1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Safety – Distribution of Literature to Purchasers of Firearms and**
3 **Ammunition**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Health to prepare certain
5 literature relating to firearms and ammunition and to distribute the literature to all
6 county health departments in the State; requiring each county health department to
7 distribute certain literature to all establishments that sell firearms or ammunition
8 within the county; requiring establishments that sell firearms or ammunition in the
9 State to make certain literature visible and available and to distribute the literature
10 to purchasers of firearms or ammunition; requiring a county health department to
11 authorize a certain representative who may issue citations to owners of
12 establishments who violate this Act; and generally relating to the distribution of
13 literature to purchasers of firearms and ammunition.

15 Article – Public Safety
16 Section 5–901 and 5–902 to be under the new subtitle “Subtitle 9. Distribution of
17 Literature to Purchasers of Firearms and Ammunition”
18 Annotated Code of Maryland
19 (2022 Replacement Volume and 2025 Supplement)

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
21 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

22 **Article – Public Safety**

2 (c) (1) EACH COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT SHALL AUTHORIZE A
3 REPRESENTATIVE OF THE COUNTY'S HEALTH DEPARTMENT WHO MAY ISSUE A
4 CITATION TO AN OWNER OF AN ESTABLISHMENT WITHIN THE COUNTY'S
5 JURISDICTION THAT VIOLATES THIS SECTION.

6 (2) (i) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO:

7 1. FOR A FIRST VIOLATION, A CIVIL PENALTY NOT
8 EXCEEDING \$500; AND

9 2. FOR A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT VIOLATION, A CIVIL
10 PENALTY NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000.

11 (ii) A CIVIL PENALTY IMPOSED UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL
12 BE PAID TO THE COUNTY THAT ISSUED THE CITATION UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF
13 THIS SUBSECTION.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
15 October 1, 2026.
