- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 62.1-01 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to manufactured firearms, accessories, and ammunition.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 62.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 5 and enacted as follows:
  - Firearms Manufacture Prohibition.
- 1. A personal firearm, firearm accessory, or ammunition manufactured commercially or privately in the state and which remains within the state is not subject to federal law or federal regulation, including registration as those items are not subject to regulations related to interstate commerce. This section applies to a firearm, firearm accessory, or ammunition manufactured in the state from basic materials and which can be manufactured without the inclusion of any significant parts imported from another state.
  - 2. Generic and insignificant parts that have other manufacturing or consumer product applications are not firearms, firearms accessories, or ammunition, and importation into the state and incorporation into a firearm, firearm accessory, or ammunition manufactured in the state does not subject the firearm, firearm accessory, or ammunition to federal regulation. Unmachined steel and unshaped wood are not firearms, firearms accessories, or ammunition and are not subject to congressional authority to regulate firearms, firearms accessories, and ammunition under interstate commerce. The authority of congress to regulate basic materials does not include authority to regulate firearms, firearms accessories, and ammunition made in the state from those materials.
