10	An Act relating to the Bus Passenger Safety Act; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1902, which relates to
11	definitions regarding public bus transportation; modifying definitions; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section
12	1903, which relates to unlawful acts; removing certain prohibitions; making exception; amending 21
13	O.S. 2011, Section 1904, which relates to unauthorized removal on public bus transportation;
14	clarifying language; and providing an effective date.
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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1902, is
19	amended to read as follows:
20	Section 1902. As used in this act the Bus Passenger Safety Act:
21	1. "Bus" shall be defined as provided in Section 1-105 of Title
22	47 means a vehicle designed to carry passengers that is part of a
23	network of passenger vehicles for use by the public, running on a
24	regular schedule of routes, times and fares;

1 2. "Bus transportation company" or "company" means any person or governmental entity providing for-hire transport to passengers or 2 cargo by bus upon the roads, streets, highways and turnpikes of this 3 state, whether in interstate or intrastate travel; 4 5 3. "Deadly or dangerous weapon" includes all weapons listed in Sections Section 1287 and 1289.3 through 1289.5 of this title, and 6 any other weapon capable of inflicting serious bodily injury, except 7 for a weapon carried for lawful self-defense in compliance under the 8 9 Oklahoma Self Defense Act; 10 4. "Passenger" means any person served by the bus 11 transportation company and in addition to the ordinary meaning of 12 passenger, the term shall include persons accompanying or meeting another who is transported by this company, any person shipping or 13 receiving cargo and any person purchasing a ticket or receiving a 14 15 pass; and 5. "Terminal" means a bus station or depot or any facility 16 operated or leased by or operated on behalf of a bus transportation 17 company. This term shall include a reasonable area immediately 18 adjacent to any designated stop along the route traveled by any 19 coach bus operated by a bus transportation company and parking lots 20 or parking areas adjacent to a terminal. 21 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1903, is SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 22

23 amended to read as follows:

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1 Section 1903. A. No person shall by force or violence, or 2 threat of force or violence, seize or exercise control of any bus. 3 Any person violating this subsection shall be quilty of a felony, and shall, upon conviction, be imprisoned punished by imprisonment 4 5 in the custody of the Department of Corrections for not more than twenty (20) years, or fined by a fine of not more than Twenty 6 7 Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment. 8

9 в. In addition, no person shall intimidate, threaten, assault 10 or batter any driver, attendant, guard or passenger of any bus with intent to violate subsection A of this section. Any person 11 12 violating this subsection shall be guilty of a felony $_{T}$ and shall, upon conviction, be imprisoned punished by imprisonment in the 13 custody of the Department for not more than ten (10) years, or fined 14 15 by a fine of not more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or by 16 both such fine and imprisonment.

17 C. In addition, any person violating subsection A or B of this 18 section using a dangerous or deadly weapon shall be guilty of a 19 felony, and shall, upon conviction, be <u>imprisoned punished by</u> 20 <u>imprisonment in the custody of the Department</u> for not more than 21 twenty (20) years, or <u>fined by a fine of</u> not more than Twenty 22 Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00), or <u>by</u> both <u>such fine and</u> 23 imprisonment.

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1	D. No person, other than an authorized law enforcement officer,
2	shall board a bus with a dangerous or deadly weapon concealed upon
3	or about his person. Upon the discovery of any such item or
4	material, the company may obtain possession and retain custody of
5	such item or material until it is transferred to the custody of law
6	enforcement officers. Any person convicted of violating this
7	subsection shall be guilty of a felony, and shall, upon conviction,
8	be imprisoned for not more than ten (10) years, or fined not more
9	than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), or both.
10	E. It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge any firearm
11	or hurl or place in the path any missile at, into or within any bus,
12	terminal or other transportation facility, unless such action is
13	determined to have been in defensive force resulting from reasonable
14	fear of imminent peril of death or great bodily harm to himself or
15	herself or another. Such person shall, upon conviction, be guilty
16	of a felony punishable by a fine of not more than Five Thousand
17	Dollars (\$5,000.00) or by imprisonment for not more than five (5)
18	years, or both.
19	SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1904, is
20	amended to read as follows:
21	Section 1904. It shall be unlawful to remove any baggage, cargo
22	or other item transported upon a bus or stored in a terminal without
23	consent of the owner of such property or the company, or its duly
24	authorized representative. Any person violating this section shall

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1	be guilty of a felony and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a
2	fine of not more than Ten Thousand Dollars ($\$10,000.00$), or
3	imprisoned by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of
4	Corrections for not more than five (5) years, or by both such fine
5	and imprisonment.
6	The actual value of an item removed in violation of this section
7	shall not be material to the crime herein defined.
8	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
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
