Public Safety - Handgun Permits - Expiration and Renewal Periods for Retired Law Enforcement Officer

FOR the purpose of establishing alternative expiration and renewal periods for a handgun permit issued to a certain retired law enforcement officer; and generally relating to

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 19 Article Public Safety
- 20 5-301.
- 21 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

(c) "Permit" means a permit issued by the Secretary to carry, wear, or transporta handgun.

2 (b) (1) Subject to subsections (c) and (d) of this section, the Secretary may 3 charge a nonrefundable fee payable when an application is filed for a permit.

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(d) The Secretary may not charge a fee under subsection (b) of this section to:

5 (2) a retired law enforcement officer of the State or a county or municipal 6 corporation of the State.

7 5-309.

8 (a) Except as provided in [subsection] SUBSECTIONS (d) AND (E) of this section, 9 a permit expires on the last day of the holder's birth month following 2 years after the date 10 the permit is issued.

11 (b) [Subject] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION 12 AND SUBJECT to subsection (c) of this section, a permit may be renewed for successive 13 periods of 3 years each if, at the time of an application for renewal, the applicant possesses 14 the qualifications for the issuance of a permit and pays the renewal fee stated in this 15 subtitle.

16 (c) A person who applies for a renewal of a permit is not required to be 17 fingerprinted unless the Secretary requires a set of the person's fingerprints to resolve a 18 question of the person's identity.

19 (d) The Secretary may establish an alternative expiration date for a permit to 20 coincide with the expiration of a license, certification, or commission for:

21 (1) a private detective under Title 13 of the Business Occupations and 22 Professions Article;

23 (2) a security guard under Title 19 of the Business Occupations and 24 Professions Article; or

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(3) a special police officer under § 3–306 of this article.

(E) A PERMIT ISSUED TO A RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER WHO RETIRED IN GOOD STANDING FROM SERVICE WITH A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY OF THE STATE OR A COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE:

- 29(1) EXPIRES ON THE LAST DAY OF THE HOLDER'S BIRTH MONTH30FOLLOWING 5 YEARS AFTER THE DATE THE PERMIT IS ISSUED; AND
- 31 (2) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, MAY BE RENEWED

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1 FOR SUCCESSIVE PERIODS OF 5 YEARS EACH IF, AT THE TIME OF AN APPLICATION

2 FOR RENEWAL, THE APPLICANT POSSESSES THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE 3 ISSUANCE OF A PERMIT.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2025.
