMMEDIATE AND PRESENT DANGER OF CAUSING PERSONAL INJURY TO THE RESPONDENT, THE PETITIONER, OR ANOTHER BY POSSESSING A FIREARM; AND HB1302/293929/1 Amendments to HB 1302 Page 3 of 3

2. <u>A TEMPORARY EXTREME RISK PREVENTION</u> ORDER IS NECESSARY TO PREVENT PERSONAL INJURY TO THE RESPONDENT, THE PETITIONER, OR ANOTHER.
