## 1 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES - FLOOR VERSION 2 STATE OF OKLAHOMA 3 1st Session of the 55th Legislature (2015) 4 HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 1009 By: Fisher, Bennett, Brumbaugh, 5 Coody (Jeff), Calvey, Cleveland, Enns, Echols, 6 Roberts (Sean), Murphey, Newell, Kern, Wesselhoft, 7 Montgomery, Wright, Kirby, Park, Leewright, Johnson, Kannady, Osborn, Wallace, 8 Faught, Strohm, McCullough, 9 Caldwell, Moore and Wood 10 11 AS INTRODUCED 12 A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State 1.3 to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 26 of 14 Article II of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma; clarifying manner in which citizens may 15 keep and bear arms; stating legislative authority; prohibiting certain laws; providing ballot title; and 16 directing filing. 17 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE 20 1ST SESSION OF THE 55TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE: 21 The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for SECTION 1. 22 their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, 23 the following proposed amendment to Section 26 of Article II of the 24 Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to read as follows:

1	Section 26. A. The fundamental right of $\frac{1}{2}$ each individual
2	citizen to keep and <u>to</u> bear arms <del>in defense of his home, person, or</del>
3	property, or, including handguns, rifles, shotguns, knives,
4	nonlethal defensive weapons and other arms in common use, as well as
5	ammunition and the components of arms and ammunition, for security,
6	self-defense, lawful hunting and recreation, in aid of the civil
7	power $_{m{ au}}$ when thereunto $1 - 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2$
8	legitimate purpose shall never not be prohibited; but nothing herein
9	contained shall prevent the Legislature from regulating the carrying
10	of weapons infringed. Any regulation of this right shall be subject
11	to strict scrutiny and the State of Oklahoma shall be obligated to
12	uphold these rights and shall, under no circumstances, decline to
13	protect against their infringement.

- B. This section shall not prevent the Legislature from prohibiting the possession of arms by convicted felons, those adjudicated as mentally incompetent or those who have been involuntarily committed in any mental institution.
- C. No law shall impose registration or special taxation upon the keeping of arms, including the acquisition, ownership, possession or the transfer of arms, ammunition or the components of arms or ammunition.
- SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in the following form:

3	THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:
4	This measure amends the State Constitution. This measure
5	addresses the right of a citizen to keep and bear arms. The
6	changes to this section will make clear what types of weapons
7	and for what purpose the weapons may be kept. It would state
8	that regulations by the state on the right to keep and bear arms
9	would be subject to strict scrutiny. The changes would also
10	allow the state to prohibit certain persons from possessing
11	arms. It would not allow the passage of laws that would require
12	the registration of arms or special taxation of arms.

16	SECTION 3. The Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives,
17	immediately after the passage of this act, shall prepare and file
