AN ACT

To repeal section 571.070, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the unlawful possession of firearms, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 571.070, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 571.070, to read as follows:

571.070. 1. A person commits the offense of unlawful possession of a

- 2 firearm if such person knowingly has any firearm in his or her possession and:
- 3 (1) Such person has been convicted of a felony under the laws of this

state, or of a crime under the laws of any state or of the United States which, if

- 5 committed within this state, would be a felony, or has been convicted in any
- 6 court of a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence; [or]
- 7 (2) Such person is a fugitive from justice, is habitually in an intoxicated
- 8 or drugged condition, or is currently adjudged mentally incompetent, is illegally
- 9 or unlawfully in the United States, or having been a citizen of the
- 10 United States, has renounced United States citizenship; or
- 11 (3) Such person is subject to a court order that:
- 12 (a) Was issued after a hearing of which such person received
- 13 actual notice, and at which such person had an opportunity to
- 14 participate;
- 15 (b) Restrains such person from harassing, stalking, or
- 16 threatening a petitioner, as defined in subdivision (11) of section
- 7 455.010, or a child of such petitioner, or engaging in other conduct that
- 8 would place such petitioner in reasonable fear of bodily injury to the
- 19 petitioner or child; and

- a. Includes a finding that such person represents a credible threat to the physical safety of such petitioner or child; or
- b. By its terms explicitly prohibits the use, attempted use, or threatened use of physical force against such petitioner or child that would reasonably be expected to cause bodily injury.
 - 2. Unlawful possession of a firearm is a class D felony.
- 3. The provisions of subdivision (1) of subsection 1 of this section shall not apply to the possession of an antique firearm.
