1.8	toward another:
1.9	(1) an unoccupied motor vehicle or a building is guilty of a felony and may be sentenced
1.10	to imprisonment for not more than three years or to payment of a fine of not more than
1.11	\$6,000, or both. ;
1.12	(2) a motor vehicle or building that was occupied; or
1.13	(3) another person.
1.14	(b) Any person who violates this subdivision by firing at or toward a person, or an
