15	not include a	ny of the following: (i) a feeding device that has been permanently altered	l so that it			
16	cannot accommodate more than 10 rounds of ammunition, (ii) an attached tubular device

		agency in the county or municipality where the person resides or the

	<u>c.</u>	Transfers or sells the large-capacity magazine to a federally licensed
		gun dealer or person or firm outside of this State that is lawfully
		entitled to own or possess a large-capacity magazine."
