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Protective Orders - Relief - Transfer of Wireless Telephone Service

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the court, in a temporary protective order or a final 4 protective order, to order a wireless telephone service provider to transfer to a person 5 eligible for relief the billing responsibility for and the right to continue the use of a 6 certain telephone number under certain circumstances; requiring the court to serve 7 a certain order on a wireless telephone service provider's resident agent; requiring a 8 wireless telephone service provider to comply with a certain order within a certain 9 time frame unless the wireless telephone service provider provides certain notice; 10 requiring a certain order to include certain information; providing that a certain 11 order terminates the respondent's financial responsibility for and use of a certain 12 telephone number; prohibiting a wireless telephone service provider from charging 13 a person eligible for relief a certain fee; establishing that a wireless telephone service provider's standard requirements for establishing an account and transferring a 14 15 telephone number apply to a transfer required under this Act; providing that a 16 wireless telephone service provider is immune from civil liability for complying with 17 a certain order; and generally relating to protective orders and wireless telephone 18 service.
