AN ACT

To repeal sections 571.030, 571.107, 571.215, 577.703, and 577.712, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof five new sections relating to firearms, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 571.030, 571.107, 571.215, 577.703, and 577.712, RSMo, are
2 repealed and five new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 571.030, 571.107,
3 571.215, 577.703, and 577.712, to read as follows:

571.030. 1. A person commits the offense of unlawful use of weapons~~[, except as~~
2 ~~otherwise provided by sections 571.101 to 571.121,]~~ if he or she knowingly:

3 (1) Carries concealed upon or about his or her person a knife, a firearm, a blackjack, or
4 any other weapon readily capable of lethal use:

5 **(a) Into any public higher education institution or public elementary or secondary**
6 **school facility without the consent of the governing body of the higher education institution**
7 **or a school official or the district school board, unless the person is a teacher or**
8 **administrator of an elementary or secondary school who has been designated by his or her**
9 **school district as a school protection officer and is carrying a firearm in a school within**
10 **that district, in which case no consent is required;**

11 **(b) Onto any school bus or onto the premises of any function or activity sponsored**
12 **or sanctioned by school officials or the district school board, except when the weapon is**
13 **possessed by an adult to facilitate a school-sanctioned firearm-related event or club event;**

14 **(c) Into any police, sheriff, or highway patrol office or station without the consent**
15 **of the chief law enforcement officer in charge of that office or station;**

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

16 **(d) Into the facility of any adult or juvenile detention or correctional institution,**
17 **prison, or jail;**

18 **(e) Into any courthouse solely occupied by the municipal, circuit, appellate, or**
19 **supreme court, or any courtrooms, administrative offices, libraries, or other rooms of any**
20 **such court, regardless of whether such court solely occupies the building in question. This**
21 **paragraph shall also include, but not be limited to, any juvenile, family, drug, or other**
22 **court offices, or any room or office wherein any of the courts or offices listed in this**
23 **subdivision are temporarily conducting any business within the jurisdiction of such courts**
24 **or offices. Nothing in this paragraph shall preclude those persons listed in subdivision (1)**
25 **of subsection 2 of this section while within their jurisdiction and on duty; those persons**
26 **listed in subdivisions (2), (4), and (10) of subsection 2 of this section; or such other persons**
27 **who serve in a law enforcement capacity for a court as may be specified by supreme court**
28 **rule from carrying a concealed firearm within any of the areas described in this**
29 **paragraph;**

30 **(f) Into any meeting of the general assembly or a committee of the general**
31 **assembly;**

32 **(g) Into any area of an airport to which access is controlled by the inspection of**
33 **persons and property;**

34 **(h) Into any place where the carrying of a firearm is prohibited by federal law; or**

35 **(i) Onto any private property whose owner has posted the premises as being**
36 **off-limits to concealed firearms by means of one or more signs displayed in a conspicuous**
37 **place of a minimum size of eleven inches by fourteen inches with the writing thereon in**
38 **letters of not less than one inch [~~into any area where firearms are restricted under section~~**
39 **~~571.107~~]; or**

40 (2) Sets a spring gun; or

41 (3) Discharges or shoots a firearm into a dwelling house, a railroad train, boat, aircraft,
42 or motor vehicle as defined in section 302.010, or any building or structure used for the
43 assembling of people; or

44 (4) Exhibits, in the presence of one or more persons, any weapon readily capable of
45 lethal use in an angry or threatening manner; or

46 (5) Has a firearm or projectile weapon readily capable of lethal use on his or her person,
47 while he or she is intoxicated, and handles or otherwise uses such firearm or projectile weapon
48 in either a negligent or unlawful manner or discharges such firearm or projectile weapon unless
49 acting in self-defense; or

50 (6) Discharges a firearm within one hundred yards of any occupied schoolhouse,
51 courthouse, or church building; or

52 (7) Discharges or shoots a firearm at a mark, at any object, or at random, on, along or
53 across a public highway or discharges or shoots a firearm into any outbuilding; or

54 (8) ~~Carries a firearm or any other weapon readily capable of lethal use into any church~~
55 ~~or place where people have assembled for worship, or into any election precinct on any election~~
56 ~~day, or into any building owned or occupied by any agency of the federal government, state~~
57 ~~government, or political subdivision thereof; or~~

58 ~~—(9)~~ Discharges or shoots a firearm at or from a motor vehicle, as defined in section
59 301.010, discharges or shoots a firearm at any person, or at any other motor vehicle, or at any
60 building or habitable structure, unless the person was lawfully acting in self-defense; or

61 ~~[(10) Carries a firearm, whether loaded or unloaded, or any other weapon readily capable~~
62 ~~of lethal use into any school, onto any school bus, or onto the premises of any function or activity~~
63 ~~sponsored or sanctioned by school officials or the district school board; or~~

64 ~~—(11)~~ (9) Possesses a firearm while also knowingly in possession of a controlled
65 substance that is sufficient for a felony violation of section 579.015.

66 2. ~~[Subdivisions (1), (8), and (10)]~~ Paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (f), and (i) of
67 subdivision (1) of subsection 1 of this section shall not apply to the persons described in
68 subdivisions (1), (3), (6), and (7) of this subsection, regardless of whether such uses are
69 reasonably associated with or are necessary to the fulfillment of such person's official duties
70 except as otherwise provided in this subsection. Subdivisions (3), (4), (6), (7), and ~~[(9)]~~ (8) of
71 subsection 1 of this section shall not apply to or affect any of the following persons, when such
72 uses are reasonably associated with or are necessary to the fulfillment of such person's official
73 duties, except as otherwise provided in this subsection:

74 (1) All state, county and municipal peace officers who have completed the training
75 required by the police officer standards and training commission pursuant to sections 590.030
76 to 590.050 and who possess the duty and power of arrest for violation of the general criminal
77 laws of the state or for violation of ordinances of counties or municipalities of the state, whether
78 such officers are on or off duty, and whether such officers are within or outside of the law
79 enforcement agency's jurisdiction, or all qualified retired peace officers, as defined in subsection
80 12 of this section, and who carry the identification defined in subsection 13 of this section, or
81 any person summoned by such officers to assist in making arrests or preserving the peace while
82 actually engaged in assisting such officer;

83 (2) Wardens, superintendents and keepers of prisons, penitentiaries, jails and other
84 institutions for the detention of persons accused or convicted of crime;

85 (3) Members of the Armed Forces or National Guard while performing their official
86 duty;

87 (4) Those persons vested by Article V, Section 1 of the Constitution of Missouri with
88 the judicial power of the state and those persons vested by Article III of the Constitution of the
89 United States with the judicial power of the United States, the members of the federal judiciary;

90 (5) Any person whose bona fide duty is to execute process, civil or criminal;

91 (6) Any federal probation officer or federal flight deck officer as defined under the
92 federal flight deck officer program, 49 U.S.C. Section 44921, regardless of whether such officers
93 are on duty, or within the law enforcement agency's jurisdiction;

94 (7) Any state probation or parole officer, including supervisors and members of the
95 board of probation and parole;

96 (8) Any corporate security advisor meeting the definition and fulfilling the requirements
97 of the regulations established by the department of public safety under section 590.750;

98 (9) Any coroner, deputy coroner, medical examiner, or assistant medical examiner;

99 (10) Any municipal or county prosecuting attorney or assistant prosecuting attorney;
100 circuit attorney or assistant circuit attorney; municipal, associate, or circuit judge; or any person
101 appointed by a court to be a special prosecutor who has completed the firearms safety training
102 course required under subsection 2 of section 571.111;

103 (11) Any member of a fire department or fire protection district who is employed on a
104 full-time basis as a fire investigator and who has a valid concealed carry endorsement issued
105 prior to August 28, 2013, or a valid concealed carry permit under section 571.111 when such
106 uses are reasonably associated with or are necessary to the fulfillment of such person's official
107 duties; and

108 (12) Upon the written approval of the governing body of a fire department or fire
109 protection district, any paid fire department or fire protection district member who is employed
110 on a full-time basis and who has a valid concealed carry endorsement issued prior to August 28,
111 2013, or a valid concealed carry permit, when such uses are reasonably associated with or are
112 necessary to the fulfillment of such person's official duties.

113 3. Subdivisions (1)[,] **and (5)[, (8), and (10)]** of subsection 1 of this section do not apply
114 when the actor is transporting such weapons in a nonfunctioning state or in an unloaded state
115 when ammunition is not readily accessible or when such weapons are not readily accessible.
116 Subdivision (1) of subsection 1 of this section does not apply to any person nineteen years of age
117 or older or eighteen years of age or older and a member of the United States Armed Forces, or
118 honorably discharged from the United States Armed Forces, transporting a concealable firearm
119 in the passenger compartment of a motor vehicle, so long as such concealable firearm is
120 otherwise lawfully possessed[, nor when the actor is also in possession of an exposed firearm or
121 projectile weapon for the lawful pursuit of game, or is in his or her dwelling unit or upon
122 premises over which the actor has possession, authority or control, or is traveling in a continuous

123 journey peaceably through this state. Subdivision (10) of subsection 1 of this section does not
124 apply if the firearm is otherwise lawfully possessed by a person while traversing school premises
125 for the purposes of transporting a student to or from school, or possessed by an adult for the
126 purposes of facilitation of a school-sanctioned firearm-related event or club event].

127 4. ~~[Subdivisions]~~ **Subdivision (1)**~~[(8), and (10)]~~ of subsection 1 of this section shall not
128 apply to any person who has a valid concealed carry permit issued pursuant to sections 571.101
129 to 571.121, **a valid lifetime or extended concealed carry permit issued under sections**
130 **571.205 to 571.230**, a valid concealed carry endorsement issued before August 28, 2013, or a
131 valid permit or endorsement to carry concealed firearms issued by another state or political
132 subdivision of another state.

133 5. Subdivisions (3), (4), (5), (6), (7), **and (8)**~~[(9), and (10)]~~ of subsection 1 of this
134 section shall not apply to persons who are engaged in a lawful act of defense pursuant to section
135 563.031.

136 6. Notwithstanding any provision of this section to the contrary, the state shall not
137 prohibit any state employee from having a firearm in the employee's vehicle on the state's
138 property provided that the vehicle is locked and the firearm is not visible. This subsection shall
139 only apply to the state as an employer when the state employee's vehicle is on property owned
140 or leased by the state and the state employee is conducting activities within the scope of his or
141 her employment. For the purposes of this subsection, "state employee" means an employee of
142 the executive, legislative, or judicial branch of the government of the state of Missouri.

143 7. Nothing in this section shall make it unlawful for a student to actually participate in
144 school-sanctioned gun safety courses, student military or ROTC courses, or other
145 school-sponsored or club-sponsored firearm-related events, provided the student does not carry
146 a firearm or other weapon readily capable of lethal use into any school, onto any school bus, or
147 onto the premises of any other function or activity sponsored or sanctioned by school officials
148 or the district school board.

149 8. A person who commits the ~~[crime]~~ **offense** of unlawful use of weapons under:

150 (1) Subdivision (2), (3), (4), or ~~[(11)]~~ **(9)** of subsection 1 of this section shall be guilty
151 of a class E felony;

152 (2) Subdivision (1), (6), **or (7)**~~[(8)]~~ of subsection 1 of this section shall be guilty of
153 a class B misdemeanor, except when a concealed weapon is carried onto any private property
154 whose owner has posted the premises as being off-limits to concealed firearms by means of one
155 or more signs displayed in a conspicuous place of a minimum size of eleven inches by fourteen
156 inches with the writing thereon in letters of not less than one inch, in which case the ~~[penalties~~
157 ~~of subsection 2 of section 571.107 shall apply]~~ **offense shall not be a criminal act but may**
158 **subject the person to denial to the premises or removal from the premises. If such person**

159 **refuses to leave the premises and a peace officer is summoned, such person may be issued**
160 **a citation for an amount not to exceed one hundred dollars for the first offense. If a second**
161 **citation for a similar violation occurs within a six-month period, such person shall be fined**
162 **an amount not to exceed two hundred dollars. If a third citation for a similar violation is**
163 **issued within one year of the first citation, such person shall be fined an amount not to**
164 **exceed five hundred dollars;**

165 (3) Subdivision (5) [~~or (10)~~] of subsection 1 of this section shall be guilty of a class A
166 misdemeanor if the firearm is unloaded and a class E felony if the firearm is loaded;

167 (4) Subdivision [~~(9)~~] (8) of subsection 1 of this section shall be guilty of a class B felony,
168 except that if the violation of subdivision [~~(9)~~] (8) of subsection 1 of this section results in injury
169 or death to another person, it is a class A felony.

170 9. Violations of subdivision [~~(9)~~] (8) of subsection 1 of this section shall be punished as
171 follows:

172 (1) For the first violation a person shall be sentenced to the maximum authorized term
173 of imprisonment for a class B felony;

174 (2) For any violation by a prior offender as defined in section 558.016, a person shall be
175 sentenced to the maximum authorized term of imprisonment for a class B felony without the
176 possibility of parole, probation or conditional release for a term of ten years;

177 (3) For any violation by a persistent offender as defined in section 558.016, a person
178 shall be sentenced to the maximum authorized term of imprisonment for a class B felony without
179 the possibility of parole, probation, or conditional release;

180 (4) For any violation which results in injury or death to another person, a person shall
181 be sentenced to an authorized disposition for a class A felony.

182 10. Any person knowingly aiding or abetting any other person in the violation of
183 subdivision [~~(9)~~] (8) of subsection 1 of this section shall be subject to the same penalty as that
184 prescribed by this section for violations by other persons.

185 11. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no person who pleads guilty to or is
186 found guilty of a felony violation of subsection 1 of this section shall receive a suspended
187 imposition of sentence if such person has previously received a suspended imposition of sentence
188 for any other firearms- or weapons-related felony offense.

189 12. As used in this section "qualified retired peace officer" means an individual who:

190 (1) Retired in good standing from service with a public agency as a peace officer, other
191 than for reasons of mental instability;

192 (2) Before such retirement, was authorized by law to engage in or supervise the
193 prevention, detection, investigation, or prosecution of, or the incarceration of any person for, any
194 violation of law, and had statutory powers of arrest;

195 (3) Before such retirement, was regularly employed as a peace officer for an aggregate
196 of fifteen years or more, or retired from service with such agency, after completing any
197 applicable probationary period of such service, due to a service-connected disability, as
198 determined by such agency;

199 (4) Has a nonforfeitable right to benefits under the retirement plan of the agency if such
200 a plan is available;

201 (5) During the most recent twelve-month period, has met, at the expense of the
202 individual, the standards for training and qualification for active peace officers to carry firearms;

203 (6) Is not under the influence of alcohol or another intoxicating or hallucinatory drug or
204 substance; and

205 (7) Is not prohibited by federal law from receiving a firearm.

206 13. The identification required by subdivision (1) of subsection 2 of this section is:

207 (1) A photographic identification issued by the agency from which the individual retired
208 from service as a peace officer that indicates that the individual has, not less recently than one
209 year before the date the individual is carrying the concealed firearm, been tested or otherwise
210 found by the agency to meet the standards established by the agency for training and qualification
211 for active peace officers to carry a firearm of the same type as the concealed firearm; or

212 (2) A photographic identification issued by the agency from which the individual retired
213 from service as a peace officer; and

214 (3) A certification issued by the state in which the individual resides that indicates that
215 the individual has, not less recently than one year before the date the individual is carrying the
216 concealed firearm, been tested or otherwise found by the state to meet the standards established
217 by the state for training and qualification for active peace officers to carry a firearm of the same
218 type as the concealed firearm.

219 **14. Notwithstanding any provision of this section or any other law, the offense of**
220 **unlawful use of weapons under subdivision (1) of subsection 1 of this section shall not**
221 **include possession of a firearm in a vehicle on any premise listed under paragraphs (a) to**
222 **(i) of subdivision (1) of subsection 1 of this section, except where prohibited by federal law,**
223 **so long as the firearm is not removed from the vehicle or brandished while the vehicle is**
224 **in or on the listed premise.**

571.107. 1. A concealed carry permit issued pursuant to sections 571.101 to 571.121,
2 **a valid lifetime or extended concealed carry permit issued under sections 571.205 to**
3 **571.230**, a valid concealed carry endorsement issued prior to August 28, 2013, or a concealed
4 carry endorsement or permit issued by another state or political subdivision of another state shall
5 authorize the person in whose name the permit or endorsement is issued to carry concealed
6 firearms on or about his or her person or vehicle throughout the state. No concealed carry permit

7 issued pursuant to sections 571.101 to 571.121, **valid lifetime or extended concealed carry**
8 **permit issued under sections 571.205 to 571.230**, valid concealed carry endorsement issued
9 prior to August 28, 2013, or a concealed carry endorsement or permit issued by another state or
10 political subdivision of another state shall authorize any person to carry concealed firearms into:

11 (1) Any police, sheriff, or highway patrol office or station without the consent of the
12 chief law enforcement officer in charge of that office or station~~[- Possession of a firearm in a~~
