## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act to ensure courthouse security.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 70A of chapter 221 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting at the end thereof the following sentence:-
- 3 "Pursuant to said police powers, court officers may carry within the premises of the court
- 4 or in the immediate vicinity thereof such weapons as the chief justice of the trial court, the chief
- 5 justice of the supreme judicial court or the chief justice of the appeals court shall determine
- 6 necessary. Provided, however, that, prior to being permitted to carry a firearm within a
- 7 courthouse, a court officer shall have a license to carry pursuant to section 131 of chapter 140 or
- 8 section 131F of chapter 140."
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 70A of chapter 221 of the General Laws is hereby further amended
- by striking, in lines 3-4, the words "the areas of the court to which they have been assigned;" and
- inserting in place thereof the following words:
- "the premises of the court or in the immediate vicinity thereof"
