LEGISLATIVE BILL 1329

Introduced by Murman, 38. Read first time January 17, 2024 Committee:

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Career Scholarship Act; to
2	amend sections 85-3002, 85-3003, 85-3004, 85-3005, and 85-3006,
3	Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2022; to change provisions
4	relating to an award to a student attending a community college,
5	state college, private college, or the University of Nebraska under
6	the act; to change and provide definitions; to harmonize provisions;
7	and to repeal the original sections.

8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 85-3002, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
 2022, is amended to read:

3 85-3002 For purposes of the Nebraska Career Scholarship Act:

4 (1) Community college means a public postsecondary educational
5 institution which is part of the community college system and includes
6 all branches and campuses of such institution located within the State of
7 Nebraska;

(2) First-time freshman means a student who enrolled in an eligible 8 9 program of study who has not previously been enrolled in a postsecondary institution within three years immediately preceding the application for 10 a scholarship pursuant to the act and has not previously earned a 11 postsecondary credential except as a dual credit or early-college high 12 13 school student as the student's first enrollment in any postsecondary institution after graduating from high school or receiving a diploma of 14 high school equivalency; 15

16 (3) Nebraska Career Scholarship means a scholarship awarded under
17 the act or a scholarship awarded as a Nebraska Career Scholarship
18 pursuant to Laws 2021, LB380, or Laws 2020, LB1008;

(4) Nonscholarship student means a student who has never been
awarded a Nebraska Career Scholarship for the applicable eligible program
of study;

(5) Private college means an accredited private nonprofit
 institution of postsecondary education located within the State of
 Nebraska;

(6) Scholarship recipient means a student who has been awarded a
 Nebraska Career Scholarship;—and

(7) Standard college admission test means the national assessment
instrument that is also used as the standard college admission test
selected by the State Board of Education and administered to students in
the eleventh grade pursuant to subsection (9) of section 79-760.03; and (8) Transfer student means a student who has not previously earned a

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1 postsecondary credential and has transferred into an eligible program of study (a) from another postsecondary institution or (b) from another 2 program of study within the same postsecondary institution. A student 3 that previously earned a postsecondary credential, but only as a dual-4 credit or early-college high school student, shall be considered a 5 transfer student if such student transferred into an eligible program of 6 7 study from another postsecondary institution or a program within the same postsecondary institution directly following such student's early-college 8 9 high school enrollment.

Sec. 2. Section 85-3003, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
2022, is amended to read:

12 85-3003 (1)(a) The Board of Trustees of the Nebraska State Colleges 13 shall award a Nebraska Career Scholarship that does not exceed a maximum 14 of fifteen thousand dollars per year to any eligible state college 15 student who achieved a composite score on a standard college admission 16 test equivalent to a score of at least eighteen out of a maximum score of 17 thirty-six and who is enrolled in an eligible program of study.

(b) The Board of Trustees of the Nebraska State Colleges shall 18 allocate funds appropriated to the board under the Nebraska Career 19 Scholarship Act between the state college campuses, determine the 20 eligibility of students enrolled in a state college, receive and process 21 applications for awards to individual students, and disperse funds 22 23 directly to scholarship recipients during the fiscal year. Eligibility 24 criteria shall include being a first-time freshman or a transfer student 25 and enrollment in an eligible program of study.

26 (c) For purposes of this section, an eligible program of study27 means:

(i) Through academic year 2023-24, a program of study at a state
college in rangeland management, industrial technology, criminal justice,
business administration, education, communication, or computer
information systems; and

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1 (ii) Beginning with academic year 2024-25, a program of study 2 designated by the Department of Economic Development, in collaboration 3 with the Board of Trustees of the Nebraska State Colleges, based on 4 periodic reviews of workforce needs in the state.

5 (2) Each scholarship recipient shall register with the appropriate 6 campus office to obtain a Nebraska-based internship, apprenticeship, 7 clinical position, or employment in a major-related field prior to 8 completion of the student's eligible program of study.

9 (3) A Nebraska Career Scholarship may be used by a scholarship 10 recipient for tuition, fees, required tools and equipment, and room and 11 board.

12 (4) Each scholarship awarded under this section shall be 13 automatically renewed on an annual basis if the student remains enrolled in good standing in the eligible program of study for which such 14 15 scholarship was awarded, except that no student shall receive a 16 scholarship renewal after four years of participation in such eligible 17 program of study.

(5) The Board of Trustees of the Nebraska State Colleges shall collect information on each state college scholarship recipient and shall report electronically to the Clerk of the Legislature and the Governor on or before December 1 of each year the following information for <u>the each</u> eligible <u>programs</u> program of study at a state college in the current or prior academic year:

(a) The total number of students enrolled in <u>each eligible</u> the
program <u>of study</u> in the immediately prior academic year and the total
number of students enrolled in <u>each eligible</u> the program <u>of study</u> as of
September 30 for the current academic year, <u>based upon official fall</u>
<u>census data;</u>

(b) The total number of scholarship recipients in <u>each eligible</u> the
 program <u>of study</u> as of September 30 for the current academic year and the
 total number of such scholarship recipients who are newly enrolled in

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1 <u>each eligible</u> the program <u>of study</u> for such academic year, <u>based upon</u> 2 official fall census data;

(c) The total number of newly awarded scholarship recipients 3 students retained across all eligible programs of study in the program 4 from the immediately prior academic year to the current academic year and 5 a comparison of the retention rates between those of the newly awarded 6 7 scholarship recipients and the institution's overall first to second year retention rate reported to the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data 8 9 System for the same year scholarship recipients and nonscholarship 10 students;

11 (d) The number of students participating in an internship, an 12 apprenticeship, a clinical position, or employment in a major-related 13 field during the immediately prior academic year and a comparison of 14 participation rates for scholarship recipients and nonscholarship 15 students;

16 (d) (e) The total number of <u>scholarship recipients who graduated</u> 17 <u>during graduates for</u> the immediately prior academic year, the number of 18 <u>scholarship recipient graduates for such academic year</u>, and a comparison 19 of the <u>four-year graduation rates between the</u> for <u>scholarship recipients</u> 20 <u>who graduated and the overall institution's four-year graduate rate</u> 21 <u>reported to the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System for the</u> 22 <u>same year and nonscholarship students</u>; and

(e) (f) The number <u>and percent</u> of <u>scholarship recipients who</u>
 graduated during graduates from the immediately prior <u>calendar</u> academic
 year who obtained employment in a major-related field in the state-within
 four months after graduation and the average starting salary for such
 graduates.

Sec. 3. Section 85-3004, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
2022, is amended to read:

30 85-3004 (1)(a) The Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska
 31 shall award a Nebraska Career Scholarship to any eligible university

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1 student who is enrolled in an eligible program of study in an amount not 2 to exceed:

3 (i) Ten thousand dollars per year for any scholarship recipient who4 is a transfer student; or

5 (ii) Except as provided in subdivision (1)(a)(i) of this section:

6 (A) Twenty-five thousand dollars per year for any scholarship 7 recipient who achieved a composite score on a standard college admission 8 test equivalent to a score of at least twenty-eight out of a maximum 9 score of thirty-six; or

10 (B) Ten thousand dollars per year for any scholarship recipient who 11 achieved a composite score on a standard college admission test 12 equivalent to a score of at least twenty and less than twenty-eight out 13 of a maximum score of thirty-six.

(b) The Board of Regents shall allocate funds appropriated to the 14 board under the Nebraska Career Scholarship Act between the university 15 16 campuses, determine the eligibility of students enrolled in the 17 university, receive and process applications for awards to individual students, and disperse funds directly to scholarship recipients during 18 19 the fiscal year. Eligibility criteria shall include (i) being a firsttime freshman who achieved a composite score on a standard college 20 admission test equivalent to a score of at least twenty out of a maximum 21 score of thirty-six or a transfer student and (ii) enrollment in an 22 eligible program of study. 23

(c) For purposes of this section, an eligible program of studymeans:

(i) Through academic year 2023-24, a program of study offered by the
 University of Nebraska in mathematics, engineering, health care, and
 computer information systems; and

(ii) Beginning with academic year 2024-25, a program of study
designated by the Department of Economic Development, in collaboration
with the Board of Regents, based on periodic reviews of workforce needs

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1 in the state.

2 (2) Each scholarship recipient shall register with the appropriate
3 campus office to obtain a Nebraska-based internship, apprenticeship,
4 clinical position, or employment in a major-related field prior to
5 completion of the student's eligible program of study.

6 (3) A Nebraska Career Scholarship may be used by a scholarship 7 recipient for tuition, fees, required tools and equipment, and room and 8 board.

9 (4) Each scholarship awarded under this section shall be 10 automatically renewed on an annual basis if the student remains enrolled in good standing in the eligible program of study for which such 11 12 scholarship was awarded, except that no student shall receive a scholarship renewal after four years of participation in such eligible 13 program of study. 14

15 (5) The Board of Regents shall collect information on each 16 university scholarship recipient and shall report electronically to the 17 Clerk of the Legislature and the Governor on or before December 1 of each 18 year the following information for <u>the each</u> eligible <u>programs</u> program of 19 study at the university in the current or prior academic year:

(a) The total number of students enrolled in <u>each eligible</u> the
program <u>of study</u> in the immediately prior academic year and the total
number of students enrolled in <u>each eligible</u> the program <u>of study</u> as of
September 30 for the current academic year, <u>based upon official fall</u>
<u>census data;</u>

(b) The total number of scholarship recipients in <u>each eligible</u> the program <u>of study</u> as of September 30 for the current academic year and the total number of such scholarship recipients who are newly enrolled in <u>each eligible</u> the program <u>of study</u> for such academic year, <u>based upon</u> <u>official fall census data</u>;

30 (c) The total number of <u>newly awarded scholarship recipients</u>
 31 students retained <u>across all eligible programs of study</u> in the program

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from the immediately prior academic year to the current academic year and a comparison of the retention rates between <u>those of the newly awarded</u> scholarship recipients and the institution's overall first to second year retention rate reported to the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System for the same year scholarship recipients and nonscholarship students;

7 (d) The number of students participating in an internship, an 8 apprenticeship, a clinical position, or employment in a major-related 9 field during the immediately prior academic year and a comparison of 10 participation rates for scholarship recipients and nonscholarship 11 students;

12 (d) (e) The total number of <u>scholarship recipients who graduated</u> 13 <u>during graduates for</u> the immediately prior academic year, the number of 14 <u>scholarship recipient graduates for such academic year</u>, and a comparison 15 of the <u>four-year graduation rates between the</u> for <u>scholarship recipients</u> 16 <u>who graduated and the overall institution's four-year graduate rate</u> 17 <u>reported to the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System for the</u> 18 <u>same year and nonscholarship students</u>; and

(e) (f) The number <u>and percent</u> of <u>scholarship recipients who</u>
 <u>graduated during graduates from</u> the immediately prior <u>calendar</u> academic
 year who obtained employment in a major-related field in the state-within
 <u>four months after graduation and the average starting salary for such</u>
 graduates.

24 Sec. 4. Section 85-3005, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 25 2022, is amended to read:

26 85-3005 (1)(a) The <u>Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary</u> 27 <u>Education Department of Economic Development</u>, in collaboration with the 28 community colleges, shall award a Nebraska Career Scholarship that does 29 not exceed a maximum of <u>fifteen five</u> thousand dollars per year to any 30 eligible community college student who is enrolled in an eligible program 31 of study in an identified shortage area or skilled trade that meets the

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1 workforce needs of the state.

2 (b) The <u>Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education, in</u> consultation with the State Department of Education, the Department of 3 4 Labor, the Department of Economic Development, and any advisory committee 5 established by the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education for such purpose, Department of Economic Development shall identify 6 7 shortage areas and skilled trades that meet workforce needs for purposes 8 this section and shall periodically review and of revise the 9 identification of such shortage areas and skilled trades.

(c) For purposes of this section, an eligible program of study means
 a program of study offered by a community college in a shortage area or
 skilled trade identified pursuant to subdivision (b) of this subsection.

(d) Each community college area, acting as an agent of the state, shall determine the eligibility of students enrolled in the community college, receive and process applications for awards to individual students, and disperse funds directly to scholarship recipients during the fiscal year. Eligibility criteria shall include being a first-time freshman or a transfer student and enrollment in an eligible program of study.

(2) Each scholarship recipient <u>enrolled in more than a one-semester</u>
<u>or sixteen-credit-hour program of study</u> shall register with the
appropriate campus office to obtain a Nebraska-based internship,
apprenticeship, clinical position, <u>experiential learning activity</u>, or
employment in a major-related field prior to completion of the student's
eligible program of study.

(3) A Nebraska Career Scholarship may be used by the scholarship
 recipient for tuition, fees, required tools and equipment, and room and
 board.

(4) Each scholarship awarded under this section shall be
 automatically renewed on an annual basis if the student remains enrolled
 in good standing in the eligible program of study for which such

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scholarship was awarded, except that no student shall receive a
 scholarship renewal after three years of participation in such eligible
 program of study.

4 (5) Each community college area shall collect information on each 5 scholarship recipient who has been awarded a Nebraska Career Scholarship 6 by such community college area and shall share such information with the 7 <u>Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education</u> Department of 8 Economic Development.

9 (6) The <u>Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education</u> 10 Department of Economic Development shall report electronically to the 11 Clerk of the Legislature and the Governor on or before December 1 of each 12 year the following information:

(a) For each eligible program of study at a community college in thecurrent or prior academic year:

(i) The total number of students enrolled in the program in the immediately prior academic year and the total number of students enrolled in the program as of the most recent census date for the community college area; <u>and</u>

(ii) The total number of scholarship recipients in the program as of
the most recent census date for the community college area; and

21 (iii) The number of students participating in an internship, an 22 apprenticeship, a clinical position, or employment in a major-related 23 field during the immediately prior academic year and a comparison of 24 participation rates for scholarship recipients and nonscholarship 25 students;

(b) The <u>first to second year retention rate of new scholarship</u>
<u>recipients for all eligible programs of study from the immediately prior</u>
<u>academic year as compared to the institution's overall first to second</u>
<u>year retention rate as reported to the Integrated Postsecondary Education</u>
<u>Data System for the same year</u> total number of first-time freshman
<u>scholarship recipients retained in year two of the scholarship</u>

1 recipient's eligible program of study and a comparison of the retention 2 rate for first-time freshman scholarship recipients to the overall 3 retention rate for first-time freshman students;

4 (c) The total number of first-time freshman scholarship recipients 5 who complete the program of study by earning the certificate, diploma, or 6 degree that signifies completion and a comparison of the on-time 7 completion rate for scholarship recipients to the overall on-time 8 completion rate for all first-time freshman students; <u>and</u>

9 (d) The number of scholarship recipients obtaining employment in the 10 state within five fiscal quarters of completion of an eligible program of 11 study using Department of Labor data. ; and

(e) The average salary of scholarship recipients, as determined by
 the Department of Labor, for the fifth fiscal quarter following
 completion.

15 (7) The <u>Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education</u> 16 Department of Economic Development shall allocate to community colleges 17 the amount appropriated to the <u>commission</u> department to carry out this 18 section. The <u>commission</u> department shall establish a separate budget 19 subprogram for such allocation.

20 Sec. 5. Section 85-3006, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 21 2022, is amended to read:

22 85-3006 The <u>Coordinating</u> Commission for Postsecondary (1)(a) Education Department of Economic Development, in collaboration with 23 private colleges that elect to participate, shall award a Nebraska Career 24 Scholarship that does not exceed a maximum of ten thousand dollars per 25 year to any private college student who achieved a composite score on a 26 27 standard college admission test equivalent to a score of at least 28 eighteen out of a maximum score of thirty-six or who had a high school grade-point average of 3.0 or greater on a four-point scale and who is 29 30 enrolled in an eligible program of study.

31 (b) Each participating private college, acting as an agent of the

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state, shall determine the eligibility of students enrolled in the 1 2 private college, receive and process applications for awards to disperse funds 3 individual students, and directly to scholarship 4 recipients during the fiscal year. Eligibility criteria shall include being a first-time freshman or a transfer student and enrollment in an 5 eligible program of study. 6

7 (c) For purposes of this section, an eligible program of study8 means:

9 (i) Through academic year 2023-24, a program of study at a private 10 college in mathematics, health care, and computer information systems; 11 and

(ii) Beginning with academic year 2024-25, a program of study in 12 13 shortage areas designated by the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education, in consultation with the State Department of 14 Education, the Department of Labor, the Department of Economic 15 16 Development, and any advisory committee established by the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education for such purpose, Department of 17 Economic Development based on periodic reviews of workforce needs in the 18 19 state.

(2) Each scholarship recipient shall register with the appropriate
campus office to obtain a Nebraska-based internship, apprenticeship,
clinical position, or employment in a major-related field prior to
completion of the student's eligible program of study.

(3) A Nebraska Career Scholarship may be used by the scholarship
 recipient for tuition, fees, required tools and equipment, and room and
 board.

scholarship 27 Each awarded under this section shall be (4) automatically renewed on an annual basis if the student remains enrolled 28 in good standing in the eligible program of study for which such 29 30 scholarship was awarded, except that no student shall receive a scholarship renewal after four years of participation in such eligible 31

2 (5) Each participating private college shall collect information on
3 each scholarship recipient who has been awarded a Nebraska Career
4 Scholarship by such private college and shall share such information with
5 the <u>Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education</u> Department of
6 Economic Development.

7 (6) The <u>Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education</u> 8 Department of Economic Development shall report electronically to the 9 Clerk of the Legislature and the Governor on or before December 1 of each 10 year the following information for each eligible program of study at a 11 private college in the current or prior academic year:

(a) The total number of students enrolled in the program in the
immediately prior academic year and the total number of students enrolled
in the program as of September 30 for the current academic year;

(b) The total number of scholarship recipients in the program as of
September 30 for the current academic year and the total number of such
scholarship recipients who are newly enrolled in the program for such
academic year;

(c) The total number of students retained in the program and a
 comparison of the retention rates between scholarship recipients and
 nonscholarship students;

(d) The number of students participating in an internship, an
apprenticeship, a clinical position, or employment in a major-related
field during the immediately prior academic year and a comparison of
participation rates for scholarship recipients and nonscholarship
students;

(e) The total number of graduates for the immediately prior academic
year, the number of scholarship recipient graduates for such academic
year, and a comparison of the graduation rates for scholarship recipients
and nonscholarship students; and

31 (f) The number of graduates from the immediately prior academic year

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1 who obtained employment in a major-related field in the state within four 2 months after graduation and the average starting salary for such 3 graduates.

4 (7) The <u>Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education</u> 5 Department of Economic Development shall allocate the amount appropriated 6 to the department to carry out this section to private colleges that 7 elect to participate under the Nebraska Career Scholarship Act. The 8 department shall establish a separate budget subprogram for such 9 allocations.
