Section 1. Section 69-2427, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
 2014, is amended to read:

3 69-2427 Sections 69-2427 to 69-2449 and section 3 of this act shall
4 be known and may be cited as the Concealed Handgun Permit Act.

5 Sec. 2. Section 69-2429, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is6 amended to read:

7 69-2429 For purposes of the Concealed Handgun Permit Act:

8 (1) Concealed handgun means the handgun is totally hidden from view. 9 If any part of the handgun is capable of being seen, it is not a 10 concealed handgun;

11 (2) Emergency services personnel means a volunteer or paid 12 firefighter or rescue squad member or a person licensed to provide 13 emergency medical services pursuant to the Emergency Medical Services 14 Practice Act;

(3) Handgun means any firearm with a barrel less than sixteen inches
in length or any firearm designed to be held and fired by the use of a
single hand;

(4) Peace officer means any town marshal, chief of police or local
police officer, sheriff or deputy sheriff, the Superintendent of Law
Enforcement and Public Safety, any officer of the Nebraska State Patrol,
any member of the National Guard on active service by direction of the
Governor during periods of emergency or civil disorder, any Game and
Parks Commission conservation officer, and all other persons with similar
authority to make arrests;

(5) Permitholder means an individual holding a current and valid
permit to carry a concealed handgun issued pursuant to the Concealed
Handgun Permit Act; and

(6) Posted conspicuous notice means a clearly visible sign posted at
 each entrance to a place or premises open to the public. The sign shall
 comply with section 3 of this act; and

of a document, supplied by an applicant, that certifies that he or she 1 2 either: (a) Within the previous three years, has successfully completed a 3 handgun training and safety course approved by the Nebraska State Patrol 4 pursuant to section 69-2432; or 5 (b) Is a member of the active or reserve armed forces of the United 6 7 States or a member of the National Guard and has had handgun training within the previous three years which meets the minimum safety and 8 9 training requirements of section 69-2432. 10 Sec. 3. (1) The Nebraska State Patrol shall design a standardized sign for use by any person, entity, or employer in control of property 11 prohibiting a permitholder from carrying a concealed handgun in or on the 12 place or premises. 13 14 (2) The sign: (a) Shall be at least five inches tall and three and one-half inches 15 wide; 16 17 (b) Shall have a white background containing a two inch red circle with a slash covering an image of a black handgun; 18 (c) Shall use contrasting black and red font and include the 19 following text: NOTICE. Carrying a concealed handgun by a permitholder is 20 21 PROHIBITED in or on this place or premises by the controllers of this 22 property. Posted pursuant to Nebraska Revised Statutes section 69-2441; (d) Shall be posted at each entrance to the place or premises 23 24 between forty-eight inches and sixty-six inches above the floor or 25 ground; (e) Shall, if the place or premises is a building, be posted (i) 26 either on the door of each entrance to the place or premises or within 27 twelve inches on either side of the doorway of each entrance or (ii) on 28 every door or within twelve inches on both sides of every doorway with 29 double doors along the width of the entrance, if the entrance has 30 multiple doorways; 31

2	within twenty-four inches on either side of each designated motor
3	vehicle, bicycle, or pedestrian entrance to the place or premises; and
