In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)

An Act prohibiting gunfire directed at dwelling houses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 269 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby amended by inserting after section 12 F the following section:-

Section 12G. Whoever discharges an assault weapon, firearm, large capacity weapon, machine gun, rifle, sawed-off shotgun, or shotgun, as defined in section one hundred twenty-one of chapter one hundred forty, with the intent to strike a dwelling, and as a result does strike a dwelling, shall be punished by imprisonment in the house of correction for not more than $21 / 2$ years, or in state prison for not more than 5 years, or by a fine of not more than $\$ 10,000$, or both such imprisonment and fine.
