10	arms; directing courts and law enforcement agencies to protect certain rights of law-abiding citizens;
11	prohibiting law enforcement officers from obeying or enforcing certain orders; prohibiting the termination
12	or retaliation against law enforcement officers for refusing to obey or enforce certain orders;
13	prohibiting the state, counties and municipalities from making cuts to funds or budgets of county
14	sheriff offices or municipal police departments under certain circumstances; defining term; providing for
15	codification; and declaring an emergency.
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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2201 of Title 25, unless there
21	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
22	Any federal, state, county or municipal act, law, executive
23	order, administrative order, court order, rule or regulation
24	ordering the confiscation of firearms, firearm accessories or

ammunition from law-abiding citizens of this state shall be considered an infringement on the rights of citizens to keep and bear arms as guaranteed by the Second Amendment of the Constitution of the United States and Article II, Section 26 of the Constitution of Oklahoma.

6 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 7 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2202 of Title 25, unless there 8 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

9 It shall be the duty of the courts and law enforcement agencies 10 of this state to protect the rights of law-abiding citizens to keep 11 and bear arms within the borders of this state and to protect these 12 rights from the infringement provided under the provisions of 13 Section 1 of this act.

14 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2203 of Title 25, unless there 16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 A. No law enforcement officer shall obey or enforce any direct 18 or indirect order which violates the Second Amendment of the 19 Constitution of the United States, Article II, Section 26 of the 20 Constitution of Oklahoma or the law enforcement oath of the law 21 enforcement officer.

B. Any agency or department of the State of Oklahoma, county or municipality shall be prohibited from terminating or retaliating against any law enforcement officer who refuses to obey or enforce

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any order which violates the Second Amendment of the Constitution of
 the United States, Article II, Section 26 of the Constitution of
 Oklahoma or the law enforcement oath of the law enforcement officer.

C. The State of Oklahoma and any county or municipal government
shall not cut any funding or budget from a county sheriff's office
or municipal police department for:

Refusing to obey or enforce any order which violates the
Second Amendment of the Constitution of the United States, Article
II, Section 26 of the Constitution of Oklahoma or the law
enforcement oath of a law enforcement officer; or

Making any county or municipality a Second Amendment
 sanctuary county or municipality.

SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2204 of Title 25, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

For the purposes of Sections 1 and 2 of this act, the term "lawabiding citizen" shall mean a person who is not otherwise precluded under federal or state law from possessing a firearm and shall not be construed to include anyone who is not legally present in the United States or the State of Oklahoma.

SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
