## **AN ACT**

To amend chapter 571, RSMo, by adding thereto two new sections relating to the offense of community endangerment due to unsafe storage of a firearm, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 571, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto

- 2 two new sections, to be known as sections 571.400 and 571.401,
- 3 to read as follows:
  - 571.400. 1. As used in this section an "unauthorized
- 2 person" is a person who is prohibited from possessing a
- 3 firearm under state or federal law.
- 4 2. A person commits the offense of community
- 5 endangerment due to unsafe storage of a firearm in the first
- 6 degree if a person stores or leaves a firearm in a location
- 7 where the person knows or reasonably should know that an
- 8 unauthorized person may gain access to the firearm and such
- 9 unauthorized person causes personal injury or death with the
- 10 firearm.
- 11 3. The offense of community endangerment due to unsafe
- 12 storage of a firearm in the first degree is a class C felony.
- 4. It shall not be a violation of this section if:
- 14 (1) The firearm is stored in a secure gun storage, or
- 15 other secured storage with a trigger lock or similar device
- 16 that is designed to prevent the unauthorized use or
- 17 discharge of the firearm;

- 18 (2) The unauthorized person is a minor who has the
  19 permission of a parent or guardian to possess the firearm
  20 and is supervised by a person eighteen years of age or older;
- 21 (3) The unauthorized person obtains or discharges the 22 firearm in a lawful act of self-defense pursuant to chapter 23 563; or
- 24 (4) The unauthorized person obtained the firearm as a 25 result of an unlawful entry and such unlawful entry is 26 reported to a law enforcement agency within five days of the 27 time he or she knew or reasonably should have known that the 28 firearm had been taken.
- 571.401. 1. As used in this section an "unauthorized person" is a person who is prohibited from possessing a firearm under state or federal law.
- 2. A person commits the offense of community
  endangerment due to unsafe storage of a firearm in the
  second degree if a person stores or leaves a firearm in a
  location where the person knows or reasonably should know
  that an unauthorized person may gain access to the firearm
  and such unauthorized person:
  - (1) Causes the firearm to discharge;

- (2) Carries, exhibits, or displays the firearm in a public place in a manner that is intended to intimidate another or that warrants alarm for the safety of other persons; or
- 15 (3) Uses the firearm in the commission of a crime.
- 3. The offense of community endangerment due to unsafe storage of a firearm in the second degree is a class D felony.
- 4. It shall not be a violation of this section if:
- 20 (1) The firearm is stored in a secure gun storage, or 21 other secured storage with a trigger lock or similar device

22 that is designed to prevent the unauthorized use or 23 discharge of the firearm;

- (2) The unauthorized person is a minor who has the permission of a parent or guardian to possess the firearm and is supervised by a person eighteen years of age or older;
- 27 (3) The unauthorized person obtains or discharges the 28 firearm in a lawful act of self-defense pursuant to chapter 29 563; or
- 30 (4) The unauthorized person obtains the firearm as a 31 result of an unlawful entry and such unlawful entry is 32 reported to a law enforcement agency within five days of the 33 time he or she knew or reasonably should have known that the 34 firearm had been taken.
