A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Fee, Surcharge, and Tax Reduction Act of 2016**

3 FOR the purpose of repealing a requirement that the Public Service Commission impose a
4 certain environmental surcharge; altering certain application and renewal fees for
5 certain licenses issued by the Maryland Home Improvement Commission; altering
6 the fee that the State Court Administrator is required to charge for the special
7 admission of an out-of-state attorney; repealing a requirement that the State Court
8 Administrator pay a certain portion of a certain fee to a certain program; altering
9 certain fees for certified copies of certain certificates; altering the portion of certain
10 fees collected by local health departments required to be transferred to the General
11 Fund; altering the distribution of certain proceeds from the sale of certain
12 allowances; repealing the requirement that the Public Service Commission establish
13 the amount of a certain surcharge; repealing a requirement that the Secretary of
14 Natural Resources take certain actions in consultation with the Director of the
15 Maryland Energy Administration; repealing a requirement that the Maryland
16 Energy Administration receive certain administrative and fiscal support from a
17 certain fund; providing the sales and use tax does not apply to certain sales in the
18 form of a certain demurrage charge; altering a certain fee that certain vehicle owners
19 are required to pay for the original and renewal application of certain special
20 registrations; repealing the application and renewal fee for a certain handgun
21 qualification license; altering certain fees for registering certain weight and
22 measures used for certain commercial purposes; altering a certain fee related to
23 certain wetlands and waterways authorizations; altering the annual license fees for
24 certain fishing licenses; making conforming changes; providing for the delayed
25 effective date for certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to altering
26 certain fees, surcharges, and taxes and distribution of certain revenue.

31 That Section 7–203 of Article – Public Utilities of the Annotated Code of Maryland be
32 repealed.

33 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read
34 as follows:

37 (a) (1) An applicant for a license shall:

1 (i) submit to the Commission an application on the form that the
2 Commission provides;

3 (ii) submit to the Commission with the license application proof of
4 compliance with the insurance requirement of § 8–302.1 of this subtitle, if the applicant is
5 applying for a contractor license;

6 (iii) pay into the Fund the fee required under § 8–404(a) of this title,
7 if the applicant is applying for a contractor license; and

8 (iv) pay to the Commission an application fee.

9 (2) The application fee:

10 (i) for a contractor license is ~~[\$250]~~ **\$225** for each place of business
11 of the contractor;

12 (ii) for a subcontractor license is ~~[\$150]~~ **\$125**; or

22 3. For a report that a search of the birth or death certificate
23 files was made and the requested record is not on file; or

24 4. For each change to a birth or death certificate made later
25 than 1 year after the certificate has been registered with the Department; and

26 (3) (i) Any local health department may set and collect a fee for
27 processing and issuing a birth certificate, or for a report that a search of the files was made
28 and the requested record is not on file, that covers:

- 1 1. The administrative costs of providing this service; and

10 birth certificate or for a report under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph, the local health
11 department shall enter into a memorandum of understanding with the Department of
12 Health and Mental Hygiene that outlines the local health department's fee structure.

15 (g) (1) In this subsection, “allowance” means one ton of carbon dioxide that
16 may be bought, sold, traded, or banked for use under the Regional Greenhouse Gas
17 Initiative.

18 (2) Not later than June 30, 2007, the Governor shall include the State as a
19 full participant in the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative among Mid–Atlantic and
20 Northeast states.

21 (3) The State may withdraw from the Initiative, as provided in the
22 December 20, 2005 memorandum of understanding of the Initiative, at any time after
23 January 1, 2009.

24 (4) If the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative expires and there is a
25 successor organization with the same purposes and goals, the Governor is encouraged to
26 join the State in the successor organization.

27 (5) Notwithstanding § 2–107 of this title, all of the proceeds from the sale
28 of Maryland allowances under the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative shall be deposited
29 in the Maryland Strategic Energy Investment Fund under § 9–20B–05 of the State
30 Government Article, **EXCEPT THAT UP TO \$10,000,000 ANNUALLY SHALL BE**
31 **DEPOSITED DIRECTLY INTO THE ENVIRONMENTAL TRUST FUND ESTABLISHED**
32 **UNDER TITLE 3, SUBTITLE 3 OF THE NATURAL RESOURCES ARTICLE TO MEET THE**
33 **BUDGETARY NEEDS OF THE POWER PLANT RESEARCH PROGRAM.**

1 (6) If the State's participation in the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative
2 ceases for any reason, the Governor shall report to the General Assembly, in accordance
3 with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, regarding:

4 (i) Why participation ceased; and

5 (ii) A plan to reduce carbon dioxide emissions from power plants in
6 the State that considers the use of Maryland grown, native, warm season grasses as a
7 possible method of reducing carbon emissions.

10 (a) (1) There is an Environmental Trust Fund.

11 [(2) For the purpose of this subtitle, there is established as an added cost of
12 electricity distributed to retail electric customers within the State, an environmental
13 surcharge per kilowatt hour of electric energy distributed in the State to be paid by any
14 electric company as defined in § 1-101 of the Public Utilities Article. The Public Service
15 Commission shall impose the surcharge per kilowatt hour of electric energy distributed to
16 retail electric customers within the State and shall authorize the electric companies to add
17 the full amount of the surcharge to retail electric customers' bills. To the extent that the
18 surcharge is not collected from retail electric customers, the surcharge shall be deemed a
19 cost of distribution and shall be allowed and computed as such, together with other
20 allowable expenses, for rate-making purposes. Revenues from the surcharge shall be
21 collected by the Comptroller and placed in the Fund.]

22 **(2) THE FUND CONSISTS OF PROCEEDS RECEIVED FROM THE SALE OF**
23 **ALLOWANCES FROM THE REGIONAL GREENHOUSE GAS INITIATIVE IN**
24 **ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1002(G) OF THE ENVIRONMENT ARTICLE.**

25 [(b) (1) The Secretary, in consultation with the Director of the Maryland
26 Energy Administration, annually shall coordinate the preparation of a budget required to
27 carry out the provisions of this subtitle. Upon approval of the budget by the General
28 Assembly, the Public Service Commission shall establish the amount of the surcharge per
29 kilowatt hour for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1972, and for each subsequent fiscal year.

30 (2) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this subtitle, the amount of the
31 surcharge for each account for each retail electric customer may not exceed the lesser of
32 0.15 mill per kilowatt hour or \$1,000 per month and the surcharge may not continue beyond
33 fiscal year 2020.

34 (3) The Comptroller shall maintain the method of collection of the
35 surcharge from the companies and the collections shall accrue to the Fund. The Department
36 shall credit against the amount required to be paid into the Environmental Trust Fund by

1 each electric company an amount equal to 0.75% of the total surcharge attributed to each
2 company on the basis of the electricity distributed within Maryland.]

3 **(B) THE SECRETARY ANNUALLY SHALL COORDINATE THE PREPARATION OF**
4 **A BUDGET REQUIRED TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE.**

5 (c) (1) (i) The Secretary shall administer the Fund.

6 (ii) The Fund is subject to the provisions for financial management
7 and budgeting established by the Department of Budget and Management.

8 (iii) Any investment earnings of the Fund shall be credited to the
9 General Fund of the State.

10 (iv) The Fund is a special, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to §
11 7–302 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

12 (v) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the
13 moneys in the Fund shall be used to carry out the provisions of this subtitle as provided for
14 in the budget.

15 (vi) For the purposes of this subtitle, the Secretary[, in consultation
16 with the Director of the Maryland Energy Administration,] may execute appropriate
17 contracts with any State or federal agency, research organization, industry, or academic
18 institution to conduct the necessary research, construct or acquire, or both, real property
19 including physical predictive models, laboratories, buildings, land, and appurtenances, or
20 support the technological development of extraordinary systems related to power plants
21 designed to minimize environmental impact.

22 (vii) The Secretary may utilize available expertise in any other State
23 unit in the development, execution, and management of contracts and agreements on
24 projects relating to their areas of prime responsibility.

25 (2) Moneys in the Fund may be used for administrative costs calculated in
26 accordance with § 1–103(b)(2) of this article.

27 (d) [(1) The Maryland Energy Administration shall receive administrative and
28 fiscal support from the Fund for studies relating to the conservation or production of electric
29 energy.

30 (2) Fiscal support to the Maryland Energy Administration from the Fund
31 may not exceed \$250,000 in any fiscal year.

32 (3) The Chesapeake Bay Trust shall receive \$375,000 from the Fund each
33 fiscal year for the purpose of funding energy conservation projects through the Chesapeake
34 Conservation Corps Program, as provided under §§ 8–1913 through 8–1924 of this article.

1 (e) The Legislative Auditor shall conduct post audits of a fiscal and compliance
2 nature of the Fund and of the appropriations and expenditures made for the purposes of
3 this subtitle. The cost of the fiscal portion of the post audit examinations shall be an
4 operating cost of the Fund.

7 (a) There is a Maryland Strategic Energy Investment Fund.

8 (b) The purpose of the Fund is to implement the Strategic Energy Investment
9 Program.

10 (c) The Administration shall administer the Fund.

11 (d) (1) The Fund is a special, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to § 7–302 of
12 the State Finance and Procurement Article.

13 (2) The Treasurer shall hold the Fund separately and the Comptroller shall
14 account for the Fund.

15 (e) The Fund consists of:

16 (1) all of the proceeds from the sale of allowances under § 2–1002(g) of the
17 Environment Article, **EXCEPT FOR PROCEEDS DIRECTED TO THE ENVIRONMENTAL**
18 **TRUST ESTABLISHED UNDER TITLE 3, SUBTITLE 3 OF THE NATURAL RESOURCES**
19 **ARTICLE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1002(G) OF THE ENVIRONMENT ARTICLE;**

20 (2) money appropriated in the State budget to the Program;

21 (3) repayments and prepayments of principal and interest on loans made
22 from the Fund;

23 (4) interest and investment earnings on the Fund;

24 (5) compliance fees paid under § 7–705 of the Public Utilities Article;

25 (6) money received from any public or private source for the benefit of the
26 Fund; and

27 (7) money transferred from the Public Service Commission under §
28 7–207.2(c)(3) of the Public Utilities Article.

7 (a) (1) The owner of any vehicle described in paragraph (2) of this subsection
8 may apply to the Administration for the assignment to that vehicle of a special,
9 personalized registration number.

10 (2) This section applies only as to:

- 11 (i) A Class A (passenger) vehicle;
- 12 (ii) A Class D (motorcycle) vehicle;
- 13 (iii) A Class E (truck) vehicle with a one ton or less manufacturer's
14 rated capacity;
- 15 (iv) A Class G (nonfreight trailer) vehicle;
- 16 (v) A Class L (historic) vehicle;
- 17 (vi) A Class M (multipurpose) vehicle; or
- 18 (vii) A Class N (street rod) vehicle.

23 of any combination of not more than 7 letters and numerals.

24 (2) In its discretion, the Administration may refuse any combination of
25 letters and numerals.

26 (d) The proceeds collected annually from the additional fees charged under this
27 section shall be distributed to the Transportation Trust Fund.

1 (g) An applicant for a handgun qualification license shall submit to the Secretary:

2 (1) an application in the manner and format designated by the Secretary;

3 (2) [a nonrefundable application fee to cover the costs to administer the
4 program of up to \$50;

5 (3)] (i) proof of satisfactory completion of:

6 1. a firearms safety training course approved by the
7 Secretary; or

8 2. a course of instruction in competency and safety in the
9 handling of firearms prescribed by the Department of Natural Resources under § 10–301.1

1 (b) (1) Except as provided under paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, all
2 applications for wetlands and waterways authorizations issued by the Department under
3 §§ 5-503 and 5-906 of this title and §§ 16-202, 16-302, and 16-307 of this article or
4 wetlands licenses issued by the Board of Public Works under § 16-202 of this article shall
5 be accompanied by an application fee as follows:

21 game and freshwater fish and preventing unauthorized persons from fishing or attempting
22 to fish for any game and freshwater fish without first procuring an angler’s license.

18 (a) (1) Except as provided in subsections (c) and (d) of this section and § 4–217
19 of this title, a person may not fish for finfish in the Chesapeake Bay or in its tributaries up
20 to tidal boundaries or in State waters of the Atlantic Ocean and the Atlantic coastal bays
21 and their tributaries without first obtaining a Chesapeake Bay and coastal sport fishing
22 license or registration issued under subsection (d)(3) of this section and possessing evidence
23 of the license or registration.

24 (2) The license may be obtained from the Department or from any
25 authorized agent of the Department. The following annual license fees shall apply:

4 (3) Except as provided in subsection (d)(1) of this section, every
5 Chesapeake Bay and coastal sport fishing license and registration shall be valid for 1 year

7 (4) An applicant for a license issued under this section shall provide all the
8 information requested by the Department on forms issued by the Department.

9 (d) (1) The Department may provide by regulation for issuance of a special
10 charter boat license that shall be effective for not more than 1 year and shall expire on
11 August 31 and that would be valid for all individuals on a charter boat operated by a
12 licensed fishing guide in tidal waters of the State. The fee shall be:

13 (i) For 6 fishermen or less..... \$240.

15 (2) (i) The Department may provide by regulation for issuance of an
16 annual special Chesapeake Bay and coastal sport fishing license, which when permanently
