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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1289.8, as
14	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 256, O.S.L. 2016 (21 O.S. Supp.
15	2017, Section 1289.8), is amended to read as follows:
16	Section 1289.8
17	CARRYING WEAPON
18	A. Any fire marshal inspector who is retired, state, county or
19	municipal peace officer of this state who is retired, or any state,
20	county or municipal peace officer classified as a reserve who is
21	retired, or any federal law enforcement officer who is retired may
22	retain their status as a peace officer, retired, in the State of
23	Oklahoma, and as such may carry a firearm pursuant to the provisions
24	of subsection B of this section. A retired state, county or

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municipal peace officer may in times of great emergency or danger serve to enforce the law, keep the peace or to protect the public in keeping with their availability and ability at the request of the Governor, the sheriff or the mayor of their retirement jurisdiction. If a retired fire marshal is activated for duty, the peace officer powers of the retired fire marshal are limited to the duties granted prior to retirement.

The Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training 8 в. 9 (CLEET) shall issue an identification card to eligible retired 10 federal, state, county, and municipal peace officers which 11 authorizes the retired peace officer to carry a firearm anywhere in 12 throughout the State of Oklahoma. The identification card shall bear the full name of the retired officer, the signature of the 13 retired officer, the date of issuance, and such other information as 14 15 may be deemed appropriate by CLEET. The card shall expire every ten 16 (10) years and may be denied, suspended or revoked as provided by the rules promulgated by CLEET or upon the discovery of any 17 preclusion prescribed in Section 1290.10 or 1290.11 of this title. 18 In order to renew the permit, the Council on Law Enforcement 19 Education and Training shall request, pursuant to Section 150.9 of 20 Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Oklahoma State Bureau of 21 Investigation to conduct a state and national criminal history 22 records search on each retired peace officer authorized to carry a 23 firearm pursuant to the provisions of this section; and unless a 24

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1 preclusion prescribed in Section 1290.10 or 1290.11 of this title is found to exist, no action shall be necessary. A retired peace 2 3 officer requesting a renewal of his or her permit shall submit to the Council a nonrefundable fee for a national criminal history 4 5 record with fingerprint analysis, as provided in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. When a preclusion is discovered, 6 7 the Council shall notify the retired peace officer and shall hold a hearing before taking any action to suspend or revoke the authority 8 9 to carry a firearm.

10 C. The retired peace officer shall be required to submit the 11 following information to the Council on Law Enforcement Education 12 and Training (CLEET) and any other information requested by CLEET: 13 1. A statement from the appropriate law enforcement agency

14 verifying the status of the person as a retired peace officer of 15 that jurisdiction; and

16 2. A notarized statement, signed by the retired peace officer,17 stating that the officer:

- 18 a. has not been convicted of and is currently not subject
 19 to any pending criminal prosecution for any preclusion
 20 prescribed in Section 1290.10 or 1290.11 of this
 21 title,
- b. has not been forced into retirement due to any mentaldisorder, and
- 24

c. has not suffered any injury or any physical or mental
 impairment which would render the person unsafe to
 carry a firearm.

D. A retired peace officer, who has made application for the
CLEET identification card authorized in subsection B of this
section, shall be authorized to carry a firearm as an off-duty peace
officer, pursuant to Section 1289.23 of this title, until the
authority to carry a firearm as a retired officer is finally
approved or denied by CLEET.

E. The Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training shall
promulgate rules and procedures necessary to implement the
provisions of this section.

F. Any peace officer, retired, who carries any firearm in violation of the provisions of this section shall be deemed to be in violation of Section 1272 of this title and may be prosecuted as provided by law for a violation of that section.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
