1 1290.20), which relate to mandatory and temporary preclusions and refusing to submit applications; 2 providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency. 3 4 5 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 7 SECTION 1. 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.5, as AMENDATORY last amended by Section 1, Chapter 122, O.S.L. 2014 (21 O.S. Supp. 8 9 2014, Section 1290.5), is amended to read as follows: 10 Section 1290.5 11 TERM OF LICENSE AND RENEWAL 12 A. A handgun license when issued shall authorize the person to 13 whom the license is issued to carry a loaded or unloaded handgun, 14 concealed or unconcealed, as authorized by the provisions of the 15 Oklahoma Self-Defense Act, and any future modifications thereto. 16 The license shall be valid in this state for a period of five (5) or 17 ten (10) years, unless subsequently surrendered, suspended or 18 revoked as provided by law. The person shall have no authority to 19 continue to carry a concealed or unconcealed handgun in this state 20 pursuant to the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act when a license is expired 21 or when a license has been voluntarily surrendered or suspended or 22 revoked for any reason. 23 B. A license may be renewed any time within ninety (90) days

24 prior to the expiration date as provided in this subsection. The

Bureau shall send a renewal application to each eligible licensee with a return address requested. There shall be a ninety-day grace period on license renewals beginning on the date of expiration, thereafter the license is considered expired. However, any applicant shall have three (3) years from the expiration of the license to comply with the renewal requirements of this section.

To renew a handgun license, the licensee must first obtain a
Oklahoma residents may submit renewal form from applications to the
Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation at their headquarters or any
other facility designated by the Bureau for receiving applications.

11 2. The applicant must complete the renewal form submit either a 12 completed paper application, in person or by mail, or complete an 13 online application, attach or upload two current passport size 14 photographs of the applicant, and submit a renewal fee in the amount 15 of Eighty-five Dollars (\$85.00) to the Bureau Twenty-five Dollars 16 (\$25.00) for Oklahoma residents or Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for 17 nonresidents. The renewal fee may be paid with a nationally 18 recognized credit card as provided in subparagraph b of paragraph 4 19 5 of subsection A of Section 1290.12 of this title, by electronic 20 funds transfer, or by a cashier's check or money order made payable 21 to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation.

3. Upon receipt of the renewal application, photographs and
fee, the Bureau will conduct a criminal history records name search,
an investigation of medical records or other records or information

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1	deemed by the Bureau to be relevant to the renewal application
2	background check of the applicant using the National Instant
3	Criminal Background Check System (NICS) of the Federal Bureau of
4	Investigation. Approval or denial of the renewal application,
5	notification of the denial, and the appeals process of the renewal
6	application shall be subject to the same procedures for new
7	applicants. If the NICS background check provides a "proceed"
8	response pertaining to the applicant appears not to have any
9	prohibition to renewing the handgun license, the Bureau shall issue
10	the renewed license for a period of five (5) <del>or ten (10)</del> years.
11	C. Beginning November 1, 2007, any person making application
12	for a handgun license or any licensee seeking to renew a handgun
13	license shall have the option to request that said license be valid
14	for a period of ten (10) years. The fee for any handgun license
15	issued for a period of ten (10) years shall be double the amount of
16	the fee provided for in paragraph 4 of subsection A of Section
17	1290.12 of this title. The renewal fee for a handgun license issued
18	for a period of ten (10) years shall be double the amount of the fee
19	provided for in paragraph 2 of subsection B of this section.
20	SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.9, as
21	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 85, O.S.L. 2014 (21 O.S. Supp.
22	2014, Section 1290.9), is amended to read as follows:
23	Section 1290.9
24	ELIGIBILITY

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The following requirements shall apply to any person making
 application to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation for a
 handgun license pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Self Defense Act. The person must:

1. Be a citizen of the United States;

2. Establish a residency in the State of Oklahoma. For 6 7 purposes of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act, the term "residency" shall apply to any person who either possesses a valid Oklahoma 8 9 driver license or state photo identification card, and physically 10 maintains a residence in this state or to any person, including the 11 spouse of such person, who has permanent military orders within this 12 state and possesses a valid driver license from another state where 13 such person and spouse of such person claim residency;

14

3. Be at least twenty-one (21) years of age;

4. Complete a firearms safety and training course and demonstrate competence and qualifications with the type of pistol to be carried by the person as provided in Section 1290.14 of this title, and submit proof of training and qualification or an exemption for training and qualification as authorized by Section 1290.14 of this title;

5. Submit the required fee and complete the application process
as provided in Section 1290.12 of this title; and

23 6. Comply in good faith with the provisions of the Oklahoma
24 Self-Defense Act.

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1	SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.12, as
2	last amended by Section 2, Chapter 11, O.S.L. 2014 (21 O.S. Supp.

5	PROCEDURE FOR APPLICATION
6	A. Except as provided in paragraph $\frac{11}{9}$ of this subsection, the
7	procedure for applying for a handgun license and processing the
8	application shall be as follows:
9	1. Applications shall be submitted to the Oklahoma State Bureau
10	of Investigation at their headquarters or any other location
11	designated by the Bureau for receiving applications;
12	2. An eligible person may request an application packet for a
13	handgun license from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation <del>or</del>
14	the county sheriff's office either online, in person or by mail.
15	The Bureau may provide application packets to each sheriff not
16	exceeding two hundred packets per request. The Bureau shall provide
17	the following information in the application packet:
18	a. an application form,
19	b. procedures to follow to process the application form,
20	and
21	c. a copy of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act with any
22	modifications thereto;
23	$\frac{2}{2}$ . The person shall be required to successfully complete a
24	firearms safety and training course from a firearms instructor who

1 is approved and registered in this state as provided in Section 2 1290.14 of this title, and the person shall be required to demonstrate competency and qualification with a pistol authorized 3 for concealed or unconcealed carry by the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act. 4 5 The original certificate of training shall be submitted with the application for a handgun license. No duplicate, copy, facsimile or 6 7 other reproduction of the certificate of training or exemption from training shall be acceptable as proof of training as required by the 8 9 provisions of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act. A person exempt from 10 the training requirements as provided in Section 1290.15 of this 11 title must show the required proof of such exemption to the firearms 12 instructor to receive an exemption certificate. The original 13 exemption certificate must be submitted with the application for a 14 handgun license when the person claims an exemption from training 15 and qualification;

16 <u>3. 4.</u> The application form shall be completed and delivered by 17 the applicant, in person <u>or by mail</u>, to <u>the sheriff of the county</u> 18 wherein the applicant resides <u>a facility designated by the Bureau</u> 19 for receiving applications;

4. The person <u>5. A resident of Oklahoma</u> shall deliver to the
sheriff <u>Bureau</u> at the time of delivery of the completed application
form a fee of <del>One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00)</del> <u>Twenty-five Dollars</u>
<u>(\$25.00)</u> for processing the application through the Oklahoma State
<u>Bureau of Investigation and processing the required fingerprints</u>

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1	through the Federal Bureau of Investigation A nonresident of
2	Oklahoma shall deliver to the Bureau at the time of delivery of the
3	completed application form a fee of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for
4	processing the application. The processing fee shall be in the form
5	of:
6	a. a money order or a cashier's check made payable to the
7	Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation,
8	b. by a nationally recognized credit card issued to the
9	applicant. For purposes of this paragraph,
10	"nationally recognized credit card" means any
11	instrument or device, whether known as a credit card,
12	credit plate, charge plate, or by any other name,
13	issued with or without fee by the issuer for the use
14	of the cardholder in obtaining goods, services, or
15	anything else of value on credit which is accepted by
16	over one thousand merchants in the state. The
17	Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation shall determine
18	which nationally recognized credit cards will be
19	accepted by the Bureau, or
20	c. by electronic funds transfer.
21	The processing fee shall not be refundable in the event of a
22	denial of a handgun license or any suspension or revocation
23	subsequent to the issuance of a license. Persons making application

24 for a firearms instructor shall not be required to pay the

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1 application fee as provided in this section, but shall be required 2 to pay the costs provided in paragraphs 6 and 8 paragraph 7 of this 3 subsection;

4 5. The completed application form shall be signed by the
5 applicant in person before the sheriff.

6 6. The signature of the applicant on the application shall be 7 given voluntarily upon a sworn oath that the person knows the contents of the application and, that the information contained in 8 9 the application is true and correct and that the applicant is the 10 same person named on the application. Any person making any false or misleading statement on an application for a handgun license 11 12 shall, upon conviction, be guilty of perjury as defined by Section 13 491 of this title. Any conviction shall be punished as provided in 14 Section 500 of this title. In addition to a criminal conviction, 15 the person shall be denied the right to have a handgun license 16 pursuant to the provisions of Section 1290.10 of this title and the 17 Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation shall revoke the handgun 18 license, if issued;

19 6. 7. Two passport\_size photographs of the applicant shall be 20 submitted with the completed application. The cost of the 21 photographs shall be the responsibility of the applicant. The 22 sheriff <u>Bureau</u> is authorized to take the photograph of the applicant 23 for purposes of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act and, if such 24 photographs are taken by the sheriff Bureau the cost of the

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photographs shall not exceed Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for the two photos. All money received by the <u>sheriff Bureau</u> from photographing applicants pursuant to the provisions of this paragraph shall be retained by the <u>sheriff Bureau</u> and deposited into the <u>Sheriff's</u> <u>Service Fee Account Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation Revolving</u> Fund;

7 7. The sheriff shall witness the signature of the applicant and
8 review or take the photographs of the applicant and shall verify
9 that the person making application for a handgun license is the same
10 person in the photographs submitted and the same person who signed
11 the application form. Proof

12 <u>8. A photocopy</u> of a valid <del>Oklahoma</del> driver license with a 13 photograph of the applicant or <del>an Oklahoma State</del> <u>state-issued</u> photo 14 identification <u>card</u> for the applicant shall be required to be 15 presented by the applicant <del>to the sheriff</del> <u>with the application</u> for 16 verification of the person's identity;

17 8. Upon verification of the identity of the applicant, the 18 sheriff shall take two complete sets of fingerprints of the 19 applicant. Both sets of fingerprints shall be submitted by the 20 sheriff with the completed application, certificate of training or 21 an exemption certificate, photographs and processing fee to the 22 Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation within fourteen (14) days of 23 taking the fingerprints. The cost of the fingerprints shall be paid 24 by the applicant and shall not exceed Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00)

1 for the two sets. All fees collected by the sheriff from taking
2 fingerprints pursuant to the provisions of this paragraph shall be
3 retained by the sheriff and deposited into the Sheriff's Service Fee
4 Account;

9. The sheriff shall submit to the Oklahoma State Bureau of 5 Investigation within the fourteen-day period, together with the 6 7 completed application, including the certificate of training or exemption certificate, photographs, processing fee and legible 8 9 fingerprints meeting the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation's 10 Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) submission 11 standards, and a report of information deemed pertinent to an 12 investigation of the applicant for a handgun license. The sheriff 13 shall make a preliminary investigation of pertinent information 14 about the applicant and the court clerk shall assist the sheriff in 15 locating pertinent information in court records for this purpose. 16 If no pertinent information is found to exist either for or against 17 the applicant, the sheriff shall so indicate in the report; 18 10. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, upon receipt of 19 the application and required information from the sheriff, shall 20 forward one full set of fingerprints of the applicant to the Federal 21 Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history records 22 search. The cost of processing the fingerprints nationally shall be 23 paid from the processing fee collected by the Oklahoma State Bureau 24 of Investigation;

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1 11. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Oklahoma Self-Defense 2 Act, or any other provisions of law, any person who has been granted a permanent victim's protective order by the court, as provided for 3 4 in the Protection from Domestic Abuse Act, may be issued a temporary 5 handgun license for a period not to exceed six (6) months. Α temporary handgun license may be issued if the person has 6 7 successfully passed the required weapons course, completed the 8 application process for the handgun license, passed the preliminary 9 investigation of the person by the sheriff and court clerk, and 10 provided the sheriff Bureau proof of a certified permanent victim 11 protection order and a valid Oklahoma state photo identification 12 card or driver license. The sheriff Bureau shall issue a temporary 13 handgun license on a form approved by the Oklahoma State Bureau of 14 Investigation, at no cost. Any person who has been issued a 15 temporary license shall carry the temporary handgun license and a 16 valid Oklahoma state photo identification on his or her person at 17 all times, and shall be subject to all the requirements of the 18 Oklahoma Self-Defense Act when carrying a handgun. The person may 19 proceed with the handgun licensing process. In the event the 20 victim's protection order is no longer enforceable, the temporary 21 handgun license shall cease to be valid;

22 <u>12.</u> <u>10.</u> The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation shall make a 23 reasonable effort to investigate the information submitted by the 24 applicant and the sheriff, to ascertain whether or not the issuance

1	of a handgun license would be in violation of the provisions of the
2	Oklahoma Self-Defense Act. The investigation by the Bureau of an
3	applicant shall include, but shall not be limited to: a statewide
4	criminal history records search, a national criminal history records
5	search, a Federal Bureau of Investigation fingerprint search, and if
6	applicable, an investigation of medical records or other records or
7	information deemed by the Bureau to be relevant to the application.
8	a. In the course of the investigation by the Bureau, it
9	shall present the name of the applicant along with any
10	known aliases, the address of the applicant and the
11	social security number of the applicant to the
12	Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse
13	Services. The Department of Mental Health and
14	Substance Abuse Services shall respond within ten (10)
15	days of receiving such information to the Bureau as
16	follows:
17	(1) with a "Yes" answer, if the records of the
18	Department indicate that the person was
19	involuntarily committed to a mental institution
20	in Oklahoma,
21	(2) with a "No" answer, if there are no records
22	indicating the name of the person as a person
23	involuntarily committed to a mental institution
24	in Oklahoma, or

1		(3) with an "Inconclusive" answer if the records of
2		the Department suggest the applicant may be a
3		formerly committed person. In the case of an
4		inconclusive answer, the Bureau shall ask the
5		applicant whether he or she was involuntarily
6		committed. If the applicant states under penalty
7		of perjury that he or she has not been
8		involuntarily committed, the Bureau shall
9		continue processing the application for a
10		license.
11	<del>b.</del>	In the course of the investigation by the Bureau, it
12		shall check the name of any applicant who is twenty-
13		eight (28) years of age or younger along with any
14		known aliases, the address of the applicant and the
15		social security number of the applicant against the
16		records in the Juvenile Online Tracking System (JOLTS)
17		of the Office of Juvenile Affairs. The Office of
18		Juvenile Affairs shall provide the Bureau direct
19		access to check the applicant against the records
20		available on JOLTS.
21		(1) If the Bureau finds a record on the JOLTS that
22		indicates the person was adjudicated a delinquent
23		for an offense that would constitute a felony
24		

1		offense if committed by an adult within the last
2		ten (10) years the Bureau shall deny the license,
3	<del>(2)</del>	If the Bureau finds no record on the JOLTS
4		indicating the named person was adjudicated
5		delinquent for an offense that would constitute a
6		felony offense if committed by an adult within
7		the last ten (10) years, or
8	<del>-(3)</del> -	If the records suggest the applicant may have
9		been adjudicated delinquent for an offense that
10		would constitute a felony offense if committed by
11		an adult but such record is inconclusive, the
12		Bureau shall ask the applicant whether he or she
13		was adjudicated a delinquent for an offense that
14		would constitute a felony offense if committed by
15		an adult within the last ten (10) years. If the
16		applicant states under penalty of perjury that he
17		or she was not adjudicated a delinquent within
18		ten (10) years, the Bureau shall continue
19		processing the application for a license
20	<u>conduct a backgrou</u>	nd check of the applicant using the National
21	Instant Criminal B	ackground Check System (NICS) of the Federal
22	Bureau of Investig	ation; and
23	<del>13.</del> <u>11.</u> If th	e <u>NICS</u> background check <del>set forth in paragraph 11</del>
24	of this subsection	reveals no records provides a "proceed" response

1 pertaining to the applicant, the Oklahoma State Bureau of 2 Investigation shall either issue a handgun license or deny the application within sixty (60) days of the date of receipt of the 3 applicant's completed application and the required information from 4 5 the sheriff. In all other cases, the Oklahoma State Bureau of 6 Investigation shall either issue a handgun license or deny the 7 application within ninety (90) days of the date of the receipt of 8 the applicant's completed application and the required information 9 from the sheriff. The Bureau shall approve an applicant who appears 10 to be in full compliance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act, if completion of the federal fingerprint search is the 11 12 only reason for delay of the issuance of the handgun license to that 13 applicant. Upon receipt of the federal fingerprint search 14 information, if the Bureau receives information which precludes the 15 person from having a handgun license, the Bureau shall revoke the 16 handgun license previously issued to the applicant. The Bureau 17 shall deny a license when the applicant fails to properly complete 18 the application form or application process or is determined not to 19 be eligible as specified by the provisions of Section 1290.9, 1290.10 or 1290.11 of this title. The Bureau shall approve an 20 21 application in all other cases. If an application is denied the 22 NICS background check provides a "deny" response pertaining to the 23 applicant, the Bureau shall notify the applicant in writing of its 24 decision that the application has been denied and provide

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1 information from the NICS background check as to why the application has been denied. The notification shall state the grounds for the 2 3 denial and inform the applicant of the right to an appeal as may be 4 provided by the provisions of the Administrative Procedures Act and 5 the procedures by which the applicant may appeal the denial. If the NICS background check provides a "delayed" response pertaining to 6 7 the applicant and the Bureau does not receive a "proceed" response within sixty (60) days of the date of receipt of the application, 8 9 the application shall be denied. All notices of denial shall be 10 mailed by first-class mail to the address of the applicant listed in 11 the application. Within sixty (60) calendar days from the date of 12 mailing a denial of application to an applicant, the applicant shall 13 notify the Bureau in writing of the intent to appeal the decision of 14 denial or the right of the applicant to appeal shall be deemed 15 waived. Any administrative hearing on a denial which may be 16 provided shall be conducted by a hearing examiner appointed by the 17 Bureau. If the applicant has corrected any error pertaining to the 18 NICS background check, the hearing examiner shall approve the 19 application. The decision of the hearing examiner shall be a final 20 decision appealable to a district court in accordance with the 21 Administrative Procedures Act. When an application is approved, the 22 Bureau shall issue the license and shall mail the license by first-23 class mail to the address of the applicant listed in the 24 application.

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1 B. Nothing contained in any provision of the Oklahoma Self-2 Defense Act shall be construed to require or authorize the registration, documentation or providing of serial numbers with 3 4 regard to any firearm. For purposes of the Oklahoma Self-Defense 5 Act, the sheriff may designate a person to receive, fingerprint, photograph or otherwise process applications for handgun licenses. 6 7 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.14, as SECTION 4. AMENDATORY last amended by Section 1, Chapter 123, O.S.L. 2014 (21 O.S. Supp. 8 9 2014, Section 1290.14), is amended to read as follows: Section 1290.14 10 11 SAFETY AND TRAINING COURSE 12 A. Each applicant Oklahoma resident who applies for a license 13 to carry a concealed or unconcealed handgun pursuant to the Oklahoma 14 Self-Defense Act must successfully complete a firearms safety and 15 training course in this state conducted by a registered and approved 16 firearms instructor as provided by the provisions of this section. 17 Nonresident applicants for a license to carry a concealed or 18 unconcealed handgun pursuant to the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act must 19 successfully complete a firearms safety and training course that 20 meets the provisions of this section. The applicant must further 21 demonstrate competence and qualification with an authorized pistol 22 of the type or types that the applicant desires to carry as a 23 concealed or unconcealed handgun pursuant to the provisions of the 24 Oklahoma Self-Defense Act, except certain persons may be exempt from

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such training requirement as provided by the provisions of Section
 1290.15 of this title.

B. The Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training
(CLEET) shall establish criteria for approving firearms instructors
for purposes of training and qualifying individuals for a handgun
license pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act.
Prior to submitting an application for CLEET approval as a firearms
instructor, applicants shall attend a firearms instructor school,
meeting the following minimum requirements:

10 1. Firearms instructor training conducted by one of the 11 following entities:

12 a. Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training,

13 b. National Rifle Association,

14 c. Oklahoma Rifle Association,

15 d. federal law enforcement agencies, or

e. other professionally recognized organizations;
2. The course shall be at least sixteen (16) hours in length;
3. Upon completion of the course, the applicant shall be
qualified to provide instruction on revolvers, semiautomatic
pistols, or both; and

21 4. Receive a course completion certificate.

All firearms instructors shall be required to meet the eligibility requirements for a handgun license as provided in Sections Section 1290.9, 1290.10, and 1290.11 of this title, and the

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1 application shall be processed as provided for applicants in Section 2 1290.12 of this title, including the state and national criminal 3 history records search and fingerprint search background check 4 through the National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS) 5 of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. A firearms instructor shall be required to pay a fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) to the 6 7 Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET) each time the person makes application for CLEET approval as a firearms 8 9 instructor pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Self-Defense 10 Act. The fee shall be retained by CLEET and shall be deposited into 11 the Firearms Instructors Revolving Fund. CLEET shall promulgate the 12 rules, forms and procedures necessary to implement the approval of 13 firearms instructors as authorized by the provisions of this 14 subsection. CLEET shall periodically review each approved 15 instructor during a training and gualification course to assure 16 compliance with the rules and course contents. Any violation of the 17 rules may result in the revocation or suspension of CLEET and 18 Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation approval. Unless the 19 approval has been revoked or suspended, a firearms instructor's 20 CLEET approval shall be for a term of five (5) years. Beginning on 21 July 1, 2003, any firearms instructor who has been issued a four-22 year CLEET approval shall not be eligible for the five-year approval 23 until the expiration of the approval previously issued. CLEET shall 24 be responsible for notifying all approved firearms instructors of

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statutory and policy changes related to the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act. A firearms instructor shall not be required to submit his or her fingerprints for a fingerprint search when <u>applying for or</u> renewing a firearms instructor's CLEET approval.

5 C. 1. All firearms instructors approved by CLEET to train and qualify individuals for a handgun license shall be required to apply 6 7 for registration with the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation after receiving CLEET approval. All firearms instructors teaching 8 9 the approved course for a handgun license must display their 10 registration certificate during each training and qualification 11 course. Each approved firearms instructor shall complete a 12 registration form provided by the Bureau and shall have the option 13 to pay a registration fee of either One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) 14 for a five-year registration certificate or Two Hundred Dollars 15 (\$200.00) for a ten-year registration certificate to the Bureau at 16 the time of each application for registration, except as provided in 17 paragraph 2 of this subsection. Registration certificates issued by 18 the Bureau shall be valid for a period of five (5) years or ten (10) 19 years from the date of issuance. The Bureau shall issue a five-year 20 or ten-year handgun license to an approved firearms instructor at 21 the time of issuance of a registration certificate and no additional 22 fee shall be required or charged. The license issued shall reflect 23 that the licensee is a firearms instructor. The Bureau shall 24 maintain a current listing of all registered firearms instructors in

1 this state. Nothing in this paragraph shall be construed to 2 eliminate the requirement for registration and training with CLEET 3 as provided in subsection B of this section. Failure to register or 4 be trained as required shall result in a revocation or suspension of 5 the instructor certificate by the Bureau.

6 2. On or after July 1, 2003, the registered instructors listed 7 in subparagraphs a and b of this paragraph shall not be required to renew the firearms instructor registration certificate with the 8 9 Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation at the expiration of the 10 registration term, provided the instructor is not subject to any 11 suspension or revocation of the firearms instructor certificate. 12 The firearms instructor registration with the Oklahoma State Bureau 13 of Investigation shall automatically renew together with the handgun 14 license authorized in paragraph 1 of this subsection for an 15 additional five-year term and no additional cost or fee may be 16 charged for the following individuals:

a. an active duty law enforcement officer of this state
or any of its political subdivisions or of the federal
government who has a valid CLEET approval as a
firearms instructor pursuant to the Oklahoma SelfDefense Act, and
b. a retired law enforcement officer authorized to carry

a firearm pursuant to Section 1289.8 of this title who

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1 has a valid CLEET approval as a firearms instructor 2 pursuant to the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act. 3 D. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation shall approve 4 registration for a firearms instructor applicant who is in full 5 compliance with CLEET rules regarding firearms instructors and the provisions of subsection B of this section, if completion of the 6 7 federal fingerprint search is the only reason for delay of registration of that firearms instructor applicant. Upon receipt of 8 9 the federal fingerprint search information, if the Bureau receives 10 information which precludes the person from having a handgun license, the Bureau shall revoke both the registration and the 11 12 handgun license previously issued to the firearms instructor. 13 Ε. The required firearms safety and training course and the 14 actual demonstration of competency and qualification required of the 15 applicant shall be designed and conducted in such a manner that the 16 course can be reasonably completed by the applicant within an eight-17 hour period. CLEET shall establish the course content and 18 promulgate rules, procedures and forms necessary to implement the 19 provisions of this subsection. For the training and qualification 20 course, an An applicant may be charged a fee which shall be 21 determined by the instructor or entity that is conducting the 22 course. The maximum class size shall be determined by the 23 instructor conducting the course; provided, however, practice shooting sessions shall not have more than ten participating 24

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students at one time. CLEET may establish criteria for assistant 1 2 instructors and any other requirements deemed necessary to conduct a safe and effective training and qualification course. The course 3 4 content shall include a safety inspection of the firearm to be used 5 by the applicant in the training course; instruction on pistol handling, safety and storage; dynamics of ammunition and firing; 6 7 methods or positions for firing a pistol; information about the criminal provisions of the Oklahoma law relating to firearms; the 8 9 requirements of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act as it relates to the 10 applicant; self-defense and the use of appropriate force; a practice 11 shooting session; and a familiarization course. The firearms 12 instructor shall refuse to train or qualify any person when the 13 pistol to be used or carried by the person is either deemed unsafe 14 or unfit for firing or is a weapon not authorized by the Oklahoma 15 Self-Defense Act. The course shall provide an opportunity for the 16 applicant to qualify himself or herself on either a derringer, a 17 revolver, a semiautomatic pistol or any combination of a derringer, 18 a revolver and a semiautomatic pistol, provided no pistol shall be 19 capable of firing larger than .45 caliber ammunition. Any applicant 20 who successfully trains and qualifies himself or herself with a 21 semiautomatic pistol may be approved by the firearms instructor on 22 the training certificate for a semiautomatic pistol, a revolver and 23 a derringer upon request of the applicant. Any person who qualifies 24 on a derringer or revolver shall not be eligible for a semiautomatic

1 rating until the person has demonstrated competence and qualifications on a semiautomatic pistol. Upon successful 2 completion of the training and qualification course, a certificate 3 4 shall be issued to each applicant who successfully completes the 5 course. The firearms instructor shall require each applicant to provide a photocopy or digital copy of the state-issued 6 7 identification card or driver license of the applicant to verify the identity of the applicant before providing a course completion 8 9 certificate. The certificate of training shall comply with the form 10 established by CLEET and shall be submitted with an application for 11 a handgun license pursuant to the provisions of paragraph  $\frac{2}{2}$  3 of 12 subsection A of Section 1290.12 of this title. The certificate of 13 completion issued to an applicant shall be valid for a period of 14 three (3) years.

15 There is hereby created a revolving fund for the Council on F. 16 Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET), to be designated the 17 "Firearms Instructors Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a 18 continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall 19 consist of all funds received for approval of firearms instructors 20 for purposes of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act. All funds received 21 shall be deposited to the fund. All monies accruing to the credit 22 of said fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and 23 expended by the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training, 24 for implementation of the training and qualification course

contents, approval of firearms instructors and any other CLEET requirement pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act or as may otherwise be deemed appropriate by CLEET. Expenditures from said fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

G. Firearms instructors shall keep on file for a period of not 8 9 less than three (3) years a roster of each training class, a 10 photocopy or digital copy of the state-issued identification card or 11 driver license of the individual, the safety test score of each 12 individual, the caliber and type of weapon each individual used when 13 qualifying and whether or not each individual successfully completed 14 the training course. Firearms instructors shall be authorized to 15 destroy all training documents and records upon expiration of the 16 three-year time period.

H. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to prohibit an
 Oklahoma resident from obtaining or possessing a nonresident weapons
 or handgun license issued by another state.
