By Ms. Tyler of Boston, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3780) of Chynah Tyler and others relative to the purchase of firearms. Public Safety and Homeland Security.

The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to firearm purchases.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Chapter 140 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 122D the following section:

 Section 122E. (a) No person shall purchase more than 1 firearm within any 30-day period.
- 5 (b) This section shall not apply to any of the following:-
- 6 (1) a law enforcement agency;
- 7 (2) an agency duly authorized to perform law enforcement duties;
- 8 (3) a state or county correctional facility;
- 9 (4) a private security company licensed to do business in Massachusetts;

(5) a person who is properly identified as a full-time paid peace officer, and who is 11 authorized to, and does carry a firearm during the course and scope of employment as a peace 12 officer: 13 (6) a person who may claim an exemption from the waiting period; 14 (7) purchases by a licensee under section 122; 15 (8) a person who is licensed as a collector; 16 (10) the exchange of a firearm where a licensee under section 122 purchased that firearm 17 from the person seeking the exchange within the 30-day period immediately preceding the date 18 of exchange or replacement; 19 (11) the replacement of a firearm when the person's firearm was lost or stolen, and the 20 person reported that firearm lost or stolen prior to the completion of the application to purchase 21 to any local law enforcement agency of the city or town in which the person resides; or 22 (12) the return of any firearm to its owner. 23 (c) A licensee under section 122 shall conspicuously post at each purchase counter the

28 (d) A licensee who violates any provision of this section shall be deemed to have violated 29 this section for the purposes of section 125 and the licensing authority shall issue a notice to the

following warning in bold type not less than 1 inch in height: "IT IS UNLAWFUL TO

rifle, shotgun or machine gun in bold type not less than one-quarter inch in height.

PURCHASE MORE THAN ONE FIREARM WITHIN A 30 DAY PERIOD.", and that such

licensee shall provide said warning, in writing, to the purchaser or transferee of any firearm,

- licensee pursuant to said section 125 that after a hearing on this violation, the licensing authority
 may declare the licensee's license forfeited or suspended pursuant to said section 125.
- 32 (e) Whoever purchases a firearm in violation of this section shall for the first offense be 33 punished by a fine of not less than \$500 or more than \$1,000 and for any subsequent offense by 34 imprisonment in the state prison for not more than 10 years.
