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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 17-101 of Title 12A, unless
17	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
18	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
19	Firearms Industry Nondiscrimination Act".
20	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 17-102 of Title 12A, unless
22	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
23	As used in the Oklahoma Firearms Industry Nondiscrimination Act:
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1. "Entity" means one or more individuals, partnerships, associations, limited liability companies, corporations, unincorporated organizations, mutual companies, joint stock companies, trusts, agents, legal representatives, trustees, trustees in bankruptcy, receivers, labor organizations, public bodies, public corporations, and the State of Oklahoma, and all political subdivisions and agencies thereof; and

- 2. "Trade association" means any person, corporation, unincorporated association, federation, business league or professional or business organization not organized or operated for profit and no part of the net earnings of which inures to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual; that is an organization described in Section 501(c)(6) of Title 26 of the United States Code and exempt from tax under Section 501(a) of such title; and two or more members of which are manufacturers or sellers of a qualified product as defined by Section 7903(4) of Title 15 of the United States Code.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 17-103 of Title 12A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

It shall be an unlawful discriminatory practice for any entity to refuse to provide any goods or services of any kind, refrain from continuing an existing business relationship, terminate an existing business relationship with, or otherwise discriminate against a

trade association or person, because the trade association supports,
or the person is engaged in, the lawful commerce of firearms or
ammunition products.

SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 17-104 of Title 12A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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A victim of unlawful discriminatory practices described in Section 3 of this act may bring a civil cause of action for unlawful discriminatory practices against any person who committed the offense for actual and compensatory damages, treble damages, exemplary damages, injunctive relief, and any other appropriate civil relief.

SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 17-105 of Title 12A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A plaintiff who successfully prevails in a civil action filed pursuant to the Oklahoma Firearms Industry Nondiscrimination Act shall be entitled to recover reasonable attorney fees and all court costs.

SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 17-106 of Title 12A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A private civil cause of action filed pursuant to the Oklahoma Firearms Industry Nondiscrimination Act shall be filed no later than

- two (2) years after the date when the aggrieved person becomes aware of the unlawful discriminatory practice set forth in Section 3 of this act.
  - SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 17-107 of Title 12A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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- A. In addition to the other remedies provided in the Oklahoma Firearms Industry Nondiscrimination Act, whenever the Office of the Attorney General has reason to believe that any person is engaging, has engaged, or is about to engage in any act or practice declared unlawful by this act, the Attorney General may bring an action in the name of the state against that person to:
- 1. Obtain a declaratory judgment that the act or practice violates the provisions of this act;
- 2. Enjoin any act or practice that violates the provisions of this act by issuance of a temporary restraining order or preliminary or permanent injunction, without bond, upon the giving of appropriate notice; and
- 3. Recover civil penalties of up to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) per violation of this act, or any injunction, judgment or consent order issued or entered into under the provisions of this act and reasonable expenses, investigative costs, and attorney fees. In addition, the Attorney General shall recommend a discontinuation

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    of state business relations with entities found to be in violation
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    of this act.
        B. Any action, application or motion brought by the Attorney

    General against a person under this act shall be filed in Oklahoma
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    County District Court.
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        SECTION 8. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
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
