AN ACT

To repeal section 571.010, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to firearm offenses.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 571.010, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 571.010, to read as follows:

- 571.010. As used in this chapter, the following terms [shall] mean:
- 2 (1) "Antique[, curio or relic] firearm", any firearm [so defined by the National Gun
 3 Control Act, 18] that qualifies as an "antique firearm" under 26 U.S.C. [Title 26,] Section
 4 5845[, and the United States Treasury/Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms,] or as an
 5 "antique firearm" or "curios or relics" under 27 CFR Section [178.11:

6 (a) "Antique firearm" is any firearm not designed or redesigned for using rim fire or
7 conventional center fire ignition with fixed ammunition and manufactured in or before 1898, said
8 ammunition not being manufactured any longer; this includes any matchlock, wheel lock,
9 flintlock, percussion cap or similar type ignition system, or replica thereof;

(b) "Curio or relic firearm" is any firearm deriving value as a collectible weapon due to
 its unique design, ignition system, operation or at least fifty years old, associated with a historical
 event, renown personage or major war] 478.11;

(2) "Blackjack", any instrument that is designed or adapted for the purpose of stunningor inflicting physical injury by striking a person, and which is readily capable of lethal use;

15 (3) "Blasting agent", any material or mixture, consisting of fuel and oxidizer that is 16 intended for blasting, but not otherwise defined as an explosive under this section, provided that

19 (4) "Concealable firearm", any firearm with a barrel less than sixteen inches in length, 20 measured from the face of the bolt or standing breech;

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(5) "Deface", to alter or destroy the manufacturer's or importer's serial number or any 22 other distinguishing number or identification mark;

23 (6) "Detonator", any device containing a detonating charge that is used for initiating 24 detonation in an explosive, including but not limited to, electric blasting caps of instantaneous 25 and delay types, nonelectric blasting caps for use with safety fuse or shock tube and detonating 26 cord delay connectors;

27 (7) "Explosive weapon", any explosive, incendiary, or poison gas bomb or similar device 28 designed or adapted for the purpose of inflicting death, serious physical injury, or substantial 29 property damage; or any device designed or adapted for delivering or shooting such a weapon. 30 For the purposes of this subdivision, the term "explosive" shall mean any chemical compound 31 mixture or device, the primary or common purpose of which is to function by explosion, 32 including but not limited to, dynamite and other high explosives, pellet powder, initiating 33 explosives, detonators, safety fuses, squibs, detonating cords, igniter cords, and igniters or 34 blasting agents;

35 (8) "Firearm", any weapon that is designed or adapted to expel a projectile by the action 36 of an explosive;

37 (9) "Firearm silencer", any instrument, attachment, or appliance that is designed or 38 adapted to muffle the noise made by the firing of any firearm;

39 "Fugitive" or "fugitive from justice", any person who flees from law (10)40 enforcement or from the jurisdiction of a court to avoid being charged or prosecuted for 41 a crime or to avoid giving testimony in a criminal proceeding. "Fugitive" shall include any 42 person who is convicted of a crime and flees to avoid case disposition and any person who 43 has an arrest warrant for failure to appear in court;

44 (11) "Gas gun", any gas ejection device, weapon, cartridge, container or contrivance 45 other than a gas bomb that is designed or adapted for the purpose of ejecting any poison gas that 46 will cause death or serious physical injury, but not any device that ejects a repellant or temporary 47 incapacitating substance;

48 [(11)] (12) "Intoxicated", substantially impaired mental or physical capacity resulting 49 from introduction of any substance into the body;

50 [(12)] (13) "Knife", any dagger, dirk, stiletto, or bladed hand instrument that is readily 51 capable of inflicting serious physical injury or death by cutting or stabbing a person. For HB 234

52 purposes of this chapter, "knife" does not include any ordinary pocketknife with no blade more 53 than four inches in length;

54 [(13)] (14) "Knuckles", any instrument that consists of finger rings or guards made of 55 a hard substance that is designed or adapted for the purpose of inflicting serious physical injury 56 or death by striking a person with a fist enclosed in the knuckles;

57 [(14)] (15) "Machine gun", any firearm that is capable of firing more than one shot 58 automatically, without manual reloading, by a single function of the trigger;

59 [(15)] (16) "Projectile weapon", any bow, crossbow, pellet gun, slingshot or other 60 weapon that is not a firearm, which is capable of expelling a projectile that could inflict serious 61 physical injury or death by striking or piercing a person;

62 [(16)] (17) "Rifle", any firearm designed or adapted to be fired from the shoulder and to 63 use the energy of the explosive in a fixed metallic cartridge to fire a projectile through a rifled 64 bore by a single function of the trigger;

65 [(17)] (18) "Short barrel", a barrel length of less than sixteen inches for a rifle and 66 eighteen inches for a shotgun, both measured from the face of the bolt or standing breech, or an 67 overall rifle or shotgun length of less than twenty-six inches;

68 [(18)] (19) "Shotgun", any firearm designed or adapted to be fired from the shoulder and 69 to use the energy of the explosive in a fixed shotgun shell to fire a number of shot or a single 70 projectile through a smooth bore barrel by a single function of the trigger;

[(19)] (20) "Spring gun", any fused, timed or nonmanually controlled trap or device
 designed or adapted to set off an explosion for the purpose of inflicting serious physical injury
 or death;

74 [(20)] (21) "Switchblade knife", any knife which has a blade that folds or closes into the
 75 handle or sheath, and:

(a) That opens automatically by pressure applied to a button or other device located onthe handle; or

(b) That opens or releases from the handle or sheath by the force of gravity or by theapplication of centrifugal force.

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
