13	Chapter 14, O.S.L. 2013 (51 O.S. Supp. 2015, Section 24A.28), which relates to the Oklahoma Open Records
14	Act; exempting certain names from disclosure; providing an effective date; and declaring an
15	emergency.
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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 51 O.S. 2011, Section 24A.28, as
20	amended by Section 1, Chapter 14, O.S.L. 2013 (51 O.S. Supp. 2015,
21	Section 24A.28), is amended to read as follows:
22	Section 24A.28 A. The following information may be kept
23	confidential:
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1. Investigative evidence of a plan or scheme to commit an act
 2 of terrorism;

3	2. Assessments of the vulnerability of government facilities or
4	public improvements to an act of terrorism and work papers directly
5	related to preparing the assessment of vulnerability;
6	3. Records including details for deterrence or prevention of or
7	protection from an act or threat of an act of terrorism;
8	4. Records including details for response or remediation after
9	an act of terrorism;
10	5. Information technology of a public body or public official
11	but only if the information specifically identifies:
12	a. design or functional schematics that demonstrate
13	the relationship or connections between devices
14	or systems,
15	b. system configuration information,
16	c. security monitoring and response equipment
17	placement and configuration,
18	d. specific location or placement of systems,
19	components or devices,
20	e. system identification numbers, names, or
21	connecting circuits,
22	f. business continuity and disaster planning, or
23	response plans, or
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g. investigative information directly related to security penetrations or denial of services;

3 6. Investigation evidence of an act of terrorism that has4 already been committed;

7. Records received, maintained or generated by the Oklahoma
Office of Homeland Security which include confidential private
business information or an individual's private records;

8 8. Records received by the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security
9 from the United States Department of Homeland Security or records
10 maintained or generated by the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security
11 involving the United States Department of Homeland Security; and

12 9. Records received, maintained or generated by the Department 13 of Environmental Quality that contain information regarding sources 14 of radiation in quantities determined by the United States Nuclear 15 Regulatory Commission to be significant to public health and safety, 16 by whomever possessed, whether in transit or at fixed sites, when 17 the information could reasonably be expected to have an adverse 18 effect on the health and safety of the public by increasing the 19 likelihood of theft, diversion or sabotage of the radiation sources 20 or facilities. The information may include but is not limited to 21 information:

a. from or relating to radioactive material licensees
 identifying the exact location of the radioactive
 material,

1 b. describing how the radioactive material is secured 2 from unauthorized removal or access when it is in 3 storage, 4 describing the control and maintenance of constant с. surveillance of the radioactive material when it is 5 6 not in storage, 7 d. describing specific policies and procedures for actions to physically protect the radioactive 8 9 material, 10 identifying possession limits or actual inventories of e. 11 radionuclides, 12 f. containing or describing assessments or analyses that 13 could reveal vulnerabilities, 14 identifying specific locations of safety and security q. 15 equipment, 16 describing emergency planning, emergency response and h. 17 fire protection, and 18 containing or describing other information that could i. 19 reasonably be expected to be useful to persons with 20 malevolent intent; and 21 The names of school district personnel who have been 10. 22 designated to carry a firearm pursuant to Section 5-149.2 of Title 23 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 24 The following information shall not be kept confidential: Β.

Records related to federal grants administered by the
 Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security or the Department of
 Environmental Quality;

4 2. Records related to the receipt and expenditure of public5 funds; or

3. Records related to the financial performance or financial
administration of the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security or the
Department of Environmental Quality.

9 C. For the purposes of this section, the term "terrorism" means 10 any act encompassed by the definitions set forth in Section 1268.1 11 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

D. 1. Public educational institutions may keep confidential campus security plans. An institution or agency may in its discretion release information contained in or related to the campus security plan in order to design or implement the plan.

16 2. Nothing in this subsection shall preclude an institution or
17 agency within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education from
18 collecting and releasing information relating to campus crime
19 statistics and campus security policies as is required pursuant to
20 the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus
21 Crime Statistics Act, 20 U.S.C. 1092(f).

3. For purposes of this subsection, "campus security plan"
shall include, but is not limited to, prevention and response

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1	procedures to and notification procedures for perceived or actual
2	security threats and incidents on or impacting the campus.
3	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2016.
4	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
5	of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
6	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
7	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
